2021 marks his sixth season with the Twins.

LAST START: Earned his team-leading seventh win of the season last Saturday night vs. Houston...pitched 7.0 innings of two-run ball, allowing five hits (2 HR) and one walk while striking out eight...

START PRIOR: Earned his sixth win of the season in a 5-4 Twins victory June 5 at Kansas City...tied his season-high with four runs on six hits (1 HR) over 6.0 innings, with two walks...fanned four batters...

GOING STREAKING: His current five-game win streak matches the longest of his career, previously done April 14-May 7, 2019.

- Is 5-0, 3.73 ERA (50.2 IP, 21 ER) with 12 walks and 48 strikeouts in eight starts since May 2...has completed at least 5.0 innings in all eight of those games (Twins are 7-1).
Twins hitters have supported Berríos with 34 runs during that stretch (6.04 run support average), tied for the fourth-highest total among all American League starters in that span.
His last losing decision came in the second game of the doubleheader at Oakland on April 20, when he surrendered one run on four hits with one walk and five strikeouts over 5.0 innings in a 1-0 A's victory.

700 CLUB: This season, Berríos has surpassed both 700 strikeouts and 700.0 innings pitched for his career...his 700th strikeout came in the fifth inning on May 15 vs. Oakland, fanning Seth Brown...

- He needs 36 strikeouts to tie Scott Baker (770) for 12th on the Twins all-time strikeout list (list in lower right area of page).

MESSIN' WITH TEXAS: Is making his fifth career start against the Rangers...owns a 2-1, 5.75 ERA (20.1 IP, 13 ER) with nine walks and 30 strikeouts in four prior starts against Texas...last faced the Rangers on August 17, 2019 in Arlington, allowing seven runs (3 ER) on seven hits (2 HR), with three walks and six strikeouts in 4.1 innings.

- Has never won in Arlington, going 0-1, 8.64 ERA (8.1 IP, 8 ER) with six walks and 12 strikeouts in two prior starts at Globe Life Park...exited the game prior to completing 5.0 innings in both starts...tonight marks his (and the Twins') first-ever game at the newly-constructed Globe Life Field.

SLICK LEATHER: He has four defensive runs saved this season, tied with San Francisco's Kevin Gausman for second best among all pitchers in baseball, trailing only Chicago-AL's Dallas Keuchel (6)...Berríos finished tied for fifth in baseball among pitchers in DRS in 2020 with one...since 2019, he ranks tied for seventh in DRS with five.

RIGHTY TIGHTY: Berríos is holding right-handed hitters to a .168 (26-for-155) average with five doubles, three home runs, eight walks and 46 strikeouts, compared to lefties hitting .292 (38-for-130) with 12 doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 12 walks and 35 strikeouts against him...his right-handed opponent batting average ranks second in the AL (min. 130 opp. AB), behind only HOU's Luis Garcia (.146).

RISP IT TO GET THE BISCUIT: Berríos is holding hitters to a .212 (14-for-66) opponent batting average with runners in scoring position this season, the seventh-best mark among AL pitchers (min. 75.0 IP)...his average stays consistent in lower-leverage situations as he is also holding batters to a .217 (38-for-175) opponent batting average with no runners on base.

- His .225 (64-for-285) overall opponent batting average ranks seventh among American League pitchers (min. 75.0 IP).
The 64 hits he has allowed this season are tied for fifth fewest among American League pitchers (min. 75.0 IP).

TOP OF THE CLASS: Berríos has 52 wins since the start of 2017, second most in the American League in that span, trailing only Justin Verlander (53)...MLB-wide in that time frame, 52 wins is seventh in the majors, trailing Gerrit Cole (62), Zack Greinke (60), Clayton Kershaw (57), Max Scherzer (55), Charlie Morton (53) and Verlander (53)...his 685 strikeouts are fourth in the AL, trailing Verlander (816), Cole (813) and Chris Sale (763).

CAREER NOTES

- Named to 2018 and 2019 AL All-Star teams, pitching 1.0 inning in both games.
Started Game 1 of the 2019 ALDS against New York-AL and Game 2 of the 2020 AL Wild Card Series vs. Houston.
In 2019, teamed with Jake Odorizzi (11 K on March 30 against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893, when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall-of-Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.
Named the 2018 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins Pitcher of the Year, voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of BBWAA...also won the Carl R. Pohlrad Community Service Award.
Became 21st pitcher in Twins' history to reach the 200-strikeout mark in a season (202 in 2018).
Pitched for Team Puerto Rico in the 2017 World Baseball Classic, going 1-0, 8.10 ERA (6.2 IP, 6 ER) with two walks and 10 strikeouts.
Made MLB debut April 27, 2016 vs. Cleveland.
Named Twins' second-best prospect entering 2016, as well as best curveball, best changeup, and best control in Twins' system by Baseball America.
Named 20th-best prospect in baseball by MLB.com entering 2016.
Started for the World Team in the Sirius XM Futures Games in consecutive seasons, 2014 at Target Field and 2015 at Great American Ball Park in Cincinnati.
Led all of minor league baseball in strikeouts (175) in 2015.
