TWINS TAKE TEXAS IN TEN: The Twins beat the Rangers last night by a score of $7-5$ in 10 innings
in their first game at Globe Life Field...Josese Berríos was the starter but did not factor into in their first game at Globe Life Field....José Berríos was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on six hits in 6.0 innings pitched, for his team-leading fifth quality
start this season...the bullpen combined to allow one run on three hits in 40 innings as Hansel start this season...the bullipen combined to allow one run on three hits in 4.0 innings as hansel of his career...the offense recorded 10 hits, two from both Nelson Cruz and Nick Gordon Luis orriaez hit a tie-breaking triple in the top of the 10th inning, marking the Twins' first triple in Arraez ini a tie-breaking triper in two top oriple in the 11th inning on April 26, 2015 at Seattle.

RETURN OF THE MACK: The Twins have returned outfielder Byron Buxton from his rehab assignment and reinstated him from the 10 -day Injured List...Buxton has missed the last 40 games with a right hip strain, atter going on the injured List on May 7...he played in three games on rehab assignment with Triple-A St. Paul, going 5 -for-9 (. 556 ) with one double one
triple, two home runs, seven RBI, four runs scored and a 2.139 OPS...the AL Player of the Month for April appeared in 24 games for the Twins this season prior to his IL stint, hitting .37 (34-for-92) with 10 doubles. nine home runs, 17 RBl, 19 runs scored, a. 408 on-base and ranked second in both batting average and OPS...Buxton is currently tied for second among all centerfielders with six defensive runs saved, and ranks third on the Twins in doubles, tied
for fourth in home runs seventh in runs scored and tied for seventh in RBI to make room for fourth in home runs, seventh in runs scored and tied for seventh in RBI...to make room

LAST TIME OUT: Dobnak's last appearance came in relief on June 13 vs. Houston, when he worked the (1 HR) with no walks and two strikeouts...allowed five extra-base hits, his most in a relief outing in his career and second most in any outing ( 7 on June 9 vs. NYY)...also marked his 11 th career outing with no walks allowed, fifth this season.

TWO APPEARANCES AGO: Dobnak's most recent starting nod came on June 9 vs. New York-AL at Target Field...faceed the Yankees for the first time in the regular season, after previously starting at Yankee Stadium in the 2019 American League Division Series...shouldered his sixth loss of the season after pitching 4.2 innings and allowing a career-high eight runs on 11 hits (4 HR), with three walks and no strikeouts; the Twins fell 9-6...marked his first career start in which he did not record a strikeout...his seven extra-base hits and four home runs allowed set career highs; became just the third starting pitcher in Twins history to allow at least four home runs and no strikeouts in a start, joining Brad Radke (August 10, 1999 vs. Toronto; 4 HR) and Carlos Silva (August 22, 2006 at Baltimore; 5 HR)...was his second career start allowing at least three extra-base hits, also doing so on June 2 at Baltimore.
RANDY, MEET THE RANGERS: This afternoon marks Dobnak's first career start and appearance against Texas...he's 0-1, 18.56 ERA (5.1 IP, 11 ER) with no walks, six strikeouts and a . 464 opponent batting average in three career relief appearances against the American League West division; all three outings have occurred this season, against Los Angeles-AL (April 16), Oakland (April 21) and
June 13 (Houston).

THE ARSENAL: Dobnak has thrown four pitches throughout his major league career, with his primary weapon of choice being his sinker...below is a breakdown of his 2021 offerings.

WELL GROUNDED: Dobnak's primary pitch is his sinker, which is the ideal tool for inducing groundball contact...since the start of 2019, Dobnak ranks among the major league leaders (min. 400 BF ) in ground ball/fly ball ratio (5th, 3.17 ), ground ball percentage ( 9 th, 57.2 ) and double plays-per-9.0 IP (6th, 1.35).

UNBALANCED LEVERAGE: Last season, Dobnak held opposing hitters to a 205 ( 9 -for-44) batting average with three doubles and 13 RBI with runners in scoring position, and held an equally-impressive
mark of . 143 (3-for-21) with two doubles and three RBI with runners in scoring position and two outs...by contrast, he's struggled in high-leverage situations this season, with opponents batting .405 (15-for-37) against him with RISP and . 357 (5-for-14) with RISP and two outs.

START ME UP: Dobnak enters today's game 9-8, 4.28 ERA ( 88.1 IP, 42 ER) in 19 career major
league starts...was 7-2, 1.81 (49.2 IP, 10 ER) in his first 11 starts (through August 22, 2020), but is just 2-6, 7.45 ERA ( 38.2 IP, 32 ER) in his eight starts since.
\$ Has an opponent slash line of .273/.338/.390 as a starter, with opposing batters going 94 -for-344 with 16 doubles and eight home runs...has issued 26 walks, while striking out 54 .
$\Phi$ Between September 3, 2019 (his first major league start, as an opener) and the end of the 2020 season, Dobnak's . 336 opponent slugging percentage in 16 outings (one relief appearance) ranked second in the American League (min. 15 starts), behind only Cleveland's Shane Bieber (.326).
SEASON SUMMARY: Dobnak began the season with Minnesota and was named to his second career Opening Day roster in 2021 (both with Minnesota)....he was optioned on May 3 (Brandon Waddell recalled) following a rough start to his campaign ( $0-3,8.16$ ERA, 1 save in 7 relief appearances), and to get stretched out for potential starting opportunities at the major league level....is making his fifth start of the season this afternoon, all coming within his last six outings; his relief appearance on June 13 vs. Houston snapped a streak of four consecutive starts... see the note below for how his tenure went with Triple-A St. Paul.

SAINTLY STARTS: Dobnak made three starts in May for Triple-A St. Paul, going 0-1, 3.38 ERA (13.1 IP, 5 ER), six walks, 11 strikeouts and a . 213 opponent batting average ( 10 -for-47)...nine of the 10 hits he allowed were singles....his pitch count slowly climbed, from 59 in his first outing May 6, to 81 in his second and topping out at 87 in his final Triple-A start on May 16, prior to his recall on May 21. .
