THE TWINS: Completed their seven-game roadtrip with a record of 3-4, going 1-2 against Baltimore and 2-2 against Kansas City...today they will begin a six-game homestand with three against the Yankees from tonight through Thursday and three against the Astros over the weekend...the Twins have gone 12-17 at home this season and 12-18 on the road.

TWINS FINISH TRIP WITH A WIN: The Twins beat the Royals on Sunday afternoon by a score of 2-1, coming back to split the four-game series in Kansas City with two-straight wins...Bailey Ober was the starter but did not factor into the decision in his second career outing, allowing one run on five hits in 4.0 innings pitched...the bullpen combined to pitch 5.0 scoreless innings with one hit allowed, one walk and seven strikeouts...the offense recorded 10 hits, just one going for extra-bases, a Miguel Sanó RBI-double...the Twins turned a triple play in the third inning, the 15th in Minnesota history (since 1961).

TWINS AND YANKEES: The Twins and Yankees are playing the first of seven scheduled meetings in 2021...these two teams last met in the 2019 ALDS from October 4-7, as the Twins were swept in three games...these two clubs last met in the regular season in 2019, as the Twins went 2-4, going 1-2 at home and 1-2 at Yankee Stadium...Twins have gone just 4-12 in their last 16 vs. New York and 8-23 in their last 31.

☞ Twins are 8-27-2 in series play vs. the Yankees dating back to 2002.
☞ Miguel Sanó has 16 career hits vs. the Yankees, 10 going for extra-bases (2 doubles, 8 home runs)...he also has 18 RBI and a 1.046 OPS in those 16 career games...his 1.046 OPS is the third highest among actives with a minimum of 50 plate appearances, trailing Mike Trout (1.067) and José Ramírez (1.058).

☞ Tonight's starter, Michael Pineda, pitched four seasons for the Yankees from 2014-17, going 31-31, 4.16 ERA (509.0 IP, 235 ER) with one complete game, 102 walks and 514 strikeouts...he was acquired by the Yankees from Seattle via trade on January 23, 2012, along with right-handed pitcher Vicente Campos, in exchange for catcher Jesús Montero and right-handed pitcher Hector Noesi.

☞ Rob Refsnyder was originally selected by the Yankees in the fifth round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...he played three seasons with New York from 2015-17, hitting .241 (56-for-232) with 13 doubles, two home runs and 17 RBI in 94 games.

THROWBACKS - "EVERYTHING'S GREAT SINCE JUNE 8": On this day in 2006 the Twins beat the Mariners in Seattle by a score of 7-3...at the time, the Twins were 25-33 and in fourth place, 11.5 games back in the AL Central...that particular win sparked a stretch of 21 wins in their next 23 games and the Twins would go 71-33 the rest of the way, winning the division with a record of 96-66...below are the standings on the morning of June 8 (left) and final standings (right):

ADDITIONALLY: Justin Morneau won the AL MVP that season, finishing with 320 voting points, ahead of Derek Jeter's 306 votes...Morneau hit .362 (145-for-401) with 29 doubles, 23 home runs, 92 RBI and a 1.023 OPS from June 8 through the end of that season...Joe Mauer won his first of three batting titles with a .347 batting average, just ahead of Derek Jeter (.343) and Robinson Canó (.342).

SANÓ IN THE AIR: Miguel Sanó has homered two times in his last three games and nine times in 23 games since May 15...since that date, his nine homers are tied with Vladimir Guerrero Jr. for second most in baseball, trailing Jesse Winker (10)...he has 142 career home runs, one behind Joe Mauer for 11th on the Twins all-time list (since 1961):

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins have reinstated outfielder Rob Refsnyder from the 7-day Injured List...Refsnyder, who suffered a concussion after colliding with the centerfield wall on May 31 in Baltimore, has hit .320 (16-for-50) with three doubles, two home runs, nine RBI, 10 runs scored, four walks and an .864 OPS in 16 games this season, while the Twins were 9-5 with him in the starting lineup...to make room on the 26-man roster, the Twins have optioned outfielder Gilberto Celestino to Triple-A St. Paul...the 22-year-old outfielder was recalled on June 2, made his major league debut that night in Baltimore and played in four games, going 0-for-12 with four strikeouts.
☞ Additionally, right-handed pitcher Juan Minaya has cleared waivers and accepted his assignment to Triple-A St. Paul.

HEAVY HITTERS: The Twins went homerless on Sunday afternoon in Kansas City, snapping their home run streak at 16-straight games, which tied a Twins/Senators franchise high...they have homered in 15-straight home games, their longest streak since homering in 15 straight at Target Field from July 16-August 7, 2019...the last time they homered in at least 16 straight at home came May 1-June 16, 2019, when they homered in 20 straight...they have 83 homers on the season, the fourth most in baseball, trailing Atlanta (86), San Francisco (85) and Toronto (84).

SOUTHPAW STUFF: The Twins are facing a left-handed starter for the 21st time this season, going 7-13 in their previous 20 when a lefty starts...they faced 16 (9-7) lefties all of 2020 and 39 (22-17) in 2019...they are hitting .247 (160-for-648) with a .443 slugging percentage and a .749 OPS vs. lefties this season, compared to .239 (318-for-1333) with a .416 slugging and a .737 OPS against righties.
☞ Twins rank fourth in the AL in slugging percentage vs lefties and fifth in OPS.
☞ Kyle Garlick has hit .291 (16-for-55) with six doubles, four home runs, six RBI and a .940 OPS against left-handed pitching this season.
☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .394 (41-for-104) with five doubles, nine home runs, 17 RBI and a 1.163 OPS against lefties since the start of 2020.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2013, Joe Mauer hit his 100th career home run at Washington, a fifth inning solo shot off Gio González...19 players in Twins history have hit 100 home runs as a Twin.

TAKE A DAY: Pineda was pushed back to tonight from his scheduled start Sunday in Kansas City, after experiencing right forearm soreness following his last start June 1 in Baltimore (more below)...threw a bullpen session Sunday at Kauffman Stadium and was cleared for tonight's start.

LAST START: Pineda took the mound June 1 in Baltimore and struggled through his shortest start as a Twin, taking the 7-4 loss after allowing five runs (all earned) on seven hits in just 3.0 innings...matched the second-briefest outing in his career and was his shortest since also pitching just 3.0 innings on July 5, 2017 vs. Toronto (with New York-AL), his final start before landing on the Injured List with a right UCL injury that eventually resulted in Tommy John surgery.

- ☞ Allowed a run on two Orioles hits in the first inning, retired the side in order in the second, but was touched for four runs on five hits (4 singles and a double) in the third.
- ☞ After compiling 15 strikeouts in 11.1 innings over his previous two starts, had just one vs. the O's...was his eighth career start with one-or-fewer strikeouts.
- ☞ His season ERA rose 0.78 points, from 2.62 entering the start to its current 3.40 mark.

TWO STARTS AGO: Pineda was activated from the 10-day Injured List on May 26 (out since May 16 due to an abscess) and started that afternoon at Target Field vs. Baltimore Orioles, earning the win as the Twins completed a three-game sweep with a 3-2 victory...worked 6.0 outstanding innings, allowing just three hits (all in the first inning) and one run (on a Trey Mancini solo home run), with two walks and a season-high eight strikeouts.

- ☞ Allowed hits to three of his first four batters faced (including Mancini's two-out, solo homer), then retired 16 of his final 18 batters faced over 5.1 innings of no-hit, shutout ball...after Chance Sisco and Cedric Mullins walked to start the third, Pineda set down 12-straight O's to end his outing.
- ☞ Finished with a season-high 101 pitches, retiring 16 of his final 18 batters faced, including 12-straight O's to end his outing.

900-900 CLUB: With his lone strikeout June 1 in Baltimore (got Stevie Wilkerson swinging to end the second inning) and his second-to-last out recorded in that outing, "Big Mike" became one of 50 active pitchers with at least 900.0 career innings pitched (now 900.1) and 900 strikeouts...Pineda is the 27th Dominican-born pitcher in major league history to reach both of those marks.

MINNESOTA MIKE: Big Mike has made 40 starts in a Minnesota uniform, going 16-8, 3.80 ERA (220.1 IP, 93 ER)...the Twins are 25-15 when he toes the rubber.

- ☞ Pineda's 16 wins in his first 40 games with Minnesota are tied for 11th most in Twins annals...matched eight others for 11th, including Hall-of-Famer Bert Blyleven.
- ☞ He has a 4.53 strikeout-to-walk ratio since 2019, along with a 1.14 WHIP...those stats, along with his ERA, are all better than his career numbers (4.41, 1.18 and 3.99).
- ☞ His 4.1 WAR (per Fangraphs) since 2019 is 17th among AL starters (min 200.0 IP).

BIG MIKE, BIG PERFORMANCES: Pineda's ERA as a Twin stood at 5.02 (80.2 IP, 45 ER) through his first 15 starts of the 2019 season (his first campaign back in the majors following Tommy John surgery)...beginning **June 29, 2019, Big Mike is 12-4, 3.09 ERA (139.2 IP, 48 ER), 33 walks, 146 strikeouts and a .230/.277/.379 opponent slash line over his last 24 starts** (Minnesota is 16-8 in those games).

PINSTRIPED HISTORY: Pineda will make his third career start against New York-AL tonight, having gone 0-1, 5.40 ERA (10.0 IP, 6 ER) in his previous two outings – one of which came before his six-season stay in the Yankees organization, and one of which came with the Twins...following his stellar 2011 rookie season with Seattle, Big Mike was acquired by the Yankees on January 23, 2012, along with right-handed pitcher Vicente Campos, in exchange for catcher Jesús Montero and right-handed pitcher Hector Noesi...made 89 starts for New York between 2014-17, going 31-31, 4.16 ERA (509.0 IP, 235 ER)...missed all of the 2012 and 2013 seasons, most of the 2014 campaign and the latter half of 2017 due to injury.

- ☞ His first start against the Bronx Bombers came on May 27, 2011 during his rookie season with Seattle, a no-decision in an eventual 4-3 Mariners home win (5.0 IP, 3 H, 3 R/ER, 5 BB, 5 K).
- ☞ Big Mike's second start came in his return to Yankee Stadium on May 5, 2019, as he took the loss in New York's 4-1 victory over Minnesota (5.0 IP, 6 H, 4 R, 3 ER, 3 BB, 8 K).

HOME COOKING: Pineda will make his seventh home start of the season in this evening's game...is 2-1, 2.62 ERA (34.1 IP, 10 ER) and a 0.90 WHIP over his first five Target Field outings of 2021.

- ☞ Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in five of his six home efforts this season, logging four starts...opponents are slashing just .194/.237/.395 off Big Mike at Target Field in 2021, going 24-for-124 with four doubles, seven home runs, seven walks and 35 strikeouts.
- ☞ Is 6-4, 3.57 ERA (128.2 IP, 51 ER) in 23 career home starts with the Twins, including 5-2, 2.85 (98.0 IP, 31 ER) in his last 17 efforts.

FOR IT'S ONE, TWO STRIKES YOU'RE (MOST LIKELY) OUT: In an about-face from Pineda's previous eight starts, in his last outing Baltimore batters went 4-for-6 off him with two strikes...prior to that outing, he had been putting hitters away with above-league average efficiency.

- ☞ For the season, opponents are 17-for-95 (.179) with a .542 OPS and a 45.7 percent strikeout rate off Pineda...for comparison, American League hitters as an aggregate in 2021 are batting .166 with a .508 OPS and a 44.3 percent strikeout rate in two-strike counts.

CLEANING UP: Pineda has mostly silenced opposing cleanup hitters this season, allowing just three hits in 23 at-bats (.130) with one walk and eight strikeouts...has yielded one double and one home run to number-four batters, for a .304 slugging percentage (second-lowest against Big Mike among the nine lineup spots, behind only the .200 to #5 hitters) and a .471 OPS (lowest in the order).

FLYING SOLO: Pineda has not allowed a home run with a runner on base since the White Sox' José Abreu got him for a third-inning, two-run homer on August 20, 2019 at Target Field, a span of 12-straight solo roundtrippers...of the 32 home runs he has allowed with the Twins, 25 have been solo.

- ☞ Big Mike has yielded nine homers (all solo) in 47.2 innings pitched this season, after not surrendering a single longball in his 26.2 innings in 2020...extrapolated over a full season, his 1.70 HR/9.0 rate and 4.69 home run percentage would both be the second highest of his career.

CAREER NOTES

- Missed last 21 games of 2019, the entire ALDS and the first 36 contests of 2020 due to a 60-game suspension for violating MLB's Joint Drug and Prevention Treatment Program.
- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from Tommy John surgery on right elbow...also missed the entire 2012 campaign with New York-AL recovering from right shoulder surgery, and was out of the majors in 2013 while rehabbing.
- Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of .198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
