THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 2-1 through three games on their season-long nine-game homestand, taking a three-game series against the White Sox earlier this week...tonight the Twins will welcome back Nelson Cruz and the Rays for three games over the weekend...after this series, they will play three against the Indians from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have gone 26-31 at home this season and 24-34 on the road.

PITCHING AND POLO: The Twins beat the White Sox on Wednesday afternoon by a score of 1-0, their first 1-0 victory since April 29, 2019 vs. Houston (Odorizzi over Verlander)...it also marked their fourth shutout of an opponent this season...Bailey Ober was the starter but did not factor into the decision, pitching 5.1 shutout innings with six hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts...Caleb Thielbar (1.1 IP), Juan Minaya (1.1 IP) and Alex Colomé (1.0 IP) combined to pitch 3.2 scoreless innings of relief as Colomé saved his seventh game...Jorge Polanco led the offense, going 2-for-4 with a sixth-inning game-winning home run.

TWINS-RAYS: The Twins and Rays are playing for the first time since June 27, 2019...in 2019 they went 5-2 against Tampa with a record of 3-1 at Tropicana Field and 2-1 at Target Field...their last game was on June 27 of that season as the Twins lost an 18-inning game by a score of 5-2 (5 hours, 42 minutes)...they will visit the Trop for three from September 3-5...the Twins have won eight of their last 11 over the Rays dating back to July of 2012.

☞ Rocco Baldelli spent parts of six years with the Tampa Bay Rays as a player and splitting eight seasons between their front office and coaching staff...Baldelli was drafted sixth overall by the Rays in the 2000 First-Year Player Draft and played parts of six seasons with the Rays, hitting .280 (493-for-1760) with 95 doubles, 17 triples, 53 home runs, 239 RBI, 258 runs scored and 59 stolen bases in 457 games...ranks on Tampa Bay's all-time list: ninth in triples, 10th in stolen bases, 11th in RBI, 13th in hits, doubles and runs, 16th in home runs and 17th in games.

WELCOME BACK, BOOMSTICK: Nelson Cruz played nearly three full seasons with Minnesota from 2019 until getting traded on July 22 to Tampa Bay in exchange for right-handed pitchers Joe Ryan and Drew Strotman...during his time in Minnesota, Nellie hit .304 (284-for-935) with 45 doubles, 76 home runs, 191 RBI and a .984 OPS in 258 games...below is a look back at Nellie's accomplishments during his time with the Twins:

- ☞ He began his Twins career with 76 home runs, tied for 84th on baseball's all-time home run list at the time and finished in 46th place, passing 38 players in that time...a list that includes 13 Hall-of-Famers.
- ☞ Named AL Silver Slugger Award winner in both 2019 and 2020, and an AL All-Star in 2021.
- ☞ Named Star Tribune's 2019 Sportsperson of the Year.
- ☞ Given 2020 Muhammad Ali Sports Humanitarian Award at ESPY Awards.
- ☞ Given Marvin Miller Man of the Year Award as part of 2020 Players Choice Awards.
- ☞ Won 2019 Edgar Martinez Designated Hitter of the Year Award.
- ☞ Given Most Valuable Twin Award in 2019 and '20...Bob Allison Twins Leadership Award in 2019 & '20...Carl R. Pohlad Award for Outstanding Community Service in 2019.

POLANCO'S THE MAN: Jorge Polanco hit his 21st home run of the season on Wednesday afternoon and is now one short of his single-season career-high of 22, done in 2019...in 59 games since June 1, he is hitting .306 (72-for-235) with 12 doubles, 16 home runs, 41 RBI, 43 runs scored and a .926 OPS in that span.

☞ In that same span, he is hitting .329 (48-for-146) with a 1.046 OPS as a left-handed batter and .270 (24-for-89) with a .725 OPS as a right-handed batter.

THE 'PEN IS MIGHTIER: In their last nine games (since August 3), the Twins bullpen has combined to go 3-0-5, 2.65 ERA (37.1 IP, 11 ER) with 14 walks, 39 strikeouts, a .183 opponent batting average and an opponent OPS of .573.

☞ Former Ray Alex Colomé has gone 5-for-5 in save opportunities in that span, with a .059 opponent batting average (1-for-17) and 5.1 scoreless innings.

SOUTHPAW STORIES: The Twins are hitting .247 (317-for-1286) with a .423 slugging percentage and a .736 OPS vs. lefties this season, compared to .240 (618-for-2573) with a .427 slugging and a .744 OPS against righties.

☞ Twins are tied with Los Angeles-AL for second-most homers against lefties in baseball with 52, trailing Seattle (55).

☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .342 (13-for-38) with seven walks, a .444 on-base percentage and a .944 OPS in his last 21 games against lefties.

ARRAEZ TO THE OCCASION: Luis Arraez has hit safely in 22 of his last 24 games, hitting .415 (34-for-82) in that span, the best in baseball since July 4 (minimum 75 plate appearances)...he is 14-for-35 (.400) with four doubles and four walks in 11 games since being reinstated from the 10-day Injured List on July 31.

- ☞ In-game Photo Opportunity (1991 World Series Trophy): The 1991 World Series trophy will be on display throughout the weekend in Truly On Deck (except for during Saturday's pregame ceremony).
- ☞ A special group of fans who have been Twins Season Ticket Holders since 1991 will lead the crowd in "Take Me Out to the Ballgame" during the 7th-inning stretch.
- ☞ Former Twins legend/manager/coach/player/National Baseball Hall-of-Famer Paul Molitor will be joining Kris Atteberry both tonight and Saturday as an analyst on the Twins Radio Broadcasts.

LUCKY 13: Tonight marks the Twins' first time playing on Friday the 13th since 2018, when they defeated the Tampa Bay Rays 11-8 on Friday, July 13 at Target Field...since 1961, Minnesota is 26-24 on Friday the 13th, including 15-12 at home and 11-12 on the road.

SKI-U-MAH: The Twins are celebrating University of Minnesota Night...fans that bought this special ticket package receive an exclusive co-themed U of M/Twins cap...tonight's radio analyst Paul Molitor played for the Golden Gophers from 1975-77...notable Gophers to play Major League Baseball include Dave Winfield, Terry Steinbach, Dan Wilson, Glen Perkins, Denny Neagle and Kerry Ligtenberg.

- Has a 3.00 ERA (21.0 IP, 7 ER) with two walks and 15 strikeouts in four second half starts...went 0-3, 8.10 ERA (16.2 IP, 15 ER) in his last four starts prior to the All-Star Break.

SECOND HALF TURNAROUND: Pineda has fashioned a 3.00 ERA (21.0 IP, 7 ER), with two walks (1 intentional) and 15 strikeouts in four starts since the All-Star Break...marks a return to form for "Big Mike," after he stumbled to an 0-3 mark with an 8.10 ERA (16.2 IP, 15 ER), three walks, eight strikeouts and a .387/.405/.627 opponent slash line (29-for-75 with 8 doubles, 2 triples, 2 home runs) in four starts from June 1-July 7.

A LITTLE HELP, PLEASE: Despite the 3.00 second-half ERA, Pineda is just 1-2 in those four starts (Minnesota is 2-2, with consecutive losses)...Twins have plated just two runs when he has been on the mound (three overall) in his last two outings.

- In fact, Pineda's 4.48 run-support average is lowest among all Twins pitchers with at least five starts...he has received three-or-fewer runs in 12 of his 16 starts, two-or-fewer in nine outings and, in six of his starts, the Twins have been shut out or held to one run while he was in the game.

LAST TIME OUT: Pineda shouldered the 4-0 loss on August 7 at Houston, but gutted out a season-high 102-pitch performance to save an exhausted Twins bullpen that had worked 6.0 innings the night before and a combined 17.1 frames over the previous four days...Twins were blanked by Houston's Luis Garcia and three relievers, who combined on a four-hitter.

- Threw 47 pitches over the first two innings, before settling in to turn in his sixth quality start of the season...scattered seven hits and allowed just two runs over 6.0 innings...did not walk a batter, while striking out three...Astros added two in the eighth inning off the Twins bullpen.
- 102 pitches thrown were the most by Pineda since September 7, 2020 vs. Detroit (104) and the fourth-highest total of his Twins career (109 on July 21, 2019 vs. Oakland and 107 on September 6, 2019 vs. Cleveland).

START PRIOR: Pineda was saddled with the 7-3 loss to Adam Wainwright and St. Louis on August 1 at Busch Stadium...allowed three runs (2 earned) on five hits, with one walk (intentional) and three strikeouts over 4.0 innings...was lifted for a pinch-hitter in the top of the fifth with the Twins trailing 3-2 and the tying run at second base...go-ahead run scored off Pineda in the bottom of the fifth on a two-out throwing error by third baseman Luis Arraez, the culmination of a 10-pitch at-bat by Wainwright.

MINNESOTA MIKE: Pineda has made 47 starts in a Twins uniform, going 17-12, 3.88 ERA (255.0 IP, 110 ER) with a 4.52 strikeout-to-walk ratio (235 K, 52 BB) and a 1.18 WHIP (248 hits)...Minnesota is 27-20 (.574) when he toes the rubber.

- Big Mike's personal winning percentage (.586), team winning percentage, ERA, strikeout-to-walk ratio and WHIP with the Twins are all better than his overall career numbers: A personal .518 winning percentage (57-53) and a .518 team ledger (85-79) in 164 starts, with a 4.00 ERA (935.0 IP, 416 ER), 4.41 strikeout-to-walk ratio (922 K, 209 BB) and a 1.19 WHIP (900 hits).
- His 4.8 WAR (per Fangraphs) since 2019 is 14th among AL starters (min 250.0 IP).

WHO ARE YOU AGAIN?: After facing Tampa Bay 12 times from 2014-17 as a divisional rival with New York-AL, and 14 times overall between 2011-17, tonight will be Pineda's first start against the Rays since April 10, 2017 -- an 8-1 win for Big Mike at Yankee Stadium...Pineda dazzled in that start, tossing 7.2 innings of two-hit, one-run ball with no walks and 11 strikeouts.

- Four of Big Mike's eight career double-digit strikeout games have come against the Rays: July 30, 2011 with Seattle (10 K in 6.1 IP); July 4, 2015 with New York-AL (10 K in 7.0 IP); September 20, 2016 with the Yankees (11 K in 5.1 IP); and the aforementioned April 10, 2017 performance with NYY (11 K in 7.2 IP).
- Pineda is 3-5, 4.31 ERA (79.1 IP, 38 ER) in 14 career starts vs. Tampa Bay, including 2-1, 3.50 (43.2 IP, 17 ER) over four outings in his home ballpark.

HOME COOKING: Pineda will make his 11th home start of the season in this evening's contest...is 2-3, 3.67 ERA (54.0 IP, 22 ER) and a 1.13 WHIP over his first 10 Target Field outings of 2021...in his last start here on July 26, limited Detroit to two runs on five hits in 6.0 innings; the Twins eventually won, 6-5 in 10 innings.

- His last win at home came May 26 in a 3-2 victory over Baltimore (6.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R/ER, 2 BB, 8 K).
- Big Mike is 6-6, 3.82 ERA (148.1 IP, 63 ER) in 27 career home starts with the Twins.

2021 ARSENAL: Below is a breakdown of Pineda's 2021 three-pitch repertoire, according to Baseball Savant, which follows a similar pattern to what he featured in 2020.

- Since his first start of the 2020 season, opponents are hitting .159 (23-for-145) with 58 strikeouts against Pineda's slider.
- In two-and-a-half seasons with the Twins, he has used his four-seam fastball more than half the time (53.3% in 2021, 50.1% in 2020, 54.1% in 2019)...after a career-high 59.5% use rate as a Mariners rookie, he never topped 47.7% as a Yankee.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP KENTA MAEDA (2021 SEASON: 5-4, 4.69 ERA // CAREER: 58-40, 3.87 ERA)

Maeda is scheduled to start tomorrow evening in the second of this three-game weekend series against Tampa Bay...both of his starts on Minnesota's recent roadtrip were Twins victories (August 3 at Cincinnati and August 8 at Houston), although he did surrender eight earned runs in 10.0 IP (7.20 ERA)...earned his fifth win of the season last Sunday afternoon at Minute Made Park, working 5.0 innings and allowing three runs on six hits, with three walks and five strikeouts...threw a season-high 100 pitches, departing with a 7-3 lead in a game the Twins won, 7-5...is 2-1, 3.43 ERA (39.1 IP, 15 ER) with 31 hits allowed, 10 walks and 50 strikeouts in his last seven starts (beginning July 4)...tomorrow night will be his first career start and second appearance against the Rays...was credited with the relief win in his lone previous outing, despite allowing three runs in just 1.0 inning (3 H, 0 BB, 1 K) in a 7-5 Dodgers victory on September 17, 2019 in Los Angeles.

START 'EM WITH STRIKE ONE, THEN GET 'EM TO CHASE: Pineda ranks ninth in the American League (min. 80.0 IP) by pouring in strike one at a 66.6 percent clip...he has also induced opposing batters to chase, in any count, 33.5 percent of the time to rank in the 93rd percentile among all big league hurlers...for his career, Big Mike owns a 65.4 percent first-strike rate and a 33.5 percent chase rate.
