Los Angeles Cal. — The Los Angeles Angels completed a sweep of their three-game series with Washington Sunday by beating the Senators 8-3.

Steve Biko hit the 14th homer and drove in three runs for the Angels as they picked up their 17th victory in the last 24 games.

It moved them to within a half game of the seventh-place Senators who have lost 23 of their last 29 games.
