**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 3-1 through their first four games of the season, taking two of three in Milwaukee, followed by a win in Detroit yesterday...this afternoon, the Twins will play the second of three at Comerica Park...following tomorrow afternoon's series finale, the Twins will travel to Minneapolis to open their 12th season at Target Field at 3:10 p.m. (CT) on Thursday vs. the Seattle Mariners...it will mark the start of a seven-game, eight-day homestand.

**TWINS TAKE ONE TO THE TIGERS:** The Twins beat the Tigers yesterday by a score of 15-6 at Comerica Park...Matt Shoemaker made his Twins debut, allowing one run on three hits in 6.0 innings pitched and earned the win...the offense recorded 14 hits, three from both Williams Astudillo and Nelson Cruz, who homered twice...the first Cruz longball was a grand slam, the 10th of his career and first as a Twin (first since 2016)...the offense also went 9-for-18 with runners in scoring position...the 15 runs scored marks the most in baseball this season and the Twins' most since July 5, 2019 vs. Texas (also 15).

⚡ Cruz's 10th multi-homer games over the last three seasons are the most for any player over that span...next on that list is Gleyber Torres who has eight games with at least two homers since the 2019 season (*Elias*).  
⚡ Cruz, who is 40 years and 278 days today, is the oldest player to hit a grand slam since Henry Blanco did so for Seattle in 2013 at 41 years and 337 days (*Elias*).

**BOMBAS IN BUNCHES:** Nelson Cruz recorded his 37th career multi-homer game yesterday and 10th since joining the Twins (7th against an AL Central opponent)...his 37 career multi-homer games are tied for 39th all-time with Ted Williams, Alfonso Soriano, Mike Piazza, Stan Musial and Edwin Encarnación...Cruz's 12 multi-homer games after turning 38 years old are the most in baseball history, ahead of Barry Bonds (11), David Ortiz (10), Darrell Evans (10) and Hank Sauer (9).

**CRUZZING AROUND THE DIVISION:** Since joining the Twins prior to the 2019 season, Nelson Cruz has hit .346 (126-for-364) with 21 doubles, 40 home runs, 101 RBI, 46 walks, a .734 slugging percentage and a 1.157 OPS in 98 games against the American League Central...here are his home runs and OPS by ALC opponent in that span: CLE - 6 HR/.703 OPS, CWS - 11 HR/1.328 OPS, DET - 8 HR/1.076 OPS, KC - 15 HR/1.448 OPS.

**TWINS AND TIGERS:** The Twins and Tigers are playing the second of 19 times in 2021...the Twins have won seven of their last eight over the Tigers, 12 of their last 16 and 15 of their last 20.

⚡ Jorge Polanco is hitting .305 (79-for-259) with 14 doubles, four triples, seven home runs, 35 RBI, 17 walks and a .348 on-base percentage in 67 career games vs. the Tigers...in his last 15 against the Tigers, he is hitting .403 (25-for-62) with three home runs, eight RBI and a 1.003 OPS.  
⚡ Nelson Cruz is hitting .330 (75-for-227) with 10 doubles, 19 home runs, 50 RBI, 18 walks and a 1.007 OPS in 57 career games at Comerica Park...in his last 25 games here, he is hitting .389 (42-for-108) with 15 home runs, 30 RBI and a 1.266 OPS...in fact, since 2015, he leads all opponents in home runs at Comerica with 15.

**ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY:** In 1982, the largest crowd ever to see a baseball game in Minnesota, 52,279, showed up for the inaugural game at the brand-new Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome...Twins rookie Gary Gaetti had four hits, including a pair of home runs, but the visiting Seattle Mariners won, 11-7.

**HAPPY BERT DAY!:** Hall-of-Famer Bert Blyleven turns 70 today...Bert appeared in five games on his birthday, combining to go 2-1, 2.51 ERA (32.1 IP, 9 ER) with 13 walks and 22 strikeouts...he pitched a complete game on his birthday in 1973 against Oakland...Bert retired from the broadcast booth after the 2020 season.

**OPENING DAY ON TARGET:** Below are pregame plans for the Twins Home Opener at Target Field, presented by Your Local Northland Ford Dealers, which is scheduled for 3:10 p.m. on Thursday vs. the Seattle Mariners...the game, along with the remainder of the three-game weekend series (also Saturday, April 10 and Sunday, April 11), are sellouts...the Twins are welcoming 10,000 fans to Target Field...the Opener will be the first time fans have been at Target Field for a game since October 7, 2019 (Game 3 of the ALDS).

- ⚡ The National Anthem, presented by Thomson Reuters, will be sung by Natalia Romero Arbeláez, a local educator and performer who sings in Twin Cities professional vocal ensembles.
- ⚡ A flyover will feature two F-16s from the Minnesota National Guard's 148th Fighter Wing, based out of Duluth.
- ⚡ Recently retired following 29 seasons as a major league coach or manager, Ron Gardenhire will throw out the ceremonial first pitch to his son, Toby, who is set to manage the St. Paul Saints, the Twins' new Triple-A affiliate...2021 marks the 30th Anniversary of the 1991 World Series Champs...Gardy was the third base coach of that club.
- ⚡ The Twins are proud to salute the tireless efforts of our educators...a Home Opener video tribute will honor a Ceremonial Starting Lineup representing the thousands of men and women working as educators and school personnel across Twins Territory.
- ⚡ The Twins starting lineup will be read by Dave Lee, the wake-up voice for News Talk 830 WCCO listeners for more than a quarter-century, who is retiring later this year.
- ⚡ The Twins will share an in-memoriam video and moment of silence...this year, the Twins will honor the memory of bench coach Mike Bell, legendary Minnesota sports personality Sid Hartman, longtime Twin Cities broadcaster Tom Hanneman and those in Twins Territory who have died from COVID-19.

2020 NOTES:

- Spent third season with New York-AL, his second full season with the Yankees.
Made the start in the Yankees' fifth game on July 30 at Baltimore, his first of nine starts on the season.
Set season-high in strikeouts on September 8 at Toronto, fanning 10 batters in 6.1 innings... marked his 11th career double-digit strikeout game and sixth on the road...also marked his third career start of at least 10 strikeouts in less than 7.0 innings.
Set season high in innings pitched on September 19 at Boston, pitching 8.0 shutout innings with four hits allowed, no walks and nine strikeouts...marked just his third career start with no walks in at least 8.0 innings.
Did not allow more than four earned runs in any start.
Ranked second on club in innings pitched (49.1) and fourth in strikeouts (42).
Led all American League left-handed pitchers with a .208 opponent batting average (minimum 45.0 IP), while ranking second in WHIP (1.05) and sixth in opponent OPS (.655).
Appeared in relief in Game 2 of the American League Division series on October 6 vs. Tampa Bay and was dealt the loss, allowing four runs on five hits in 2.2 innings pitched.
Signed a one-year deal with Minnesota on January 22, 2021.

SPRING RECAP: Missed the start of spring training due to COVID-19...went 1-1, 9.35 ERA (8.2 IP, 9 ER) with three walks and seven strikeouts in three games (2 GS) in spring play...cleared to return to action and made his first official Grapefruit League appearance on March 15 at Atlanta, starting and working 2.0 scoreless innings...yielded just one hit and two walks, while striking out one batter, in the outing...earned the win in his next start March 21 at Baltimore, despite allowing five runs (four earned) on six hits in 3.0 innings...last pitched on March 26 vs. Atlanta (L, 3.2 IP, 10 H, 6 R/5 ER, 1 BB, 4 K).

TAKING THE MOUND IN THE MOTOR CITY: Is 3-2, 5.14 ERA (63.0 IP, 36 ER) with 22 walks, 57 strikeouts and a .284 opponent batting average (71-for-250) in 12 career games (11 starts) against Detroit...last faced the Tigers in 2019, taking a no-decision on Sept. 12 at Comerica Park (4.2 IP, 7 H, 2 R/ER, 1 HR, 3 BB, 6 K)...four of his 11 starts against Detroit have been quality and he's fanned at least seven batters in four starts as well.

- Happ's last win in this ballpark came on June 5, 2014 for Toronto...yielded just three runs on seven hits in a 6.1-inning quality start (2 BB, 2 K)...last win against the Tigers overall occurred on Sept. 10, 2017 for Toronto at Rogers Centre (6.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R/1 ER, 1 HR, 2 BB, 9 K).

CENTRAL OF ATTENTION: Due to the regional schedules in 2020, Happ last faced the AL Central division in 2019, going 1-2, 7.85 ERA (28.2 IP, 25 ER), eight homers allowed, 12 walks, 29 strikeouts and a .314 opponent batting average (38-for-121) in six starts...he's 18-15, 4.91 ERA (245.2 IP, 134 ER) in 46 career appearances (43 starts) against the Central, his second-highest career ERA vs. any single division (5.02 ERA vs. NL Central).

DAYLIGHT, ALRIGHT: Happ went 0-0, 2.60 ERA (17.1 IP, 5 ER), one walk, 14 strikeouts and a .250 opponent batting average (16-for-64) in three day starts last season...that compared to a 2-2, 3.94 (32.0 IP, 14 ER) mark in six night starts...despite the stark ERA difference in 2020, Happ's career numbers in day and night games are nearly identical - has a career 3.99 ERA (638.1 IP, 283 ER) in 120 games (110 starts) in day games compared to a 3.97 ERA (1103.0 IP, 487 ER) in 204 games (188 starts) in night games.

RISP AND NO REWARD: Happ held opposing hitters to a .156 opponent batting average (5-for-32) with runners in scoring position last season...his BAA in scoring situations ranked second among American League starting pitchers (min. 30 opp. at-bats), trailing only TEX's Lance Lynn (.145), and ninth among all major league starting pitchers...yielded just two extra-base hits in scoring situations all season (2B on Sept. 3 at NYM and HR on Sept. 25 vs. MIA).

APRIL FLOWERS AND SEPTEMBER SUN: Is 16-11, 3.77 ERA (243.1 IP, 102 ER) in 49 career games (38 starts) in April, his second-lowest single-month ERA in his career, trailing only his 2.76 ERA (336.1 IP, 103 ER) in 60 appearances (56 starts) in September.

PITCH SELECTION: Happ has consistently featured a five-pitch mix throughout his career, with the most notable increase in usage coming with his sinker...Happ threw the sinker just 14 times (0.5%) in his first full season in the majors in 2009, compared to the 173 sinkers (22.0%) he threw in 2020...also tends to throw his changeup exclusively to right-handed batters - of the 109 changeups he unleashed in 2020, none of them went to a left-handed batter...below is the breakdown of Happ's complete repertoire from last season, according to Baseball Savant:

MEMBER OF AN EXCLUSIVE CLUB: Happ went 20-4 for Toronto in 2016 and is one of only six left-handed pitchers to post a 20-win season in the last 10 years...the others are: Clayton Kershaw (2x), David Price, Gio Gonzalez, Dallas Keuchel and Blake Snell.

- Ranked fourth among active southpaws in wins (123) and starts (298), and is fifth in innings pitched (1741.1) and seventh in strikeouts (1539).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP KENTA MAEDA (2021 SEASON: 0-0, 2.08 ERA // CAREER: 53-36, 3.74 ERA)

Maeda is slated to make his second start of the season in the series finale at Comerica Park tomorrow afternoon...was the Twins' Opening Day starter on April 1 at Milwaukee, taking a no-decision after yielding two runs (1 ER) on six hits in 4.1 innings, with two walks and five strikeouts...is 1-2, 4.88 ERA (24.0 IP, 13 ER), one walk, 32 strikeouts and a .189 (17-for-90) opponent batting average in four career starts against the Tigers...three of the four starts against Detroit occurred last year - the other was on August 20, 2017...is 0-2, 5.25 ERA (12.0 IP, 7 ER) in two career starts at Comerica Park...his .189 BAA vs. the Tigers is tied with his mark against Pittsburgh for his fourth lowest against any single opponent in his career (min. .40 AB).

- Ranked fourth among active left-handed pitchers in wins (123) and starts (298), while is fifth in innings pitched (1741.1) and seventh in strikeouts (1539).
In 2020, led all American League left-handed pitchers with a .208 opponent batting average (minimum 45.0 IP), while ranking second in WHIP (1.05) and sixth in opponent OPS (.655)...did not allow more than four earned runs in any start.
Has made 12 Opening Day rosters with six teams: Philadelphia (2009-10), Houston (2011-12), Toronto (2013, '16-18), Seattle (2015), New York-AL (2019-20) & Minnesota (2021).
Enters 2021 with 14 MLB seasons under his belt, with the Phillies (2007-10), Astros (2010-12), Blue Jays (2012-14, '16-18), Mariners (2015), Pirates (2015), Yankees (2018-20).
Made his 300th career major league appearance and 275th career start on June 23, 2019 vs. Houston.
Compiled a career-best 19.1-inning scoreless streak from August 26-September 12-G1, 2019, the AL's eighth-longest scoreless streak in 2019 and longest by a Yankee.
Finished sixth in 2016 AL Cy Young Award voting after going 20-4, 3.18 ERA for Toronto and tying for the second-most wins in baseball...marks his only career 20-win season and is one of just seven pitchers in the majors (and one of two southpaws) with a 20-win campaign in that span.
Finished second in 2009 BBWAA NL "Rookie of the Year" balloting to Florida's Chris Coghlan...appeared on all 32 ballots, receiving 10 first-place votes...won the 2009 Players' Choice Award for NL Outstanding Rookie...named 2009 NL Rookie of the Year by The Sporting News.
Selected by Philadelphia in the third round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft out of Northwestern University...debuted for the Phillies on June 30, 2007.
