**THE TWINS:** In 2020, the Twins will open with a three-game series at Guaranteed Rate Field in Chicago from tonight through Sunday...today marks the fourth time in Twins history (since 1961) that they have opened against the White Sox and third time *in Chicago* (1970 & 2014)... following this series, the Twins will enjoy an off-day in Minneapolis on Monday, followed by a six-game homestand vs. the Cardinals (July 28-29) and Indians (July 30-August 2).  
 ☞ The original 2020 schedule would have the Twins in the second of four games at Chicago-AL today.

**WELCOME BACK, WE MISSED YOU:** The Twins originally played 19 spring training games from February 21-March 11, going 7-8-4, prior to leaving camp due to the COVID-19 pandemic... they flew home on Monday, March 15 for Minnesota...the Twins hosted Summer Camp at Target Field from July 3-21 and played Intrasquad scrimmages near the back half of camp with Team Polanco (white tops) vs. Team Kepler (blue tops)...they completed Summer Camp on Wednesday night at Wrigley Field losing 4-3.  
 ☞ **WHAT WE MISSED...** Twins were originally slated to open on the road in Oakland on March 26 then host the A's for their Home Opener April 2...Twins were scheduled to play mostly the NL West in IL Play but now face the NL Central for this season and again in 2021.  
 ☞ Prior to the NYY-WAS game last night, Major League Baseball had not played a game since Game 7 of the 2019 World Series, a span of 266 days, the longest drought in MLB history.

**MINNESOTA WINS:** The Twins completed the 2019 regular season with a record of 101-61, winning the American League Central on September 25 after defeating Detroit by a score of 5-1, followed by a White Sox 8-3 victory over the Indians later that night...the 2019 Twins spent 171 days in first place, tied with the 1970 AL West champions for most in club history (since 1961)... the 101 wins were the second most ever for a Twins club, trailing the 1965 team (102-60).  
**GRAND OPENING:** The Twins opened last season vs. Cleveland at Target Field, winning by a score of 2-0...Minnesota is 26-33 all-time in season openers and 15-21 in road openers...this marks the eighth time the Twins have opened on the road in the last 11 seasons, dating back to 2010...they are seeking their first road opener win since 2003, in a 3-1 victory at Detroit (Radke over Maroth)...they have lost a road opener nine-straight times since.

**SPRINT, NOT MARATHON:** Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Major League Baseball season will be played in 60 games in 2020...each single game will account for 2.7 games of what would be a normal 162-game season...through 60 games in 2019, the Twins were 40-20, 9.5 games ahead of Cleveland in the AL Central, and were tied with Houston for the second-best winning percentage in baseball at .667, trailing only the Dodgers (.683).  
**EXTRA SOCK:** Twins hit 39 homers against the White Sox last season...below are the Twins most single-season homers vs. one team all-time:

NOTE: 27 homers last season at Guaranteed Rate Field were the most in the park's history for an opponent.

**TWINS AND WHITE SOX:** Twins went 13-6 against the White Sox last season, out-scoring Chicago 125-65...125 runs were their most vs. any opponent in 2019 and their +60 run differential was also their best...they went 6-3 at Target Field and 7-3 at Guaranteed Rate Field...the Twins are 17-6 in the last 23 overall vs. the Sox.  
 ☞ Nelson Cruz hit .433 (26-for-60) with five doubles, eight home runs, 24 RBI and a 1.438 OPS in 16 games against the Sox last season...he had eight multi-hit games and seven multi-RBI games.  
 ☞ Max Kepler hit .341 (15-for-44) with four doubles, eight home runs, 20 RBI and a 1.352 OPS in 11 games vs. the Sox last season.

**MEN OF LA BOMBA:** The Twins finished the 2019 season with 307 home runs setting a Major League Baseball record, just ahead of New York-AL (306)...they passed the previous club mark of 225 (done in 1963) on August 9 vs. Cleveland.  
 ☞ Nelson Cruz (41), Max Kepler (36), Miguel Sanó (34), Eddie Rosario (32) and Mitch Garver (31) became the first set of five teammates in baseball history to reach the 30-home run plateau.  
 ☞ Cruz and Kepler were one of five sets of teammates with 36-plus homers, joining Atlanta's Acuña, Jr. (41)/Freeman (38)/Donaldson (37), Dodgers' Bellinger (47)/Pederson (36), Houston's Bregman (41)/Springer (39) and Oakland's Chapman (36)/Olson (36).

**THE HARDWARE:** Twins list of awards won in 2019 below:  
 ☞ Rocco Baldelli was named AL Manager of the Year, taking a 78-win team from 2018 and turned them into a 101-win team, becoming the fifth first-year manager to inherit a sub-.500 team and finish .600-or-better in the following season...joined Paul Molitor (2017) and Ron Gardenhire (2010) as the first group to win the award for one team in a single decade...one of eight managers to ever win in his rookie season.  
 ☞ DH Nelson Cruz and C Mitch Garver were given AL Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Awards...Cruz also was given the Edgar Martinez Award for most outstanding Designated Hitter and was the recipient of the Muhammad Ali Sports Humanitarian Award at the ESPYs last month.

**A LOOK AT THE ROSTER:** The Twins open the 2020 season with 16 players on their 30-man roster who were not on the 2019 Opening Day roster: pitchers (11) - Homer Bailey, Tyler Clippard, Randy Dobnak, Rich Hill, Zack Littell, Kenta Maeda, Sergio Romo, Devin Smeltzer, Cody Stashak, Lewis Thorpe and Matt Wisler; catcher (1) - Alex Avila; infielders (2) - Luis Arraez and Josh Donaldson; and outfielders (2) - LaMonte Wade, Jr. and Aaron Whitefield...of the 30 players on the Twins active roster, 15 began their professional careers in the Twins organization...Whitefield is the only Twin looking to make his major league debut...the oldest on the club is Hill (40 years, 4 months, 13 days) and the youngest is Arraez (23 years, 3 months, 15 days).  
 ☞ Cruz and Rich Hill give the Twins their first pair of 40 year-olds on an Opening Day roster...it is the first time since 2004 that Twins have two 40-year-olds on their roster at the same time (Terry Mulholland and Pat Borders, both age 41 - both not on OD roster)...it is just the fourth time in Twins/Senators history that they have two 40-year-olds play for them in a season, joining 2004, 1913 (Clark Griffith and Jack Ryan) and 1912 (Griffith and Ryan).

**AN EVENTFUL 2019:** All-Star José Berríos takes the ball tonight to begin the long-awaited 2020 MLB season.

☞ This marks Berríos' second-consecutive Opening Day start...squared off against then-Cleveland starter Corey Kluber at Target Field to begin the 2019 season, blanking the Indians through 7.2 innings...ceded to left-hander Taylor Rogers, who recorded a save in the Twins' first of 101 victories.

☞ In 2019, Berríos pitched in his second-consecutive All-Star Game, retiring his brother-in-law, Chicago-NL's Javier Báez, to end a scoreless third inning.

☞ Berríos made his final 2019 start in the Postseason, taking to the hill for Game 1 of the ALDS against New York-AL...allowed three runs (1 ER) and four hits in 4.0 innings, striking out six and walking three.

**HOT AGAINST THE SOX:** In his career, Berríos has made 14 starts against Chicago-AL—the most he's made against any single team...owning a career 11-2 record against the South Siders, Berríos has pitched at least 6.0 innings in 11 of those starts, and recorded a quality start in 10 of them... furthermore, he's never allowed more than four earned runs in a start against the White Sox...the only such occasion he allowed four earned runs came on May 4, 2018 in a 6-4 Twins win.

**TURNING THE CORNER:** Berríos finished his 2019 campaign with a 3.68 ERA, and saw an uptick in performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019.

☞ Berríos finished the regular season fourth in the American League (10th in MLB) with 21 quality starts, while 23 out of his 32 went at least 6.0 innings (including 10 with 7.0+ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 103 career regular season starts, Berríos has thrown 51 quality starts (49.5 percent).

**CAREER BESTS:** In what was a breakout year for the Puerto-Rican right-hander, Berríos set several career bests, including: Wins (T-2017), quality starts (21), innings pitched (200.1), ERA (3.68), groundball percentage (43.2%), walk percentage (6.1%), walks-per-9.0 (2.29), strikeouts/walks (3.82), first pitch strike percentage (65.2%) and run support average (6.06 runs per start).
