$\Phi$ Original 2020 schedule would have the Twins in the first of two vs. the Dodgers tonight.
TWINS CRUZ OUT OF CHICAGO WITH A SERIES WIN: Twins beat the White Sox on Sunday afternoon by a score of $14-2$, scoring nine runs in the first two innings...Kenta Maeda made his Twins debut, earning the win while allowing two runs on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the offense recorrded 13 hits, four from Nelson Cruz, who doubled twice and homered twice, col-
lected 12 total bases and seven RBI.... Jake Cave added a grand slam, the second of his career. NELLY WINS THE WEEK: Nelson Cruz has been chosen the American League Player of the
Week presented by Chevrolt...Cruz earned his seventh career ALPlayer of the Week Aavard,
most recently winning for the period ending July 28th of tast year, and is the 23rd different most recently winning for the period ending July. 28 th of last year, and is the 23 rd different
American Leaguer to win at least seven times since the award was introduced in the AL in 1974...below are some of the numbers on Cruz:
$\Phi$ Batted .538 ( 7 -for-23) with seven runs scored, two doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, a walk and a 1.385 slugging percentage over three games played.
$\Phi$ In a historic contest on Sunday, logged four runs scored, two doubles, two home runs and seven RBI to lead Minnesota to a rubber match win against the White Sox.
$\Phi$ At 40 years, 25 days old, became the fourth-oldest player in major league history to amass seven RBI in a single game, joining Hall of Famers Stan Musial and Reggie Jackson, as well as Jason Giambi...in addition, became the second-oldest player with four extra-base hits in a game since 1901, joining Hall of Famer Rickey Henderson. F Became the first player in franchise history, to record at least four runs, four extra-base
hits and seven RBI in a single game...was just the 30 th such game in Baseball history, hits and seven RBI in a single game....was just the 30th such game in Baseball history,
and the first since the Cardinals Matt Carpenter on July 20, 2018 .

WELCOME HOME: The Twins are opening their 11 th season at Target Field tonight...they are 33-26 all-time in home openers, going 12-8 at Metropolitan Stadium from 1961-81, going 16-12 at the Metrodome from 1982-2009, and 5-5 at Target Field since 2010...Twins have won three straight arget rield 0peners, beating Kansas city $1-1$ in 201, beating seattle $4-2$ longest Home Opener win-streak, their best being seven, done from 1964-70...this is the first ongest home opener win-streak, their best being seven, done trom 1964 -
time
INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins went 8 -12 in Interleague Play last season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 2-2 vs. Milwaukee, 2-1 at Miami, 1-2 vs. Atlanta and 1-2 vs. Washington..they have had just one winning season against the NL since 2010, that coming in 2017 (13-7)
क From 1997 (IL Play's inception) to 2009, the Twins went 132-96 in IL Play, second to only the Yankees (133-95) in wins during that span...since then they have gone 87-107, 25th most IL wins in baseball in that span.
क Mitch Garver hit . 333 (17-for- 51 ) with a 1.260 OPS in 14 IL games last season...Garver's nine IL home runs last season tied him with Nolan Arenado for most in baseball...the nine home runs tied him with Trevor Plouffe (2012) for most single-season IL home runs in club history:
$\Phi$ Jorge Polanco is a career. 303 hitter ( 53 -for-175) with a 837 OPS in 50 career IL games. $\Phi$ Miguel Sanó has reached base safely in each of his last 25 starts in IL Play, hitting . 295 (28-for-95) with eight doubles, six home runs, $17 \mathrm{RBI}, 16$ walks, a . 402 on-base percentage and a. 970 OPS in that span...his streak is longest active streak in baseball right now and fifth longest in Twins IL history.
क The Twins have homered in a major league record 23 straight IL games, dating back to July 4, 2018, hitting 42 in that span.
BRING ON THE BIRDS: Twins and Cardinals are playing each other for the first of four this season...these two will face off again in St. Louis September 8-9...all-time Interleague series is tied 13-13 since 1997...Twins hold a 4-3 advantage in Postseason play (1987 World Series)....Cardinals won both spring training matchups in Florida in March...the last time
2018, with the Twins winning the season series 4-1 and outscoring the Cardinals 22-9.
RIP, PABLO TORRES: Long-time Twins scout Pablo Torres passed away on Monday morning after a heart attack...the Venezuelan Scout had been an employee of the Twins for 25 years.
WELCOME BACK, BUCK: Byron Buxton is returning to the field for the first time since September 7, 2019 vs. Cleveland...tonight marks his first time in the lineup since Ausust 1, 2019 at Miami...Buxton missed the games over the weekend and the latter part of Summer

MR. BOUNCEBACK: Bailey will debut for the Twins tonight and make his first career start and appearance at Target Field after signing a one-year contract on December 31, 2019, the same day as fellow veteran pitcher and tomorrow's slated starter Rich Hill. the 34 -year-old hurler enjoyed a comeback season in 2019 matching his career high with 13 wins (also, 2012) and reaching the 30-start threshold for just the third time in his career, after 2012 (33) and 2013 (32) Homer's 149 strikeouts were his third-most in a single season, behind 2013 (199) and 2012 (168) split the year between Kansas City and Oakland, his first career stint in the AL.

BIRD WATCHER: Tonight marks Homer's 29th career start and appearance against the Cardinals, tying his total vs. Milwaukee for his most starts against a single opponent in his career...he's 6-16 with a 5.80 ERA (147.1 IP, 95 ER) lifetime vs. St. Louis, his most losses against any opponent and highest ERA vs. any team he's faced more than 10 times...lasted just 1.2 innings in his last start at St. Louis on May 22, 2019 (second game of doubleheader), yielding five runs on four hits (2 HR), with two walks and two strikeouts.
to THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: Last season, Homer held left-handed batters to a career-low . 216 (71-for-328) batting average, the fourth-best mark in the AL and ninth best in the majors (min. 300 opponent AB vs. LHB)...prior to 2019, his lowest opponent batting average vs. lefties was .238 in $2010 .$. .from August 1 to the end of the season, held lefties to a 170 (19-for-112) batting average, third in the AL in that span (min. 100 AB vs. LHB) to Houston's Gerrit Cole (.138) and
$\Phi$ Bailey also held lefties to a . 193 BABIP from Aug. 1-end of season, the best mark in the AL in that span (min. 100 AB vs. LHB) and fifth lowest in the majors
क Bailey's weapon of choice against left-handed batters was his split finger, which he threw 196 times to lefties compared to just 96 times to righties...in 2018, lefties hit . 314 (16-for-51) on Bailey's split finger; last year, that number was just . 186 (22-for-118).

TAKE IT BACK NOW: Bailey averaged just 1.16 home runs per 9.0 IP in 2019, the year of the bomba, good for the seventh-lowest mark in the AL (29th lowest in MLB)...also allowed two grand slams, tied for most in the AL...his . 403 opponent slugging percentage ranked 10th in the AL among qualified pitchers, while his .719 opponent OPS was 12th lowest and his .316 opponent on-base percentage ranked 13th

HOMER AT HOME: Bailey went a combined $7-3$ with a 3.51 ERA (92.1 IP, 36) in 16 home starts last year, setting a new carer high for home victories (previously 6, in 2011 and 2014)...though home-field advantage has new meaning in the age of COVID-19, Bailey's career numbers both at home and on the road are nearly identical, going 37-40 with a 4.76 ERA (702.2 IP, 372 ER) in 122 home starts and 43-46 with a 4.36 ERA ( 691.0 IP, 335 ER) in 121 road starts.

THE REPERTOIRE: Bailey's pitch mix has changed over the years, following the contours of his career...in 2009, his first full big league season, Bailey threw a four seamer, sinker, changeup, 2019 his split finger between 2016-17 the split finger was his most effective out-creator last season, as he held opponents to a 188 ( 35 -for-186) batting average on the pitch...his 38.4 whiff percentage on his split finger in 2019 was his highest on any pitch he threw at least 275 times in a season since Baseball Savant began tracking pitches in 2008 Bailey foiled hitters with five different offerings last season, and has used as many as six different pitches throughout his career

29 OPPONENTS AND COUNTING: Bailey enters the 2020 season having faced 29 of 30 current MLB franchises, with the lone exception the Cincinnati Reds, where he spent the first part of his career...per the Twins' originally-planned 2020 schedule, he would not have had the opportunity to face his former team...however, under the Twins' new geographically-based schedule, the Twins have 20 games on the docket against the NL Central, including three against the Reds to close out the year (Sept. 25-27 at Target Field).
