THE TWINS: After completing their five-game roadtrip with a record of 3-2 (1-1 in Anaheim and 2-1 in Cleveland), the Twins began their six-game, seven-day homestand with a win over the Orioles last night...tonight they will continue the series with the second of three vs. Baltimore, then play the series finale tomorrow afternoon...the Twins will enjoy an off-day on Thursday, then host the Royals for three over the weekend...the Twins have gone 9-15 at home this season and 9-14 on the road.

☞ Twins have won four of their last five, five of their last eight and six of their last 11...Twins are looking to win three-straight games for just the second time this season (also April 3-5).

RAIN NEARLY RUINS THE NIGHT: The Twins beat the Orioles last night by a score of 8-3, holding a 2-1 lead in the eighth inning before a 45-minute rain delay...after the delay, Jorge Alcalá allowed a two-run home run to DJ Stewart but the Twins responded with a six-run bottom of the eighth...Matt Shoemaker was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing one run on five hits in 6.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 12 hits as five different players had multiple hits...Kyle Garlick hit his second home run in as many days and Trevor Larnach hit a 461-foot shot into the Delta Sky360° Club, the longest for a Twin this season (list lower right margin) and seventh Twin to homer into that area.

TWINS AND BIRDS: The Twins and Orioles are playing each other for the second of six scheduled meetings this season as the Twins travel to Baltimore for three from May 31-June 2...since the start of 2018, the Twins are 13-1 vs. the Orioles...their last loss came on Opening Day 2018 as Adam Jones hit a walk-off homer off Fernando Rodney in the 11th inning...since that game, their 13-game winning streak is the longest active streak vs. any opponent...it's the Twins' longest ever vs. the Orioles (see note below).

☞ The Twins are 29-12 vs. Baltimore since the start of 2014...that marks the most wins against Baltimore among non-American League East teams.

☞ Max Kepler has hit safely in 16 of 17 career games against the Orioles, hitting .422 (27-for-64) with seven doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 22 RBI, eight walks, a .479 OBP and a 1.464 OPS...he has multiple hits in four straight and has homered six times in his last six.

☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .355 (94-for-265) with 21 doubles, 17 home runs, 58 RBI, a .634 slugging percentage and a 1.061 OPS in 71 career games vs. the O's...Cruz played one season with Baltimore in 2014 and was the starting DH for the AL in the All-Star Game at Target Field...he went 0-for-2 with a strikeout and a groundout in the game.

MORE ON MIGGY: In his last 11 games, since May 15, he has hit .293 (12-for-41) with three doubles, six home runs, 14 RBI and a 1.174 OPS...since that date, he leads the AL in RBI, tied with Vladimir Guerrero Jr. for first in home runs, seventh in OPS and tied for 10th in hits.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT:

☞ Alex Kirilloff has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games, hitting .311 (14-for-45) with three doubles, four home runs, 14 RBI, 12 runs scored and a .978 OPS in that span...he leads all rookies in baseball in OPS (min. 50 plate appearances) since April 26.

☞ Trevor Larnach has posted a .351 on-base percentage in his last 10 games, recording eight hits and five walks in 37 plate appearances, including an .820 OPS in that span...he has four RBI in his last five games...his on-base percentage in that span ranks sixth best among MLB rookies.

ROUND TRIPS: Twins have hit 65 home runs this season, tied for fifth most in baseball...they have homered in 10-straight home games, their longest streak since homering in 15 straight at Target Field from July 16-August 7, 2019...they lead the AL in homers (51) since April 21.

VAX FACTS: The Twins, in partnership with CUB Pharmacy, are hosting on-site vaccination opportunities at Target Field for fans attending this series vs. the Orioles...additionally, all fans 18-and-over who choose to receive the one-dose, Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine at Target Field will receive a voucher good for one complimentary ticket to a future Twins regular season home game in 2021...the Twins' on-site vaccination opportunity is in support of Governor Tim Walz' "Roll Up Your Sleeves, Minnesota Fans" campaign...vaccinations will be available inside Gate 34 tonight and tomorrow, beginning when gates open and lasting through the seventh inning of both games.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1997, the Twins retired Kirby Puckett's number 34...it was the fifth number to be retired by the Twins and now one of eight: Harmon Killebrew (#3), Rod Carew (#29), Tony Oliva (#6), Kent Hrbek (#14), Bert Blyleven (#28), Tom Kelly (#10), Joe Mauer (#7) and Jackie Robinson (#42)...Puckett is the Twins all-time leader in hits (2,304), doubles (414) and at-bats (7,244).

KUUUUUUUUUUUBE: Former Twins outfielder Jason Kubel is celebrating his 39th birthday today...Kubel hit two career home runs against the Orioles, one of which was a grand slam off Jake Arrieta on July 25, 2010 in Oriole Park at Camden Yards.

REMEMBERING GEORGE FLOYD: Today marks the one-year anniversary of the death of George Floyd...below is a brief outline of tonight's events:

- ☞ The evening will begin with a pair of videos shown on the Target Field scoreboard and throughout the ballpark...the first articulates the Minnesota Twins' commitment to support positive change focused on racial equity and social justice...the second spotlights the important - and ongoing - actions the Twins, the Pohlad Family Foundation and the organization's nonprofit partners have taken.
- ☞ The ceremonial first pitch will be delivered via video by representatives from the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Twin Cities, Neighborhood House, Northside Achievement Zone, Pillsbury United Communities, Urban Ventures, and YWCA of Minneapolis.
- ☞ Employees from the Twins front office, along with the various Pohlad Companies, will line up along the warning track at Target Field, wearing "End Racism" t-shirts, as a symbol of solidarity and commitment to help support an equitable world in which everyone is protected, safe and welcome.
- ☞ The National Anthem, presented by Thomson Reuters, will be sung by renowned local artists NUNNABOVE.
- ☞ The Twins will distribute to local youth, through Twins nonprofit partner Every Meal, more than 250 copies of the children's book "Justice Makes a Difference - The Story of Miss Freedom Fighter, Esquire" by Dr. Anika Tyner and Jacklyn Milton.

LAST START: Was the winner in the Twins 6-3 victory on May 20 at Los Angeles-AL, opposite Griffin Canning...started game two of the doubleheader, his third game-two doubleheader start this season...was supported with four first-inning runs on a Miguel Sanó grand slam...allowed a run in the first inning on a Jose Rojas solo homer...allowed two runs in the second inning on a Taylor Ward double and a Drew Butera single...struck out seven-plus for the fourth time on the season...threw 84 pitches, 54 for strikes.

START PRIOR: Did not factor into the decision in the Twins 5-4 victory May 15 vs. Oakland, opposite Cole Irvin...started the middle of a three-game weekend series with the A's, the only game the Twins won...set a season-high with 7.0 innings pitched...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Matt Olson two-run shot...allowed another home run, a solo shot to Mark Canha in the fifth inning...exited trailing 4-1 but the Twins scored four runs in the eighth, highlighted by a Miguel Sanó three-run homer.

700 CLUB: Surpassed both 700 strikeouts and 700.0 innings pitched for his career...his 700th strikeout came in the fifth inning on May 15 vs. Oakland, fanning Seth Brown...became the 15th Twin to reach 700 strikeouts (full list bottom right) and the 28th Twin to reach 700.0 innings pitched.

- ⚡ Needs six strikeouts to tie Eric Milton for 14th on the Twins all-time strikeout list.

VS. THE BIRDS: Is 5-0, 3.52 ERA (38.1 IP, 15 ER) with seven walks and 36 strikeouts in six career starts against the Orioles...his last start came on April 27, 2019 at Target Field, earning the win while allowing two runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched with no walks and eight strikeouts...his current five-game winning streak against Baltimore is the second longest of his career vs. one opponent, trailing his six-game winning streak vs. the White Sox from August 30, 2017-May 24, 2019...his only career complete game shutout came against Baltimore at Camden Yards on April 1, 2018.

MINNEAPOLIS MAESTRO: Will be making his fifth start at Target Field this season, having gone 2-1, 5.48 ERA (23.0 IP, 14 ER) in four home starts...over his career, he has appeared in 58 games (57 starts) at Target Field, going 30-18, 3.77 ERA (343.1 IP, 144 ER) with 98 walks and 365 strikeouts...all-time at Target Field, he ranks second in wins (Kyle Gibson - 32), innings pitched (Gibson - 542.1), strikeouts (Gibson - 425) and starts (Gibson - 96).

- ⚡ His last start at Target Field came on May 15 vs. Oakland, allowing four runs on eight hits in a season-high 7.0 innings pitched as the Twins won 5-4 (see START PRIOR note).

MAY WAYS: He is 12-4, 4.19 ERA (133.1 IP, 62 ER) with 38 walks, 127 strikeouts and a .238 opponent batting average in 22 career starts in May...the 12 wins are his most for any month, ahead of his nine wins in September...12 May wins since 2017 are tied with Kyle Hendricks, Lance Lynn and Max Scherzer for third most in baseball, trailing Germán Márquez (12) and Stephen Strasburg (12).

RIGHTY TIGHTY: He has held right-handed hitters to a .152 (15-for-99) average with three doubles, two home runs, five walks and 35 strikeouts, compared to lefties hitting .313 (26-for-83) with eight doubles, one triple, four home runs, 10 walks and 21 strikeouts...his right-handed opponent batting average ranks second in the AL, trailing only Houston's Cristian Javier (.133).

TOP OF THE CLASS: Berríos has 49 wins since the start of 2017, second most in the American League in that span trailing only Justin Verlander (53)...MLB-wide in that span, 49 wins are tied for seventh in the majors with Aaron Nola and Charlie Morton, trailing Cole (60), Greinke (57), Kershaw (55), Scherzer (54), Verlander (53) and Bauer (50)...his 660 strikeouts are fourth in the AL in that span, trailing Verlander (816), Cole (788) and Sale (763).

2020 RECAP:

- ⚡ Held right-handed hitters to .287 (37-for-129) at the plate, and left-handers to .180 (20-for-111)...among pitchers that faced at least 100 left-handed hitters, his .180 opponent batting average ranked third in the American League and seventh in baseball.
- ⚡ Held opponents to a .174 (8-for-46) batting average with runners in scoring position...ranked third in the American League and tied fourth in the majors in that regard (min. 45 opponent AB with RISP).
- ⚡ Led club in games started (12), pickoffs (2), and finished second in innings pitched (63.0), quality starts (4) and pitching WAR (1.1)...also tied for the most home wins (3) on the team.
- ⚡ Started Game 2 in AL Wild Card September 30 vs. Houston at Target Field, allowing one run on two hits in 5.0 innings pitched with two walks and four strikeouts as the Twins lost 3-1.

CAREER NOTES

- Named to 2018 and 2019 AL All-Star teams, pitching 1.0 inning in both games.
- Started Game 1 of the 2019 ALDS against New York-AL and Game 2 of the 2020 AL Wild Card Series vs. Houston.
- In 2019, teamed with Jake Odorizzi (11 K on March 30 against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893, when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall-of-Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.
- Given the 2018 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins Pitcher of the Year, voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of BBWA...also won the Carl R. Pohlad Community Service Award.
- Became 21st pitcher in Twins' history to reach the 200-strikeout mark in a season (202 in 2018).
- Pitched for Team Puerto Rico in the 2017 World Baseball Classic, going 1-0, 8.10 ERA (6.2 IP, 6 ER) with two walks and 10 strikeouts.
- Made MLB debut April 27, 2016 vs. Cleveland.
- Named Twins' second-best prospect entering 2016, as well as best curveball, best changeup, and best control in Twins' system by *Baseball America*.
- Named 20th best prospect in baseball by MLB.com entering 2016.
- Started for the World Team in the Sirius XM Futures Games in consecutive seasons, 2014 at Target Field and 2015 at Great American Ball Park in Cincinnati.
- Led all of minor league baseball in strikeouts (175) in 2015.
