

### Phils Blast Twins 9-1 in Exhibition

PHILADELPHIA, Pa.—The Minnesota Twins, riding a five-game winning streak in the American league, took a 9-1 pasting Tuesday from the National league's basement-dwellers, the Philadelphia Phillies.

The Twins committed five errors and managed only six hits off second-line Philly pitching in an exhibition game viewed by a charity crowd of 12,278.

The Twins did not come fully around.

**BOB ALLISON** was absent to attend a meeting in Boston as the Twins' player representative. **Harm Kilbrew** retired after his second time at bat and **Jim Lemon** took over at first. Third-stringer **Ron Henry** handled the catching. But it was a pretty timid showing in any case.

**Ron Lemmon**, who has a .14 record, and **Paul Brown**, recently recalled from Baltimore, held the Twins to six hits.

The crowd boomed Gene Mauck's Phillies, apparently waiting for Minnesota's game to make it interesting, but it was the futile Philk who unleashed the power.

**CHARLIE SMITH** hit one over the left-field roof for one homer and **John Callison** cleared the wall in right. **Pancho Herrera**, the main object of the four Bronx treatment, earned some grudging cheers when his third hit of the game cleared the upper deck in left.

The best the Twins could do was a double by **Lemon**. They got their only run when third baseman **Smith** interfered with **Lenny Green** on a home run.

**Duane McDewitt** gave up eight Phil hits and two of the homers. **Al Satriani**, in his first pitching assignment for the Twins, pitched another three hits, including **Herrera's** round tripper.

**HOWEVER**, Twin errors—**McDewitt** was guilty of a pair himself—more than Philly blugging made the real difference.

The Phils went ahead to stay in the fifth. **Don Demeter** singled, went all the way in third when **McDewitt's** attempted pickoff failed and right fielder scored on a wild pitch. However, **Smith's** mighty homer which followed made the run stored anyway and the score 3-1. It got stickier from there.
