THE TWINS: The Twins completed their opening series in Chicago with bookend wins over the White Sox last weekend...tonight the Twins will begin an eight-game homestand with two vs. the Cardinals, four vs. Cleveland from Thursday-Sunday and two vs. Pittsburgh next Monday-Tuesday.

Original 2020 schedule would have the Twins in the first of two vs. the Dodgers tonight.

TWINS CRUZ OUT OF CHICAGO WITH A SERIES WIN: Twins beat the White Sox on Sunday afternoon by a score of 14-2, scoring nine runs in the first two innings...Kenta Maeda made his Twins debut, earning the win while allowing two runs on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 13 hits, four from Nelson Cruz, who doubled twice and homered twice, collected 12 total bases and seven RBI...Jake Cave added a grand slam, the second of his career.

NELLY WINS THE WEEK: Nelson Cruz has been chosen the American League Player of the Week presented by Chevrolet...Cruz earned his seventh career AL Player of the Week Award, most recently winning for the period ending July 28th of last year, and is the 23rd different American Leaguer to win at least seven times since the award was introduced in the AL in 1974...below are some of the numbers on Cruz:

- Batted .538 (7-for-23) with seven runs scored, two doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, a walk and a 1.385 slugging percentage over three games played.
In a historic contest on Sunday, logged four runs scored, two doubles, two home runs and seven RBI to lead Minnesota to a rubber match win against the White Sox.
At 40 years, 25 days old, became the fourth-oldest player in major league history to amass seven RBI in a single game, joining Hall of Famers Stan Musial and Reggie Jackson, as well as Jason Giambi...in addition, became the second-oldest player with four extra-base hits in a game since 1901, joining Hall of Famer Rickey Henderson.
Became the first player in franchise history to record at least four runs, four extra-base hits and seven RBI in a single game...was just the 30th such game in Baseball history, and the first since the Cardinals Matt Carpenter on July 20, 2018.

WELCOME HOME: The Twins are opening their 11th season at Target Field tonight...they are 33-26 all-time in home openers, going 12-8 at Metropolitan Stadium from 1961-81, going 16-12 at the Metrodome from 1982-2009, and 5-5 at Target Field since 2010...Twins have won three straight Target Field Openers, beating Kansas City 7-1 in 2017, beating Seattle 4-2 in 2018 and beating Cleveland 2-0 in 2019...a win tonight would give the Twins their second longest Home Opener win-streak, their best being seven, done from 1964-70...this is the first time the Twins have opened against a non-American League team at home.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins went 8-12 in Interleague Play last season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 2-2 vs. Milwaukee, 2-1 at Miami, 1-2 vs. Atlanta and 1-2 vs. Washington...they have had just one winning season against the NL since 2010, that coming in 2017 (13-7).

- From 1997 (IL Play's inception) to 2009, the Twins went 132-96 in IL Play, second to only the Yankees (133-95) in wins during that span...since then they have gone 87-107, 25th most IL wins in baseball in that span.
Mitch Garver hit .333 (17-for-51) with a 1.260 OPS in 14 IL games last season...Garver's nine IL home runs last season tied him with Nolan Arenado for most in baseball...the nine home runs tied him with Trevor Plouffe (2012) for most single-season IL home runs in club history.
Jorge Polanco is a career .303 hitter (53-for-175) with a .837 OPS in 50 career IL games.
Miguel Sanó has reached base safely in each of his last 25 starts in IL Play, hitting .295 (28-for-95) with eight doubles, six home runs, 17 RBI, 16 walks, a .402 on-base percentage and a .970 OPS in that span...his streak is longest active streak in baseball right now and fifth longest in Twins IL history...if he reached tonight, he'll tie Cristian Guzman, June 7-2000-June 7, 2002.
The Twins have homered in a major league record 23 straight IL games, dating back to July 4, 2018, hitting 42 in that span.

BRING ON THE BIRDS: Twins and Cardinals are playing each other for the first of four this season...these two will face off again in St. Louis September 8-9...all-time Interleague series is tied 13-13 since 1997...Twins hold a 4-3 advantage in Postseason play (1987 World Series)...Cardinals won both spring training matchups in Florida in March...the last time the two clubs played in the regular season was 2018, with the Twins winning the season series 4-1 and outscoring the Cardinals 22-9.

RIP, PABLO TORRES: Long-time Twins scout Pablo Torres passed away on Monday morning after a heart attack...the Venezuelan Scout had been an employee of the Twins for 25 years.

WELCOME BACK, BUCK: Byron Buxton is returning to the field for the first time since September 7, 2019 vs. Cleveland...tonight marks his first time in the lineup since August 1, 2019 at Miami...Buxton missed the games over the weekend and the latter part of Summer Camp after suffering a left mid-foot sprain while chasing a fly ball on July 13 during an intrasquad scrimmage...Buxton was limited to 87 games last season suffering a right wrist contusion, concussion-like symptoms and left shoulder subluxation (labrum).

A LOOK AT THE ROSTER: The Twins opened the 2020 season with 16 players on their 30-man roster who were not on the 2019 Opening Day roster: pitchers (11) - Homer Bailey, Tyler Clippard, Randy Dobnak, Rich Hill, Zack Littell, Kenta Maeda, Sergio Romo, Devin Smeltzer, Cody Stashak, Lewis Thorpe and Matt Wisler; catcher (1) - Alex Avila; infielders (2) - Luis Arraez and Josh Donaldson; and outfielders (2) - LaMonte Wade, Jr. and Aaron Whitefield...five players have yet to appear: outfielder Byron Buxton, right-handed pitchers Homer Bailey and Sergio Romo, and left-handed pitchers Rich Hill and Taylor Rogers.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2018, Twins Bench Coach Derek Shelton filled in for Paul Molitor as Twins Manager as Mollie traveled to Cooperstown for the 2018 Hall of Fame induction (former Twins Jack Morris and Jim Thome)...the Twins lost both games under Shelton by scores of 10-4 and 3-0 at Fenway Park.

FELIZ CUMPLEAÑOS, JORGE: Right-handed pitcher Jorge Alcala is celebrating his 25th birthday today...he shares a birthday with Dodgers starter Walker Buehler (26), Tennessee Titans quarterback Ryan Tannehill (32), former NBA star Manu Ginobili (43) and one of Dan Gladden's top 10 favorite hip hop artist Soulja Boy (30).

MR. BOUNCEBACK: Bailey will debut for the Twins tonight and make his first career start and appearance at Target Field after signing a one-year contract on December 31, 2019, the same day as fellow veteran pitcher and tomorrow's slated starter Rich Hill...

BIRD WATCHER: Tonight marks Homer's 29th career start and appearance against the Cardinals, tying his total vs. Milwaukee for his most starts against a single opponent in his career...

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: Last season, Homer held left-handed batters to a career-low .216 (71-for-328) batting average, the fourth-best mark in the AL and ninth best in the majors...

- Bailey also held lefties to a .193 BABIP from Aug. 1-end of season, the best mark in the AL in that span (min. 100 AB vs. LHB) and fifth lowest in the majors.
• Bailey's weapon of choice against left-handed batters was his split finger, which he threw 196 times to lefties compared to just 96 times to righties...

TAKE IT BACK NOW: Bailey averaged just 1.16 home runs per 9.0 IP in 2019, the year of the bomba, good for the seventh-lowest mark in the AL (29th lowest in MLB)...

HOMER AT HOME: Bailey went a combined 7-3 with a 3.51 ERA (92.1 IP, 36) in 16 home starts last year, setting a new career high for home victories (previously 6, in 2011 and 2014)...

THE REPERTOIRE: Bailey's pitch mix has changed over the years, following the contours of his career...in 2009, his first full big league season, Bailey threw a four seamer, sinker, changeup, slider and curve...

2019 NOTES:

- Homer began last season in the AL Central with Kansas City after signing a minor league contract and having his contract selected on April 3...he was later traded to Oakland on July 14 in exchange for minor league infielder Kevin Merrell.
• At the time of his trade to Oakland, was leading the Royals in wins (7)...went on to lead the A's in wins following the trade (6) and matched the most by an Athletic acquired in an in-season trade over the last 20 years (Jon Lester in 2014).
• Bailey matched his career high in wins (13, 2012) while his 31 starts, 163.1 innings pitched and 149 strikeouts were his third-highest single-season totals and his most since 2013, when he set career highs with 209.0 innings pitched and 199 strikeouts.

POSTSEASON HISTORY: Homer owns a 1.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 1 ER) and 12 strikeouts in two career playoff appearances (1 start)...last took the mound in Postseason play in the 2012 NLDS, for Cincinnati; set a Reds record with 10 strikeouts in Game 3 vs. SF.

- Pen is 1-0, with a 6.23 ERA (13.0 IP, 9 ER) with eight walks and 19 strikeouts after the first three games of this shortened season...all relievers have made appearances this season except for Sergio Romo & Taylor Rogers.
The Twins pen went 4-4, 7.04 ERA (69.0 IP, 54 ER) with three saves, 35 walks, 15 holds, and 72 strikeouts in Interleague games last season...also went 2-2, 7.50 ERA (12.0 IP, 10 ER) with two saves, four walks, five holds, and 15 strikeouts vs. NL Central teams in 2019 (all four games vs. MIL).
Last time the Twins faced the St. Louis Cardinals was in 2018, the Twins pen went 0-0, with a 2.45 ERA (14.2 IP, 4 ER) with one save, two walks, and 14 strikeouts in four games (Twins went 3-1 vs. St. Louis).
Pen went 34-22, 4.17 ERA (573.2 IP, 266 ER), with 50 saves, 185 walks and 619 strikeouts...the 50 saves were tied for second most in baseball...the 619 strikeouts were the most in club history...their 3.24 strikeouts-per-walk ratio also set a club record...69.4 save percentage was seventh best in MLB and sixth in AL in 2019.
