THE TWINS: After losing two of three to the Pirates over their three-game series last weekend, the Twins began a short roadtrip in Cleveland with consecutive losses the last two nights... today they will play the three-game series finale before traveling to Minneapolis to enjoy an off-day tomorrow...on Friday they will begin a seven-game homestand with three against Kansas City (April 30-May 2) and four against Texas (May 3-6)...the Twins are 3-7 at home this season and 4-8 on the road.

POWER UP AND LOG ON: For the third consecutive season Major League Baseball is airing games via YouTube in 2021...today's game marks one of 21 scheduled broadcasts across baseball this season...the broadcasters today will be Scott Braun, LaTroy Hawkins, Jim Thome and Jon Morosi.

TWINS FALL AGAIN: The Twins lost to Cleveland last night by a score of 7-4, losing their fifth series of the season and dropping a season-low eight games below .500...Kenta Maeda was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on eight hits in 5.2 innings pitched, including three solo home runs...the offense recorded eight hits, two apiece from Byron Buxton, Nelson Cruz and Jake Cave...Cruz hit his first triple since 2018 and Buxton homered for the seventh time this season...by comparison, the Twins didn't lose their 15th game of 2020 until their 35th game played.

CRUZIN' AROUND THE DIVISION: Since joining the Twins prior to the 2019 season, Nelson Cruz has hit .349 (133-for-381) with 21 doubles, 41 home runs, 103 RBI, 46 walks, a .732 slugging percentage and a 1.155 OPS in 102 games against the American League Central... here are his home runs and OPS by AL Central opponent in that span: CLE - 6 HR/.730 OPS, CWS - 11 HR/1.328 OPS, DET - 9 HR/1.089 OPS, KC - 15 HR/1.448 OPS.

TWINS AND CLEVELAND: The Twins are playing the Indians for the third of 19 meetings in 2021...they went 7-3 against the Tribe last season...their next series after this one will be back at Progressive Field for three games over a weekend from May 21-23.

☞ Nelson Cruz has 26 career home runs against Cleveland in 98 games...he has 13 career home runs in 48 games at Progressive Field...he has homered seven times in his last 18 games in this ballpark.

☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .307 (39-for-127) with 10 doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 22 RBI and a .914 OPS in 32 career games at Progressive Field.

THE LEFTORIUM: The Twins are facing a left-handed starter for the ninth time this season, going 2-6 in their previous eight when a lefty starts...today marks their first time facing a Cleveland left-handed starter since Ryan Merritt on August 17, 2017...through 21 games this season they are hitting .243 (54-for-222) with 12 doubles, three home runs, 18 walks and a .648 OPS against lefties...below is how the last five seasons against lefties compare in a few offensive categories:

NOTE: Twins hit .295 (36-for-122) with a .818 OPS in their first eight games vs. left-handed pitching this season, but since have hit .180 (18-for-100) with a .439 OPS in nine games.

BUCK POWER: Byron Buxton has hit safely in 14 of 16 games played this season and has homered in seven of those 16...he enters today ranked in the top five in baseball in batting average, slugging and OPS (minimum 60 plate appearances):

FIRST IS BEST: Hitting and pitching numbers in the first inning this season:

☞ Twins are hitting .360 (32-for-89) in the first inning, tops in the majors and 33 points ahead of the next-closest team (Milwaukee - .327)...Twins own the second-best first-inning team on base percentage in the majors this season (.388, behind Chicago-AL, .394)... the top four individual spots in the lineup batting averages: .319 (29-for-91) from the leadoff spot, .233 (20-for-86) from the two spot, .276 (24-for-87) from the three spot and .282 (24-for-85) from the clean-up spot.

☞ Twins pitchers have allowed just three first-inning runs this season, fewest in the majors (next: Toronto and Oakland, six each) and good for an MLB-best 1.23 ERA (22.0 IP, 3 ER) in the first this year...Twins pitchers are holding opposing hitters to an MLB-low .111 batting average (8-for-72) in the opening frame this year and just two of the eight hits have gone for extra bases (one homer, one double)...Twins have also allowed just 13 total baserunners in the first inning all year, fewest among all MLB teams.

NO BROOMS: The Twins are looking to avoid being swept for the second time this season, the other occurred in three games at Oakland April 20-21...they were swept just twice last season, August 7-9 at Kansas City (3 games) and August 29-30 at Detroit (3 games)...last time they were swept by the Indians came in four games at Target Field from June 16-18, 2017...last time they were swept at Progressive Field came in three games August 29-31, 2016.

MARK YOUR CALENDARS: Major League Baseball announced yesterday that the postponed games between the Angels and Twins, originally scheduled for April 17-18 at Angel Stadium, will be made up as a traditional doubleheader beginning at 1:07 p.m. (PT) on Thursday, May 20, which was originally an off-day for both clubs...the Twins will be finishing a six-game homestand, fly to Southern California for the two games, then travel to Cleveland for three.

ON THIS DAY: Former Twins pitcher Pedro Ramos was born on this day in 1935 in Pinar del Rio, Cuba...Ramos began his 15-year career with the Senators and started the first game in Minnesota Twins history, tossing a complete-game shutout against New York-AL, on April 11, 1961...he also pitched for Cleveland from 1962-64.

LAST TIME OUT: Carried a no-hitter into the eighth inning of his 2-0 victory over Pittsburgh on April 23 at Target Field, the longest no-hit bid of his career and his first win in a Twins uniform...pitched 7.1 hitless innings before allowing a one-out double to Jacob Stallings in the top of the eighth...marked the first time in his career that he allowed only one hit over 7.1 innings...Tyler Duffey (1.0 IP) and Taylor Rogers (0.2 IP) finished the remainder of the game, combining for the 19th one-hitter in Twins' history (second this season).

- ☞ Twins snapped a four-game losing streak with that 2-0 win over the Pirates last Friday night...Happ takes the hill today again trying to bring a halt to his team's four-game skid.

TWO STARTS AGO: Made his first Target Field start as a Twin on April 13 in the first game of the series vs. Boston...tossed 4.2 innings, allowing two runs on four hits (1 HR), with one walk and three strikeouts in a no-decision...worked 4.0 scoreless innings and retired the first two batters he faced in the top of the fifth frame before allowing two runs on three hits, including a Hunter Renfroe solo shot and departing with the game tied 2-2.

CLEVELAND ENCOUNTERS: Today marks Happ's eighth appearance and seventh career start against Cleveland...is 3-2, 4.16 ERA (34.1 IP, 16 ER) with 10 walks and 28 strikeouts...last faced the Indians on July 23, 2017 at Progressive Field, allowing nine hits and seven runs over 6.0 innings and receiving his second career loss to Cleveland...has not yet recorded a win at Progressive Field...is 3-0, 1.80 ERA (25.0 IP, 5 ER), five walks and 22 strikeouts against Cleveland in four career starts at home, compared to 0-2, 10.61 ERA (9.1 IP, 11 ER) in three career games (two starts) at Progressive Field.

AL CENTRAL COMPETITION: Happ has spent 10 seasons of his career in the American League and seven seasons in the National League...this year marks his first time playing for a team in the AL Central...is 18-15, 4.87 ERA (249.2 IP, 135 ER) in 47 appearances (44 starts) against the division throughout his career.

RISP AND NO REWARD: Happ held opposing hitters to a .156 opponent batting average (5-for-32) with runners in scoring position last season...his BAA in scoring situations ranked second among American League starting pitchers (min. 30 opp. at-bats), trailing only TEX's Lance Lynn (.145), and ninth among all major league starting pitchers...yielded just two extra-base hits in scoring situations all season (2B on Sept. 3 at NYM and HR on Sept. 25 vs. MIA).

- ☞ Happ is holding opponents to 1-for-8 (.125) with runners in scoring position through his first three starts of the season...opponents are also hitting just .188 (2-for-16) against him with runners on base.

A DIFFERENT 300 CLUB: Happ's last start was the 301st of his career...he is one of 11 active pitcher to reach the 300-start plateau, joining: Zack Greinke (464), Justin Verlander (454), Jon Lester (423), Ervin Santana (385), Max Scherzer (373), Clayton Kershaw (359), Adam Wainwright (331), David Price (311), Johnny Cueto (311) and Madison Bumgarner (300).

- ☞ Has made at least 10 starts against 11 of 30 Major League Baseball teams.

PITCH SELECTION: After featuring five pitches last season, Happ seems to be sticking with what works for him...here is Happ's 2021 repertoire, according to Baseball Savant:

- ☞ Set season-high in strikeouts on September 8 at Toronto, fanning 10 batters in 6.1 innings...marked his 11th career double-digit strikeout game and sixth on the road...also marked his third career start of at least 10 strikeouts in less than 7.0 innings.
- ☞ Set season high in innings pitched on September 19 at Boston, pitching 8.0 shutout innings with four hits allowed, no walks and nine strikeouts...marked just his third career start with no walks in at least 8.0 innings.
- ☞ Did not allow more than four earned runs in any start.
- ☞ Ranked second on club in innings pitched (49.1) and fourth in strikeouts (42).
- ☞ Led all American League left-handed pitchers with a .208 opponent batting average (minimum 45.0 IP), while ranking second in WHIP (1.05) and sixth in opponent OPS (.655).
- ☞ Appeared in relief in Game 2 of the American League Division series on October 6 vs. Tampa Bay and was dealt the loss, allowing four runs on five hits in 2.2 innings pitched.
- ☞ Signed a one-year deal with Minnesota on January 22, 2021.

SPRING RECAP: Missed the start of spring training due to COVID-19...went 1-1, 9.35 ERA (8.2 IP, 9 ER) with three walks and seven strikeouts in three games (2 GS) in spring play...cleared to return to action and made his first official Grapefruit League appearance on March 15 at Atlanta.

FRIDAY'S STARTER - RHP MICHAEL PINEDA (2021 SEASON: 1-1, 2.42 ERA // CAREER: 54-47, 3.98 ERA)

Pineda is due to start the first game of the series vs. Kansas City on Friday night at Target Field, following tomorrow's off-day...is 1-1, 2.42 ERA (22.1 IP, 6 ER) over his first four starts of 2021...shouldered the 6-2 loss in his last outing April 24 vs. Pittsburgh, his first defeat since July 16, 2019 vs. New York-NL (had won 8-straight decisions spanning 16 starts in-between)...will mark his 12th career start and appearance vs. the Royals, having gone 5-6, 4.21 ERA (68.1 IP, 32 ER), 13 walks and 62 strikeouts in his 11 prior outings...last faced the Royals on June 23, 2019 in Kansas City, taking the loss after allowing five runs on eight hits, with five strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work...has never faced Kansas City at Target Field.

CAREER NOTES

- Ranks fourth among active left-handed pitchers in wins (124) and starts (301), while is fifth in innings pitched (1757.1) and seventh in strikeouts (1549).
- Pitched a career best of 7.1 hitless innings on April 23, 2021 vs. Pittsburgh. Left the game allowing only one hit over 7.1 innings, marking the 19th one-hitter in Twins' pitching history and second this season.
- Made his 300th career start April 13, 2021 vs. Boston
- In 2020, led all American League left-handed pitchers with a .208 opponent batting average (minimum 45.0 IP), while ranking second in WHIP (1.05) and sixth in opponent OPS (.655)...did not allow more than four earned runs in any start.
- Has made 12 Opening Day rosters with six teams: Philadelphia (2009-10), Houston (2011-12), Toronto (2013, '16-18), Seattle (2015), New York-AL (2019-20) and Minnesota (2021).
- Enters 2021 with 14 MLB seasons under his belt, with the Phillies (2007-10), Astros (2010-12), Blue Jays (2012-14, '16-18), Mariners (2015), Pirates (2015) and Yankees (2018-20).
- Made his 300th career major league appearance and 275th career start on June 23, 2019 vs. Houston.
- Compiled a career-best 19.1-inning scoreless streak from August 26-September 12-G1, 2019, the AL's eighth-longest scoreless streak in 2019 and longest by a Yankee.
- Finished sixth in 2016 AL Cy Young Award voting after going 20-4, 3.18 ERA for Toronto and tying for the second-most wins in baseball...marks his only career 20-win season and is one of just seven pitchers in the majors (and one of two southpaws) with a 20-win campaign in that span.
