TWINS LOSE SLUGFEST ON SOUTH SIDE: The Twins lost to the White Sox last night by a score of 13-3...Bailey Ober (0-1) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on four hits in 3.1 innings pitched...the pitching staff allowed a season-high six home runs...the offense recorded five hits, two from Nelson Cruz who doubled (11) and homered (18)....Josh Donaldson also homered, marking his 13th of the season.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have selected the contract of right-handed pitcher Derek Law from Triple-A St. Paul...Law will be making his second stint with the Twins this season, after previously appearing in five games from May 8-17 and allowing six earned runs in 6.1 innings, with nine strikeouts in those outings...the 30 -year-old has also posted a 4.61 ERA ( $13.2 \mathrm{IP}, 7 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with four walks and 12 strikeouts in 11 relief appearances for Triple-A St. Paul this season...to make room for Law on the 26 -man roster, the Twins have designated right-handed pitcher Matt Shoemaker for release or assignment...Shoemaker appeared in 16 games ( 11 starts) for the Twins, going 3-8 with an 8.06 ERA (60.1 IP, 54 ER ), 27 walks and 40 strikeouts.

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and White Sox are playing the ninth of 19 meetings this season... Twins are 1-7 against the Sox this season...these two teams will meet next for a three-game series at Target Field next week from July 5-7.

क Nelson Cruz is hitting .397 ( 50 -for-126) with 11 doubles, 14 home runs, 38 RBI, 18 walks, a . 472 OBP, an . 817 slugging percentage and a 1.290 OPS in 34 games vs. the Sox while in a Minnesota uniform (since 2019)...at Guaranteed Rate Field in that span, he is hitting . 412 ( 35 -for-85) with 12 home runs, 32 RBI and a 1.391 OPS in 22 games.

THE BRINGER OF RAIN: Josh Donaldson is hitting . 293 (34-for-116), with six doubles, nine home runs and 26 RBI in 32 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field....he is a career . 309 (292-for-945) hitter with 60 doubles, four triples, 74 home runs and 211 RBI in 259 games vs. the AL Central; his 74 homers vs. the division are tied for eighth among actives.

LAST START: Did not factor into the decision a week ago vs. Cleveland despite pitching 6.1 innings of one-run, four-hit ball, with two walks and nine strikeouts...the only run he allowed came on a two-strike, two-out single off the bat of Austin Hedges in the second inning...retired 13 of the final 15 men he taced, departing in favor of Caleb Thielbar with one out in the seventh and the game tied 1-1...Twins bull pen surrendered three runs in the eighth and the indians won, 4-1... City recorded his team-leading sixth quality start and third consecutive his longest stretch City...recorded his team-leading sixth quality start and third consecutive, his longest stretch

START PRIOR: Did not factor into the decision May 18 at Texas, despite notching his teamleading fifth quality start....worked 6.0 innings, allowing three runs on six hits, with one walk and six strikeouts...surrendered two runs in the first inning on consecutive RBI singles by Nick Solak and Willie Calhoun...allowed his third run on a Jose Trevino sacrifice fly in the fourth inning, scoring Eli White...retired the final seven men he faced and exited with a 4-3 lead; the Rangers tied the game in the seventh but the Twins won 7-5 in 10 innings....marked Berríos' 25th-consecutive start allowing four earned runs-or-fewer, dating back to July 30,2020 , the longest such streak for a Twins pitcher since Johan Santana recorded 35 -straight starts of four earned runs-or-fewer from July 15, 2006-July 18, 2007

GOING STREAKING: Despite not factoring into the decision in his last two starts, Berríos remains on a five-game winning streak, matching the longest of his career, previously done
$\stackrel{\text { April Is }}{\Phi} 5-0,3.57$ ERA ( 63.0 IP, 25 ER) with 15 walks and 63 strikeouts in 10 starts since May 2...has completed at least 5.0 innings in all 10 of those games, including five quality starts (Twins are 8-2).
क Twins hitters have supported Berríos with 39 runs during that stretch ( 5.57 run support average), tied for the eighth-highest total among all American League starters in that span His last losing decision came in the second game of the doubleheader at Oakland on Aprii innings in a 1-0 A's victory.

700 CLUB: This season, Berríos has surpassed both 700 strikeouts and 700.0 innings pitched for his career...his 700th strikeout came in the fifth inning on May 15 vs. Oakland, fanning Seth Brown...became the 15th Twin to reach 700 strikeouts and the 28th Twin to reach 700.0 innings pitched.

GUARANTEED WINNER: Berríos is making his 18th career start against the White Sox today, breaking a tie with Kansas City for his most starts vs. any opponent....owns a career 12-2, 2.65 ERA (108.2 IP, 32 ER) with 111 strikeouts and a .223 opponent batting average.
$\Phi 12$ wins and 111 strikeouts are his most against any opponent, with his 12 wins marking his only double-digit win total against one team...his 4.44 strikeout-to-walk ratio ( 111 K , 25 BB ) vs. Chicago-AL is his third-best mark vs. any opponent he's faced at least four times in his career (Seattle - 5.86, Baltimore - 5.44 ).
I Is 4-2, 4.09 ERA (50.2 IP, 23 ER) with 15 walks and 42 strikeouts in nine career starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, last pitching here on September 14, 2020 (ND, 5.0 IP, 6 H, 1 ER, 1 BB, 2 K ).

SLICK LEATHER: He has four defensive runs saved this season, good for third best in baseball among all pitchers, trailing only Chicago-AL's Dallas Keuchel (6) and New York-NL's Taijuan Walker (5)...Berríos finished tied for fitth in baseball among pitchers in DRS in 2020 with one...since 2019, he ranks tied for ninth in DRS with five...his three pickoffs this season are tied for tops in the AL and tied for third most in the majors.
RIGHTY TIGHTY: Berríos is holding right-handed hitters to a 175 (31-for-177) average with five doubles, three home runs, eight walks and 51 strikeouts, compared to lefties hitting .279 ( 43 -for-154) with 12 doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 15 walks and 45 strikeouts against him...his right-handed opponent batting average ranks second in the AL (min. 175 opp . AB), behind only this afternoon's opposing starter, Chicago-AL's Carlos Rodón (.156).
TOP OF THE CLASS: Berríos has 52 wins since the start of 2017, second most in the American League in that span, trailing only Justin Verlander (53)...MLB-wide in that time frame, 52 wins ranks eighth in the majors, trailing Gerrit Cole (62), Zack Greinke (61), Clayton Kershaw (58), Max Scherzer (57), Charlie Morton (54), Trevor Bauer (53) and Verlander (53)...his 700 strikeouts are fourth in the AL, trailing Cole (825), Verlander (816) and Chris Sale (763).
