**THE TWINS:** Have gone 3-3 through six games on their season-long nine-game roadtrip, going 1-2 in St. Louis, 1-1 in Cincinnati and 1-0 in Houston...tonight the Twins will continue the trip with the second of four in Houston through the weekend...after this series, the Twins will travel home to play a nine-game homestand with three against the White Sox (August 9-11), three against the Rays (August 13-15) and three against the Indians (August 16-18)...the Twins have gone 24-30 at home this season and 22-33 on the road.

**TWINS OPEN IN HOUSTON WITH A W:** The Twins beat the Astros last night in Houston by a score of 5-3, scoring four runs in the top of the second inning...Griffin Jax (2-1) was the starter and earned his second career win, allowing one run on three hits (1 home run) in 5.1 innings pitched...Caleb Thielbar earned his seventh hold, Tyler Duffey earned his 14th hold and Alexander Colomé earned his fourth save with 0.1 inning pitched...the offense recorded nine hits, two from Rob Refsnyder, who singled and had one of the Twins' three doubles...Andrelton Simmons drove in two of the club's five runs and went 1-for-4 with his first career RBI bunt single.

☞ Refsnyder reached base four times last night (1B, 2B, 2 BB) in his first game back from the 10-day Injured List, tying his career-high for the third time overall and second time this season, previously done May 17 vs. Chicago-AL (3 1B, 2B).

☞ Trevor Larnach reached base three times with a double and two walks - marking a single-game career high on reaching base.

**BAROMETERS OF SUCCESS:** Last night's 5-3 win met a pair of pitching barometers that have often equaled success for the Twins this season...Griffin Jax pitched 5.1 innings; in the 71 games this year that their starter has worked at least 5.0 frames, the Twins are 38-33 (.535)...Minnesota's pitchers also combined to allow just three runs; in 63 games this season holding opponents to five-or-fewer runs, the Twins are 43-20 (.683).

**TWINS-ASTROS:** The Twins and Astros are playing each other for the fifth of seven scheduled meetings in 2021...the Twins went 1-2 against Houston over a three-game series at Target Field from June 11-13...the Twins are 33-35 all-time against the Astros in the regular season, including a record of 22-26 since Houston joined the American League in 2013.

☞ Josh Donaldson is hitting .323 (70-for-217) with 16 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs, 42 RBI, 41 walks and a 1.042 OPS in 62 career games against the Astros...he has reached safely in 16 of his last 17 games vs. Houston.

☞ Andrelton Simmons has 82 career hits in 83 games against the Astros, his most against any opponent.

☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .341 (29-for-85) with three doubles, two triples, four home runs, 13 RBI and a .952 OPS in 22 career regular season games vs. Houston.

☞ Twins have dealt Zack Greinke a loss nine times in 24 career games (20 starts)...only the Chicago White Sox (10 losses) and Cleveland Indians (9 losses) have beat Greinke as many times.

**I LOVE LUEY:** Luis Arraez has hit safely in eight of his last nine games, hitting .448 (13-for-29) in that span...he is 7-for-16 (.438) with three doubles and three walks in five games since being reinstated from the 10-day Injured List on July 31...beginning July 4, he has hit safely in 16 of 18 games, batting .429 (27-for-63) with 12 runs scored, six doubles, four RBI, six walks, a .471 on-base percentage and a .995 OPS in that span.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY, JG:** Right-handed pitcher John Gant is celebrating his 29th birthday today...he has never appeared in a major league game on his birthday...Gant shares a birthday with former Twins catcher/minor league coach Chris Heintz, who turns 47 today...also celebrating birthdays today are former U.S. First Lady Edith Roosevelt, inventor of penicillin Alexander Fleming, comedian Lucille Ball and artist Andy Warhol.

LAST START: Ober did not factor into the decision from the Twins' 8-1 victory in St. Louis on July 31 after allowing just one run on four hits over 4.0 innings of work, with one walk and six strikeouts...

START PRIOR: Ober started on July 25 vs. Los Angeles-AL at Target Field; did not factor into the decision in a 6-2 Twins loss...allowed two runs on three hits (1 HR), with one walk and four strikeouts...

HOWDY HOUSTON: Today marks Ober's second career start against Houston, after facing them on June 11 at Target Field...he did not factor into the decision after allowing two runs on a career-high seven hits (1 HR) over 5.0 innings...

LOW RISP, HIGH REWARD: Through his first 11 career major league starts, Ober is holding opponents to a .226 batting average (7-for-31) with runners in scoring position as well as a .143 (2-for-14) mark with RISP and two outs...

LOW TRAFFIC: Ober struck out 100 batters and walked just nine in 2019, good for an MLB-best 11.11 strikeout-to-walk ratio (min. 75.0 IP)...that season, he also ranked second in the minors in WHIP (0.81) and base runners-per-9.0 IP (7.55), and was fifth in walks-per-9.0 IP (1.03).

YOUTH MOVEMENT: Ober is one of seven players to make his major league debut for the Twins this season and one of three pitchers...the others are: C Ben Rortvedt (April 30), IF/OF Nick Gordon (May 6), OF Trevor Larnach (May 8), OF Gilberto Celestino (June 2), RHP Griffin Jax (June 8) and LHP Charlie Barnes (July 17).

SAINTLY SUMMARY: Ober made four starts for Triple-A St. Paul this season, going 1-0, 2.81 ERA (16.0 IP, 5 ER), five walks, 21 strikeouts and a .217 opponent batting average (13-for-60)...two of the starts occurred prior to his call-up on May 18 and two after...made his season debut in the Saints' fifth game on May 8 at Omaha, taking a no-decision after working 3.0 innings and allowing one run on three hits, with two walks and three strikeouts; the run scored on a fielder's choice in his final frame of work...took the ball again on May 13 vs. Iowa, scattering two hits and one walk over 4.0 shutout innings, with a then-season-high five strikeouts in another no-decision...earned his lone victory of the season on May 25 at Iowa, working 5.0 innings of one-run ball and allowing just four hits while walking none and fanning five as the Saints exploded for 17 runs en route to a 17-5 rout of the I-Cubs...his other start came in the finale of that same six-game series in Des Moines, fanning a season-high eight batters in 4.0 strong innings as St. Paul won 7-3 and completed a six-game sweep.

CAREER REDUX: Selected by the Twins in the 12th round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the College of Charleston, the 25-year-old has gone 18-3, 2.41 ERA (197.2 IP, 53 ER) with 26 walks, 244 strikeouts and a .222 opponent batting average (163-for-734) over 38 career minor league appearances (35 starts) from 2017-21...was added to the Twins' 40-man roster on November 20, 2020...spent part of the offseason working out in Colorado with fellow Twins staffmate Taylor Rogers and last night's pitcher Griffin Jax.

SKOL TWINS: Ober attended Charlotte Christian School in Charlotte, North Carolina, where he was batterymates on the baseball team and friends with Vikings center Garrett Bradbury...Bradbury had just arrived in the Twin Cities for OTAs at the time of Ober's debut on May 18, and attended the game with his wife, Carson...Carson is also the older sister of Kansas City Royals No. 4 prospect Jackson Kowar.

#82 IN YOUR PROGRAMS, #1 IN YOUR HEART: Ober is the first player in Twins history to wear uniform number 82...former hitting coach James Rowson is the only other uniformed personnel to wear #82, doing so while presiding over 2019's "Bomba Squad."

NO RUNS: Ober posted a miniscule 0.69 ERA (78.2 IP, 6 ER) in 2019, his most recent full professional season...his mark led all minor league pitchers (min. 75.0 IP) and he also became the first Twins minor league pitcher to allow six-or-fewer earned runs in 78.2-or-more innings pitched since at least 1961...also marked the second-lowest single-season ERA by any minor league pitcher since 1992 (min. 75.0 IP), trailing only Erasmo Ramirez's 0.51 ERA (88.0 IP, 5 ER) in 2009 for the VSL Mariners.

- Made his MLB debut on May 18, 2021, starting for the Twins against Chicago-AL. In 2020, spent spring training on minor league side of CenturyLink Sports Complex in Fort Myers, FL...was not part of Twins' 60-man Player Pool for season. Added to Twins 40-man roster on November 20, 2020. Split the 2019 season between three levels of Twins organization, combining to go 8-0, 0.69 ERA (78.2 IP, 6 ER) with nine walks, 100 strikeouts and a .194 opponent batting average in 14 games (13 starts) for GCL Twins, Single-A Fort Myers and Double-A Pensacola. Led all minor league pitchers (min. 75.0 IP) with a 0.69 ERA (78.2 IP, 6 ER) and ranked second in the minors with a 0.81 WHIP...also became the first Twins minor league pitcher to allow six-or-fewer earned runs in 78.2-or-more innings pitched since at least 1961. Named Florida State League Pitcher of the Week for Fort Myers on April 14 and Southern League Pitcher of the Week for Pensacola on September 2. Named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week twice during the 2019 season: once for Fort Myers on August 4 (6.1 IP, 0 ER, 6 H in 1 start) and again on August 25 with Pensacola (1-0, 7.0 IP, 0 ER, 3 H, 0 BB, 12 K). In 2018, was named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week in consecutive weeks: July 7, going 1-0 with 7.0 shutout innings and 12 strikeouts vs. Wisconsin for theernels, and again July 14, going 1-0 with two runs allowed in 7.0 innings and 10 strikeouts vs. Fort Wayne...became first ever Twin to win the award twice in a season. Selected by Twins in 12th round of 2017 First-Year Player Draft; signed by scout Seth Moir...originally selected by Los Angeles-NL in the 23rd round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft, but elected to return to the College of Charleston for the 2017 season. Attended College of Charleston from 2014-17, missing the 2015 season recovering from Tommy John Surgery on right elbow...compiled a 24-9 record with a 2.91 ERA and 254 strikeouts in 259.2 innings over the course of his collegiate career.

Pineda will take the mound for the third game of the four-game series in Houston tomorrow evening...was dealt his sixth loss of the season in his last outing on August 1 in St. Louis after allowing three runs (2 ER) on five hits over 4.0 innings of work, with one walk and three strikeouts...tomorrow will mark Pineda's second time this season facing the Astros after taking the loss against them June 13 at Target Field (4.0 IP, 6 H, 3 R/ER, 1 BB, 1 K)...holds a record 3-5, 5.18 ERA (57.1 IP, 33 ER) with nine walks and 44 strikeouts in 10 career starts against Houston.
