**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 2-2 through four games on their season-long, nine-game homestand, going 2-1 against the White Sox earlier this week, followed by a loss to the Rays last night...tonight the Twins will play the second of three games with the Rays over the weekend...after this series, they will play three against the Indians from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have gone 26-32 at home this season and 24-34 on the road.

**NELLIE BRINGS THE BOOM BACK TO TARGET FIELD:** The Twins lost to Nelson Cruz and the Rays last night at Target Field by a score of 10-4 as Cruz homered in the third inning...Michael Pineda was the starter and loser, allowing four runs on six hits in 2.2 innings pitched, leaving the game with left side tightness...the offense recorded 11 hits, four coming from Brent Rooker (career-high)...Rooker hit a double which marked the club's only extra-base hit on the night.

**TWINS-RAYS:** The Twins and Rays are playing for the second of six scheduled meetings in 2021...this marks their first series since June 25-27, 2019...they will visit the Trop for three from September 3-5...the Twins have won eight of their last 12 over the Rays dating back to July of 2012.  
 ☛ Twins are 80-83 all-time against the Rays...they went 44-29 over Tampa from 1998-2006 and have since gone 36-54 since 2007.  
 ☛ Twins were 31-17 against the Rays in the Metrodome and are 13-24 at Target Field.  
 ☛ Luis Arraez is 6-for-14 (.429) with one walk in three career games against Tampa Bay.

**ROSTER MOVE:** The Twins have placed right-handed pitcher Michael Pineda on the 10-day Injured List with a left mild oblique strain...Pineda, who left last night's game in the third inning after experiencing left side tightness, has made 17 starts for the Twins this season, going 4-8, 4.13 ERA (85.0 IP, 39 ER), 17 walks, 73 strikeouts, a .264 opponent batting average and a 1.24 WHIP...to replace Pineda on the 26-man roster, the Twins have recalled right-handed pitcher Ralph Garza Jr. from Triple-A St. Paul...Garza Jr., who was claimed off waivers from the Houston Astros on August 4, has appeared in three games for the Saints, allowing three runs on three hits in 3.2 innings pitched with two walks and five strikeouts...the 27-year-old appeared in nine games for the Astros prior to joining the Twins, going 1-2 with a 4.09 ERA (11.0 IP, 5 ER), seven walks, 14 strikeouts, a .262 opponent batting average (11-for-42) and a 1.64 WHIP.

**MIGGY, THE MAN ON BASE:** Miguel Sanó has reached base in 15 of his last 16 games, dating back to July 26...in that span, he is hitting .288 (17-for-59) with four doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks, a .408 on-base percentage and a .968 OPS...since that date, he ranks tied for second in the American League in walks, eighth in OBP and 10th in OPS.

**ARRAEZ TO THE OCCASION:** Luis Arraez has hit safely in 22 of his last 24 games, hitting .415 (34-for-82) in that span, the best in baseball since July 4 (minimum 75 plate appearances)...he is 14-for-35 (.400) with four doubles and four walks in 11 games since being reinstated from the 10-day Injured List on July 31.

**'91 REUNION THIS WEEKEND - TONIGHT:** 1991 World Series 30th Anniversary Celebration details for tonight's event:

- ☛ Pregame Photo Opportunity (4:45 to 5:15 p.m.): Fans have an opportunity to have their photo taken with 1991 alumni Greg Gagne, Scott Leius, Al Newman and Mike Pagliarulo inside Gate 29...Twins Season Ticket Holders have an exclusive photo session at the Digital Clubhouse with Randy Bush, Chili Davis and Game 7 walk-off heroes Dan Gladden (series-winning run) and Gene Larkin (series-winning hit).
- ☛ Pregame Ceremony (5:50 p.m.): An on-field, pregame ceremony will celebrate the 1991 World Series Champion Minnesota Twins through highlights, unique reflections and never-before-seen footage introduced by John Gordon; a brief roundtable with Chili Davis, Kent Hrbek and Andy MacPhail, hosted by Dick Bremer; and a special ceremonial first pitch.

**THE GREATEST WORLD SERIES EVER:** The 1991 Twins finished the regular season with a record of 95-67 and finished eight games ahead of second place Chicago the AL Western Division...they went on to beat Toronto in five games in the ALCS...below are quick recaps from all seven World Series games between the Twins and Atlanta Braves - the first opponents in MLB history to finish in last place the previous season and reach the World Series in the next:

- ☛ The Twins hosted Game 1 at the Metrodome and won 5-2...Jack Morris was the starter and winner over Braves starter Charlie Leibrandt...Morris allowed two runs on five hits in 7.0 innings pitched...Aguilera saved it with 1.1 scoreless innings...the offense was highlighted by a Greg Gagne three-run homer in the fifth inning.
- ☛ The Twins won Game 2 at the Dome by a score of 3-2...Kevin Tapani was the starter and winner, allowing two runs on seven hits in 8.0 innings pitched as Aguilera saved it with a scoreless ninth...the Braves sent Tom Glavine to the mound, who pitched an 8.0-inning complete game...Chili Davis hit a two-run first inning home run as Scott Leius hit the go-ahead and eventual game winning homer with a solo shot in the eighth.
- ☛ The Twins visited Atlanta for Game 3 and lost 5-4 in 12 innings on a Mark Lemke single off Rick Aguilera, scoring Greg Olson...rookie Scott Erickson was the starter, allowing four runs (3 earned) on five hits in 4.2 innings pitched, opposite Steve Avery...the Twins were trailing 4-2 entering the eighth and tied it up to force eventual extra-innings with a Chili Davis two-run homer.
- ☛ The series was evened in Game 4 as the Braves won 3-2 again in walk-off fashion, this time Jack Morris made the start, allowing one run on six hits, opposite John Smoltz, who allowed two runs on seven hits in 7.0 innings pitched...the Braves won on a sac-fly from Jerry Willard, scoring Lemke...Mike Pagliarulo went 3-for-3 and homered.
- ☛ Game 5 was the only game in which the winning team didn't decide the game in their final at-bats as the Braves beat the Twins 14-5 at Fulton County Stadium...Tapani started and allowed four runs on six hits in 4.0 innings...the Twins used five pitchers...the offense recorded seven hits, highlighted by Dan Gladden and Al Newman triples and a Gagne double.
- ☛ The series returned to Minneapolis for THE KIRBY PUCKETT GAME in Game 6...the Twins led 2-0 after one inning as Puckett tripled in Chuck Knoblauch and was then driven in on a Shane Mack single...at the seven-inning mark, the game was tied 3-3 and remained that way until Puckett hit a leadoff walk-off home run to left-centerfield off Leibrandt.
- ☛ Jack Morris was the Game 7 starter and pitched an 11.0-inning complete-game shutout, allowing seven hits with two walks and eight strikeouts...Gladden went 3-for-3 in the game...in the 11th inning, Alejandro Peña allowed a Gladden leadoff double, followed by a Knoblauch sac-bunt, then back-to-back intentional walks to Puckett and Kent Hrbek to load the bases for Gene Larkin who was pinch hitting for Jarvis Brown...Larkin hit a deep fly ball over the head of Brian Hunter to score Gladden.

LAST START: Maeda earned the win last Sunday, August 8 in the series finale at Houston, besting Lance McCullers Jr. in a 7-5 Twins victory...yielded three runs on six hits, with three walks and five strikeouts over 5.0 innings pitched...

START PRIOR: Maeda took a no-decision August 3 in the series opener at Cincinnati, an eventual 7-5 Twins victory...allowed five runs on seven hits (3 HR), with one walk and nine strikeouts...pitched scoreless first and second innings before running into trouble in the third; allowed back-to-back home runs to Eugenio Suárez and Tucker Barnhart...

✎ Maeda went 1-for-2 with a run scored at the plate in the start...he joined Bailey Ober (1-for-2 on August 3) as the second Twins pitcher to record a hit this season, marking the first time the Twins had multiple pitchers with a hit in the same season since 2017 (Jose Berríos, Dietrich Enns, Ervin Santana)...Maeda also scored his second run this season; the last Twins pitcher to score multiple runs in a season was Kyle Gibson in 2018 (2 runs scored).

INFREQUENT FOE: Maeda is facing the Rays for just the second time in his career and will make his first career start against them tonight...his lone appearance against Tampa Bay came on September 17, 2019 at Dodger Stadium while pitching for Los Angeles-NL...earned the win in relief, despite allowing three runs on three hits (1 HR), with one strikeout in just 1.0 inning of work.

✎ Tonight marks Maeda's second start of the season vs. the American League East division, with his lone prior start coming in the first game of the doubleheader April 14 vs. Boston (L, 4.1 IP, 7 H, 3 R/2 ER, 2 BB, 5 K).
✎ Owns a career 1-3, 5.14 ERA (28.0 IP, 16 ER), with 12 walks and 34 strikeouts in seven career games (5 starts) vs. the AL East...his 5.14 ERA is his highest career mark against any division.

HOME COOKING: Maeda is making his 7th home start of the season, going 1-2, 2.53 ERA (32.0 IP, 9 ER), with nine walks and 33 strikeouts in his six prior starts at Target Field...this compares to the 4-2, 5.77 ERA (64.0 IP, 41 ER), with 21 walks and 71 strikeouts in his 13 road starts this season...only two of the 16 home runs and 10 of the 37 extra-base hits he's allowed this season have come at home.

✎ Is 4-2, 2.22 ERA (65.0 IP, 16 ER), with 15 walks and 75 strikeouts in 11 career starts at Target Field...seven of his 11 starts in this ballpark have been quality.
✎ His 2.22 ERA here is his lowest mark among any stadium in which he's made at least three appearances.

MILESTONE MAN: Maeda surpassed two career milestones in his start against the Mariners in Seattle on June 14...at the end of his second inning of work he reached 700 career MLB innings, becoming the 10th Japanese-born pitcher to hit that plateau in the majors...the others are: Hideo Nomo (1,976.1 IP), Hiroki Kuroda (1,319.0 IP), Yu Darvish (1,258.1 IP), Tomo Ohka (1,070.0 IP), Masahiro Tanaka (1,054.1 IP), Hisashi Iwakuma (883.2 IP), Daisuke Matsuzaka (790.1 IP), Masato Yoshii (757.1 IP) and Shigetoshi Hasegawa (720.1 IP)...additionally, Maeda's strikeout of Shed Long Jr. in the fourth inning on June 14 was the 2,000th of his career...he now has 2,053 strikeouts combined between Nippon Professional Baseball (1,233) and Major League Baseball (820).

✎ Maeda's final strikeout on July 17 was the 800th of his major league career...he became just the fifth Japanese-born pitcher in major league history to reach 800 career strikeouts, joining Nomo (1,918), Darvish (1,550), Tanaka (991) and Kuroda (986).
✎ Maeda's seven career games with 10-plus strikeouts are fourth most among Japanese-born pitchers in major league history, behind Darvish (47), Nomo (31) and Tanaka (14).

2021 ARSENAL: Over the last two seasons, Maeda's slider has overtaken his four-seam fastball as his most-used pitch in his five-pitch arsenal...here's a breakdown of his 2021 offerings and the results:

✎ Ranks in the 92nd percentile with a 33.0 chase rate this season.

MONTHLY MARKS: Maeda finished April with a 6.56 ERA, his second-highest single-month ERA in his career behind his 6.58 mark in April 2017...he tends to heat up with the weather, owning a 3.68 career ERA in May, 3.25 mark in June and 3.86 mark in July, before ticking back up to 4.14 in August, his second-highest career ERA in any month, behind only his 4.48 mark in April...here are his numbers by month in his career (full months only, excluding March and October).

CAREER NOTES

- Finished second in the 2020 American League Cy Young Award voting, accruing 92 total votes (Cleveland's Shane Bieber was the unanimous winner).
Named Joseph W. Haynes Award winner for Twins Pitcher of the Year in 2020, voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of the BBWAA...also named the starting pitcher on 2020 All-MLB Second Team.
Pitched 8.0 no-hit innings on August 18, 2020 vs. MIL before bid was broken up in the ninth...longest no-hit bid of career, and set Twins record with eight-straight K's.
Is the third Japanese-born player in Twins franchise history, after Micheal Nakamura (2003) and Tsuyoshi Nishioka (2011-12).
Owns the fifth-most strikeouts in MLB history among Japanese-born pitchers.
His 16 wins in 2016 were the second-most wins ever by a Los Angeles-NL rookie, behind only Rick Sutcliffe (17-10, 1979), and tied for the second-most ever in a single season by a Japanese pitcher.
In 2016, led qualifying MLB rookie starting pitchers in starts (32), wins (16), opponents' batting average (.229), WHIP (1.14), innings pitched (175.2) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.58).
Named to the 2016 Baseball America Major League All-Rookie Team, and finished third in the NL Rookie of the Year voting.
Pitched 6.0 scoreless innings in his major league debut, also hitting a solo home run in his second career at-bat.

TWO HALVES OF ONE WHOLE: Maeda has historically performed better prior to the All-Star Break than after...he's 33-23, 3.69 ERA (431.2 IP, 177 ER) in 83 games (79 starts) prior to the break, compared to 19-16, 4.48 ERA (253.1 IP, 126 ER) in 73 games (43 starts) after the break...his lowest career post-All-Star ERA to date (not including 2020) occurred in 2017, when he went 6-2, 3.99 ERA (56.1 IP, 25 ER) in 13 appearances (11 starts) for the Dodgers.

✎ This season, Maeda went 4-3, 4.66 ERA (67.2 IP, 35 ER) in 14 Pre-All-Star Break starts, while he is currently 1-1, 4.76 ERA (28.1 IP, 15 ER) in five starts since the All-Star Break.

OPPOSING COUNTS: Opponents are hitting .409 (18-for-44) off Maeda's first offering of an at-bat...by contrast, opponents are batting .180 (37-for-205) off Maeda with two strikes, above the .087 (13-for-150) mark he held them to in 2020 and his career mark of .147 (240-for-1632)...the league average mark this season with two strikes is .165.

✎ When the count goes full, Maeda is holding opposing hitters to just 4-for-40 (.100), tied for the sixth-lowest mark among all major league pitchers (min. 35 opponent at-bats) and tied for second lowest among American League pitchers, behind only New York-AL's Gerrit Cole (.076)...since 2017, he's held hitters to a .131 (28-for-214) batting average on full counts, the second-lowest mark in the majors in that span (min. 200 opp. at-bats), behind only Jhoulys Chacin (.126).
