BUCK ON THE BALLOT: Finalists for the 2021 Google MLB All-Star Ballot were announced Sunday afternoon...the second phase of voting, which began yesterday, features the top three vote-getters at each position (and the top 9 outfielders) in each league based on vote totals from Phase 1, which ran from June 3-24...the Twins are represented by Byron Buxton who sits in third place among AL outfielders with 1,065,227 votes, trailing Mike Trout (2,084,542) and Aaron Judge (1,569,640)...Buck is currently on the 10-day Injured List with a left hand fracture, an injury he suffered after getting hit by a pitch on June 22 vs. Cincinnati...Buxton is hitting. 369 ( 38 -for-103) with 11 doubles, 10 home runs, a .767 slugging percentage and a 1.176 OPS in 27 games this season.
THE STATE OF HOCKEY: Target Field will host to the 2022 NHL Winter Classic® featuring the Minnesota Wild and St. Louis Blues on January 1, 2022, the NHL announced yesterday. originally scheduled for January 1, 2021, the event was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic...the New Year's Day matchup will be the Wild's first NHL Winter Classic and second NHL regular season outdoor game, with their previous such matchup coming in the 2016 Coors Light NHL Stadium Series, a 6-1 victory over the Chicago Blackhawks at TCF Bank Stadium in Minneapolis on February 21, 2016.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: Harmon Killebrew was born on this date in 1938 in Payette, Idaho... Killebrew signed with the Senators at age 17 and made his MLB debut on June 23, 1954 and would finish his career with 2,086 hits, 573 home runs and 1,584 RBI...he was a 13 -time All-Star, the AL MVP
in 1969, a six-time home run champion and three-time RBI champ...Killebrew passed away in 2011 .

LAST TIME OUT: Maeda earned his third win of the season and first since May 3 in his last start on June 20 at Texas...worked 5.1 innings of five-hit, two-run ball, walking one while striking out four batters as the Twins beat the Rangers 4-2...pitched 5.0 shutout innings before allowing a pair of one-out solo shots to Adolis García and Joey Gallo in the sixth and departing in favor of Tyler Duffey... the Twins' bullpen tossed 3.2 scoreless innings in relief to close out the win

START PRIOR: Returned from rehab and was reinstated from the 10-day Injured List to start on June 14 against the Mariners in Seattle...facing the Mariners for the first time in his professional career, he held Seattle to one run on three hits in 4.0 innings, with a season-high three walks and seven strikeouts - his second-highest single-start total this season...maneuvered out of a jam in the opening frame after walking the bases loaded with one out; induced a popout by Dylan Moore before striking out Jake Bauers to end the inning.
SOUTH SIDE SUCCESS: Maeda is facing the White Sox for the second time this season tonight... previously took a no-decision on May 11 at Guaranteed Rate Field, maneuvering around a one-out single to complete a scoreless first before running into trouble in the second...allowed a leadoff single to José Abreu and walked Yermín Mercedes in the second before permitting a three-run homer to Yasmani Grandal, his seventh longball in a four-start span from April 21-May 11...retired the final nine batters he faced from the third through fifth innings and departed with the game tied 3-3; the Twins' bullpen allowed six runs over the final three innings.
\$ Maeda is 2-0, 3.60 ERA (20.0 IP, 8 ER) with four walks, 20 strikeouts and a .243 opponent batting average (18-for-74) in four career starts against the White Sox...all four of his starts have occurred at Guaranteed Rate Field...the White Sox are one of two teams (also Atlanta) that Maeda has at least two wins and zero losses against in his career.

CENTRAL-FUGAL FORCE: Maeda is 1-1, 4.98 ERA (121.2 IP, 12 ER), four walks, 18 strikeouts and a 259 (21-for-81) opponent batting average in four starts against the AL Central so far this season... ERA (88.2 IP 33 ER) in 16 career starts vs the division, marking his second-best career ERA against any single division (NL East - 3.11 ERA).

MILESTONE MAN: Maeda surpassed two career milestones in his start against the Mariners in Seattle on June 14...at the end of his second inning of work he reached 700 career MLB innings, becoming the 10th Japanese-born pitcher to hit that plateau in the majors...the others are: Hideo Nomo (1,976.1 IP), Hiroki Kuroda (1,319.0 IP), Yu Darvish (1,223.0 IP), Tomo Ohka (1,070.0 IP), Masahiro Tanaka 1,054.1 IP), Hisashi Iwakuma (883.2 IP), Daisuke Matsuzaka (790.1 IP), Masato Yoshiil (757.1 IP) and Shigetoshi Hasegawa (720.1 14 was the 2,000th of his career...he now has 2,004 strikeouts combined between Nippon Professional Baseball $(1,233)$ and Major League Baseball $(771)$.

2021 ARSENAL: Maeda's slider has surpassed his four-seam fastball as his most-used pitch over the last several seasons...he threw them equally in his rookie 2016 campaign and his four-seamer was his most frequent offering from 2017-19...however, his slider has been his top pitch since the start of 2020, followed by his split finger...here's a breakdown of his 2021 offerings and the results

OPPOSING COUNTS: Opponents are hitting . 400 ( $10-$ for-25) off Maeda's first offering of an at-bat... his opponent batting average on the first pitch is tied for 17th highest among American League pitchers (min. 25 opp. at-bats).
© Opponents are batting . 231 (25-for-108) off Maeda with two strikes, far above the 087 (13-for-150) mark he held them to in 2020 and his career mark of . 149 (228-for-1535)...the league average mark this season with two strikes is .161.
क When the count goes full, Maeda is holding opposing hitters to just 3 -for-24 (.125), the 12thlowest mark among American League pitchers (min. 20 opp. at-bats)...however, of the pitchers ranked above him in batting average in those circumstances, only one has issued fewer full-count walks than Maeda's 11 - teammate José Berríos (. 059 BAA, 10 BB).

SETTLING IN: Maeda finished April with a 6.56 ERA, his second-highest single-month ERA in his career behind his 6.58 mark in April 2017....he tends to heat up with the weather, owning a 3.68 career ERA in May and 2.81 mark in June...his 2.83 ERA in June is his lowest in a single calendar month in his career; is $7-6$ with 40 walks, 121 strikeouts and a 205 opponent batting average ( 86 -for- 419 ) in 22 career games ( 20 starts) in summer's first month...here are his numbers by month in his career (full months only, excluding March and October)
