

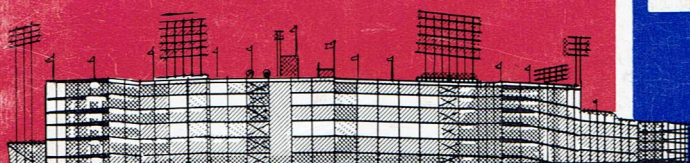
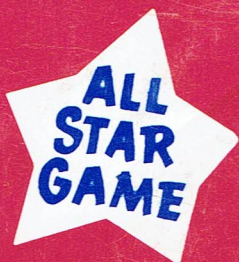

Calvin R. Griffith, Twins' President

1965 looms as a year of great challenge in the lives of Calvin Griffith and his Minnesota Twins. After three resoundingly successful seasons, the Twins in 1964 found the going rough, both on the field and at the gate.

The team looked great in spring training at Orlando, Florida, and continued to perform well through the early weeks of the season. An injury to second baseman Bernie Allen in mid-June started the club on a downslide, however, and they were never able to right themselves, eventually winding up in a tie for sixth place in the American League . . . this after first division finishes the preceding two seasons.

While the team continued to draw well at the gate, winding up with a total of 1,207,514, which was good for third place among league clubs, the attendance was, nonetheless, down considerably from the better-than-1,400,000 total with which Minnesota led the circuit in 1963.

So, for the first time since the move to Minnesota in October, 1960, Mr. Griffith finds his Twins in the position of having to fight their way back. Therein lies the challenge.

Challenge is nothing new for the Twins' chief executive, however. During his tenure as president of the club, he has successfully met a series of challenges. Chief among these were his succession to the presidency, close to ten years ago, and his much-deliberated decision to move his club to the Upper Midwest, five years later.

Perhaps more than any other high executive in baseball, Calvin Griffith was groomed to run a ball club. This he has been able to do, serving as his own general manager without that title but within his portfolio as Twins' president.

Born Calvin Robertson in Montreal, Quebec, Canada, he was adopted and brought to Washington by his uncle, Hall of Famer Clark C. Griffith, one of the great old-time pitchers, co-founder of the American League, and patron saint of baseball in the District of Columbia.

He began as mascot of the pennant-winning Washington teams of 1924 and 1925, and was educated at Staunton Military Academy, in Virginia, and George Washington University in the Capital City.

In 1935, Uncle Clark assigned Calvin to a three-year hitch as treasurer and president of the Senators' Chattanooga farm team. From 1938 through 1941, he held the same two posts at Charlotte.

At Chattanooga and Charlotte, Calvin even had some whirls at managing and proved a two-fisted leader. His Charlotte clubs won a pennant, barely missed two others and broke attendance records. He helped prepare for the majors such players as Early Wynn, Al Evans, Jake Early, Jim Bloodworth, Sherry Robertson, Joe Haynes and Bobby Estalella.

He married Natalie Niven of Charlotte and they have a son, Clark II, and two daughters, Corinne and Clare.

In 1942, Calvin was recalled to Washington to serve as his Uncle Clark's chief lieutenant. He began by operating the club's concessions department at Griffith Stadium. He had whirls as traveling secretary and in public relations. Then, he was permitted to negotiate the Senators' radio and television contracts. Later he was given authority to negotiate player trades.

On October 27, 1955, Clark Griffith passed away, and Calvin was elected president of the Senators five days later.

With his decision to transfer the Senators to Minnesota, on Oct. 26, 1960, Mr. Griffith brought to baseball's New Frontier an era brimming with the promise of victory and excitement in concert with the boom of the Upper Midwest.

Manager

MELE, Sabath Anthony

"Sam"

Born January 21, 1922, in Astoria, Long Island, New York. Height: 6 ft., 1 in. Weight: 200 lbs. Batted and threw righthanded. Married. Lives in Quincy, Massachusetts.

Since taking the helm of the Twins on June 23, 1961, Sam Mele has compiled one of the most impressive managerial records in the major leagues.

In three and a half seasons, the Mele-led Twins have won 306 games while dropping just 273, for a percentage of .528. Sam has guided the Twins to one second-place finish and one third-place windup in that time.

Although his Twins slipped a bit in 1964, Mele is confident that improvement in the club's defense will cause a resurgence of Minnesota fortunes in 1965.

A fine player in the majors for ten years, Sam played the outfield and first base equally well, had a strong arm and hit with occasional power.

He left his mark on the major league scene. In 1947, he was named the American League's top rookie. In 1951, he led the league in doubles, and in 1951 and 1953, he was the top outfielder in the league defensively. In 1953, he set a league record for most consecutive errorless games by an outfielder in a season, 131, handling 212 chances.

In the fourth inning of a game on June 10, 1952, Sam tied two major league records with his bat. He tripled and homered in the same inning, equalling the record for most long hits in an inning (2), and he batted in six runs, tying the mark.

Sam signed his first contract with the Boston Red Sox when he was in his third year at New York University. He had lettered in basketball, as well as baseball.

Sam comes from quite an athletic family. In fact, his uncle is Tony Cuccinello, long-time major league infielder, who is now a coach with the Chicago White Sox.

In January, 1949, Sam wed the former Constance Mary Clemens and the couple now has four children.

KILLEBREW, Harmon Clayton, Jr. "Harm" Outfielder

All kinds of homerun records are just over the horizon for Harmon Killebrew, easily the greatest long-ball slugger of the post-war era. After leading the American League in homers for the third straight year, and the majors for the second in a row, Harmon now stands in twelfth place among the active homerun hitters in the game. 24 players through the years are numbered among those hitters who have compiled a career total of 300 or more homeruns, and only Cincinnati's Frank Robinson appears likely to beat Killebrew into that select group in 1965. Harmon's homerun frequency of a homer every 12.6 times at bat is exceeded in baseball history only by Babe Ruth's frequency ratio of one every 11.8 trips . . . and Harm has been edging closer to that figure, year by year. Actually, at age 28, Killebrew has already hit 34 more homers than had Ruth at a similar age. In each of the past four seasons, Harm has totalled better than 40 homeruns, putting him within shooting distance of the Bambino's all-time major league mark of seven straight such seasons, from 1926 through 1932. An outfielder for the past three seasons, Killebrew is scheduled to return to first base in 1965, a position he played previously in 1960 and '61. The first game in which he appears in '65 will be the 1,000th contest of his big league career. Harm also does a bang-up job during the season as a sportscaster, conducting a pre-game telecast regularly on WTCN-TV.

Besides batting average, he led the league in hits, doubles, total bases, runs scored and times at bat, and he missed tying for the league-leadership in triples by just one. His total base and at-bat figures represent all-time major league records for a rookie. And in the field, Tony was equally outstanding, exhibiting great speed and displaying one of the finest throwing arms ever to come into the American League. One of a family of ten children, Tony, who used his brother's passport to get into this country from Cuba in 1961, was an overwhelming choice for the right-field spot on the American League All-Star team last July. His great batting feats of 1964 are all the more amazing when it's considered that the big knuckle on the middle finger of his right hand was swollen to double normal size for the balance of the season after Tony injured it in Boston, May 15. Tony 'O' is a solid bet to become a perennial repeater for the league batting crown . . . a modern-day Ty Cobb!

Second only to the great Walter Johnson in the annals of pitchers for Griffith ballclubs, Camilo Pascual is rapidly acquiring stature as one of the great pitchers of all time. Since the move of the Twins to Minnesota in October, 1960, only New York's Whitey Ford has copped more victories in American League play than has Pascual. And, only three National League hurlers exceed Camilo's total of wins over that stretch . . . Los Angeles' Don Drysdale and Sandy Koufax, and the San Francisco Giants' Juan Marichal. In 1964, the curving Cuban passed Ford in the all-time strikeout tables and, in fact, moved ahead of Hall of Famer Ed Walsh into 23rd place on the list of the game's strikeout artists. Actively, he is exceeded in this respect only by Warren Spahn, who has eight more full years of service than Camilo, and Robin Roberts, who has been around six seasons longer than Pascual. Although his win total was down last season, 1964 was a very gratifying year, personally, for Pascual. After several years of trying, he was finally able to get his parents out of Castro's Cuba. The elder Pascuals arrived in the Twin Cities during the summer and spent the winter here with Camilo and his family. Camilo purchased a home in Bloomington, Minnesota, and spent the off-season in the employ of Southtown Chrysler-Plymouth, Inc.
