**THE TWINS:** After completing their seven-game roadtrip with a record of 3-4 (1-2 against Baltimore and 2-2 against Kansas City), the Twins began their six-game homestand with a loss to the Yankees last night...tonight they will play the second of three with New York and conclude the series tomorrow night...they will wrap the homestand with three against the Astros over the weekend...the Twins have gone 12-18 at home this season and 12-18 on the road.

**TWINS LOSE LATE TO YANKEES:** The Twins lost to the Yankees last night at Target Field by a score of 4-8...Michael Pineda was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing two runs on four hits in 4.1 innings pitched, exiting after 76 pitches and a 2-1 lead...the offense recorded 10 hits, went 2-for-9 with runners in scoring position and left six men on base...Ryan Jeffers, Trevor Larnach and Rob Refsnyder each had two hits apiece, as Jeffers and Refsnyder had the club's only two extra-base hits, both doubles.

**THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT:** Last night Griffin Jax became the sixth player to debut for the Twins this season, joining Gilberto Celestino, Nick Gordon, Trevor Larnach, Bailey Ober and Ben Rortved...it is tied with Cleveland and Seattle for the fourth-most players to debut for one team in the majors, trailing only Miami (8), Baltimore (7) and Houston (7).

**TWINS AND YANKEES:** The Twins and Yankees are playing the second of seven scheduled meetings in 2021...Twins are looking to snap a six-game losing streak to the Yankees that spans both regular and postseason games since July 23, 2019...in regular season games only, the Twins have gone just 4-13 in their last 17 vs. New York and 8-24 in their last 32.

- ☞ Twins are 8-27-2 in series play vs. the Yankees dating back to 2002.
- ☞ Miguel Sanó has 17 career hits vs. the Yankees, 10 going for extra-bases (2 doubles, 8 home runs)...he also has 18 RBI and a 1.013 OPS in those 17 career games...his 1.013 OPS is the third highest among active players with a minimum of 50 plate appearances, trailing Mike Trout (1.067), José Ramírez (1.058) and Danny Jansen (1.021).
- ☞ Nelson Cruz has homered in six of his last nine regular and postseason games vs. NYY.
- ☞ Randy Dobnak's sixth career start (regular or postseason) came against the Yankees in the Bronx in Game 2 of the 2019 ALDS...he allowed four runs on six hits in 2.0 innings pitched...the Yankees scored in the first inning on an Edwin Encarnación RBI-single a couple batters after a DJ LeMahieu leadoff double...Dobnak exited in the third inning with nobody out and the bases loaded, giving way to Tyler Duffey...Duffey eventually allowed a grand slam to Didi Gregorius, capping off a seven-run third inning for New York...final score was 8-2.
- ☞ Lifetime vs. Gerrit Cole: Andrelton Simmons is 7-for-20 (.350) with a triple and a walk... Nelson Cruz is 3-for-14 (.214) with three doubles and two RBI...Josh Donaldson is 0-for-6 with three strikeouts.

**OVER THE RIVER:** Byron Buxton began his rehab assignment and started at designated hitter last night for Triple-A St. Paul against Omaha at CHS Field...Buck went 2-for-3 with a single, a triple and a walk...Buxton was placed on the 10-day Injured List on May 7 with a right hip strain and has missed the Twins' last 30 games...Kenta Maeda makes his first rehab start for the Saints tonight with first pitch at 7:05 pm (CT)...Maeda was placed on the 10-day Injured List on May 23 with a right adductor strain, missing 15 games thus far.

**ROSTER MOVE:** The Twins have placed outfielder Kyle Garlick on the 10-day Injured List with a sports hernia...Garlick has played in 36 games this season, hitting .232 (23-for-99) with eight doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI, 17 runs scored, six walks and a .745 OPS...to replace Garlick on the 26-man roster, the Twins have recalled outfielder Gilberto Celestino from Triple-A St. Paul...the 22-year-old made his major league debut on June 2 in Baltimore.

☞ Additionally, right-handed pitcher Cody Stashak was placed on the major league 10-day Injured List (retroactive to May 29) with a left back disc injury.

**HEAVY HITTERS:** The Twins have hit 83 homers on the season, the fourth most in baseball, trailing Atlanta (89), San Francisco (88) and Toronto (84)...in fact, since April 21, they have 69 homers which is the most in baseball.

- ☞ Since the start of the 2019 season, the Twins lead baseball with 481 home runs, ahead of the second-place Yankees, who have hit 471.
- ☞ Miguel Sanó has hit nine home runs in 24 games since May 15, tied with Vladimir Guerrero Jr. for second most in baseball since that date, trailing only Jesse Winker (10).

**RAIN IS COMING:** Josh Donaldson has reached base safely in 14 of his last 16 games, dating back to game two of the Angels doubleheader on May 20...in that span, he has reached base 25 times in 74 plate appearances (14 hits and 11 walks) for an on-base percentage of .351.

**ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY:** In 1966, the Twins recorded the first five-home run inning in AL history against the Kansas City Athletics...Rich Rollins, Zoilo Versalles, Tony Oliva, Don Mincher and Harmon Killebrew all connected in the seventh inning to give the Twins a 9-4 victory.

**MLB DRAFT COMBINE:** Major League Baseball and USA Baseball today announced details for the inaugural MLB Draft Combine presented by Gatorade, taking place June 21-28 at the USA Baseball National Training Complex in Cary, North Carolina and the Raleigh Convention Center in Raleigh, North Carolina...the Combine will feature more than 100 of the top high school and college baseball prospects, as identified by USA Baseball and MLB Clubs, as well as a decorated group of former Major League players and coaches, and various general managers, scouting directors and other Club personnel...among those scheduled to attend is the Twins' own Torii Hunter.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Dobnak was saddled with his second-straight loss in his last start on June 2 in Baltimore...allowed just three runs on eight hits (1 HR), with two walks and three strikeouts in 5.2 innings of work...maneuvered his way out of a bases-loaded jam in the first, inducing a double play and an inning-ending flyout after allowing the first three batters he faced to reach on a single, walk and hit-by-pitch...yielded one run on an error in the fourth and pair on a DJ Stewart two-run blast in the fifth...threw 77 pitches and 55 strikes, good for a 71.4 strike percent, the second-highest mark he's posted in a start in his career (75.6%; September 25, 2019 at Detroit)...has allowed at least eight hits in back-to-back starts for the second time in his career, also doing so August 22-29, 2020 (8 hits, 12 hits).

**TWO STARTS AGO:** Dobnak shouldered the loss on May 28 vs. Kansas City, as the Twins fell to the Royals 8-3 at Target Field...sailed through the first 4.2 innings, allowing only a pair of singles, before yielding three runs with two outs in the fifth and the first three batters to reach base in the seventh before departing in favor of Cody Stashak (all 3 inherited runners later scored)...matched his career high with six runs allowed, and paired with his start on May 21, worked at least 6.0 innings in back-to-back starts for the first time in his career.

**THE ARSENAL:** Dobnak has thrown four pitches throughout his major league career, with his primary weapon of choice being his sinker...below is a breakdown of his 2021 offerings.

**WELL GROUNDED:** Dobnak's primary pitch is his sinker, which is the ideal tool for inducing ground-ball contact...since the start of 2019, Dobnak ranks among the major league leaders (min. 400 BF) in ground ball/fly ball ratio (3rd, 3.29), ground ball percentage (5th, 58.3) and double plays-per-9.0 IP (5th, 1.35).

**AGAINST THE YANKEES:** Tonight represents Dobnak's first career regular season start and appearance against New York-AL...faced the Yankees in the 2019 Postseason, starting Game 2 of the American League Division Series on October 5, 2019 at Yankee Stadium...allowed four runs on six hits in just 2.0 innings pitched as the Twins fell, 8-2...he became the fourth rookie pitcher in Twins history (6th occurrence) to start a Postseason game, as well as the 18th to ever pitch in one; prior to Dobnak, the last Twins rookie to start in the Postseason was Brian Duensing in 2009 in Game 1 of the ALDS at New York-AL...that start marks Dobnak's only career Postseason outing, as he was on the roster for the 2020 Wild Card Series against the Houston Astros but did not appear.

As Dobnak warmed up in the outfield prior to his 2019 ALDS start at Yankee Stadium, the crowd chanted "UBER DRIVER" at him, due to his well-publicized high rating as an Uber driver while working his way up the baseball ladder...he seemed to think it was funny and visibly smiled while completing his pregame tosses.

**AGAINST THE EAST:** Tonight marks Dobnak's second-straight start against the AL East, after entering this season with just one career outing against the division...he's 0-2, 3.72 ERA (9.2 IP, 4 ER) with four walks, five strikeouts and a 1.45 WHIP in three games (2 starts) against the AL East in his career...two of those three outings have occurred this season – his last start at Baltimore and a relief appearance on April 13 vs. Boston, in which he took the loss after allowing a go-ahead RBI double to Bobby Dalbec in the top of the eighth inning of an eventual 4-2 Twins defeat.

**START ME UP:** Dobnak enters tonight's game 9-7, 3.66 ERA (83.2 IP, 34 ER) in 18 career major league starts...was 7-2, 1.81 (49.2 IP, 10 ER) in his first 11 starts (through August 22, 2020), but is just 2-5, 6.35 ERA (34.0 IP, 24 ER) in his seven starts since.

Has an opponent slash line of .259/.323/.336 as a starter, with opposing batters going 83-for-321 with 13 doubles and just four home runs...has issued 23 walks, while striking out 54.

Between September 3, 2019 (his first major league start, as an opener) and the end of the 2020 season, Dobnak's .336 opponent slugging percentage in 16 outings (one relief appearance) ranked second in the American League (min. 15 starts), behind only Cleveland's Shane Bieber (.326).

**SEASON SUMMARY:** Dobnak began the season with Minnesota and was named to his second career Opening Day roster in 2021 (both with Minnesota)...he was optioned on May 3 (Brandon Waddell recalled) following a rough start to his campaign (0-3, 8.16 ERA, 1 save in 7 relief appearances), and to get stretched out for potential starting opportunities at the major league level...is making his fourth start of the season tonight, all coming consecutively in his last four outings...see the note below for how his tenure went with Triple-A St. Paul.

**SAINTLY STARTS:** Dobnak made three starts in May for Triple-A St. Paul, going 0-1, 3.38 ERA (13.1 IP, 5 ER), six walks, 11 strikeouts and a .213 opponent batting average (10-for-47)...nine of the 10 hits he allowed were singles...his pitch count slowly climbed, from 59 in his first outing May 6, to 81 in his second and topping out at 87 in his final Triple-A start on May 16, prior to his recall on May 21.

His first and third starts with the Saints were scoreless – a 4.0-inning, two-hit effort May 6 at Omaha (0 BB, 5 K) and a 5.0-inning, four-hit outing May 16 vs. Iowa (1 BB, 5 K)...sandwiched in between was a tough start May 11 vs. the I-Cubs in which he tied a career high at any level by issuing five walks in just 4.1 innings (4 H, 5 R/ER, 1 K).

**TOMORROW'S STARTER – LHP J.A. HAPP (2021 SEASON: 3-2, 5.61 ERA // CAREER: 126-94, 4.03 ERA)**

Veteran southpaw Happ is due to toe the rubber tomorrow night in the series finale against New York-AL, the second former Yankee hurler to pitch for the Twins in this series...did not play a role in the decision in his last start on June 3 at Kansas City, after permitting five runs on nine hits (3 HR), with no walks and two strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work...the Twins tied the game in the seventh but the Royals regained the lead in the bottom of the frame and Minnesota fell, 6-5...Happ matched his career high by allowing three homers, doing so for the first time since August 9, 2019 at Toronto...the 38-year-old pitched for New York-AL from 2018-20 and is 8-4, 3.96 ERA (104.2 IP, 46 ER) in 18 career starts against the Yankees.
