THE TWINS: The Twins began their two-game Interleague series against the Cubs last night with a 3-1 loss...tonight they will play the series finale, then travel to St. Petersburg to begin a seven-game, eight-day roadtrip...they will enjoy an off-day in Florida tomorrow then begin a three-game weekend series against the Rays at Tropicana Field on Friday night...after that series, they will travel to Cleveland for four games at Progressive Field from September 6-9...the Twins have gone 32-35 at home this season and 26-39 on the road.
 ☞ The Twins have gone 8-4 in their last 12 games at Target Field.

TWINS DROP SERIES OPENER: The Twins lost to the Cubs last night by a score of 3-1, hosting Chicago for the first time since June of 2015...John Gant (4-9) was the starter and loser, allowing two runs on three hits in 5.0 innings pitched with no walks and five strikeouts...the offense recorded nine hits, two from Luis Arraez, who had the club's only extra-base hit with a first-inning double, his 15th of the season...the Twins went 1-for-8 with runners in scoring position and left seven men on base.

SEPTEMBER WELCOME: Today the Twins made several roster moves...they have selected the contract of right-handed pitcher Joe Ryan from Triple-A St. Paul, and have returned right-handed pitcher Randy Dobnak from his rehab assignment and reinstated him from the 60-day Injured List.

☞ Ryan, 25, has appeared in 14 games (13 starts) between Triple-A St. Paul and Triple-A Durham this season, going 4-3, 3.41 ERA (66.0 IP, 25 ER), 12 walks, 92 strikeouts, a 0.79 WHIP and a .173 (40-for-231) opponent batting average...he was one of two minor league pitchers (also Drew Strotman) acquired via trade with Tampa Bay on July 22, in exchange for Nelson Cruz...at the time of the trade he was in Tokyo, Japan competing in the Olympics, and helped Team USA win the silver medal in baseball...more on Ryan on page 2 of the notes.
 ☞ Dobnak, who has missed the Twins' last 61 games with a right middle finger strain, made two starts on rehab assignment for Single-A Fort Myers and Triple-A St. Paul, allowing one run on five hits in 7.2 innings pitched with four walks and seven strikeouts.
 ☞ To make room for Ryan on the 40-man roster, the Twins have transferred right-handed pitcher Kenta Maeda (right forearm tightness) to the 60-day Injured List.
 ☞ Right-handed pitcher Edgar Garcia has cleared waivers and will be assigned to Triple-A St. Paul.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 8-9 in Interleague Play this season, going 2-1 at Milwaukee from April 1-4, 1-2 vs. Pittsburgh from April 23-25, 1-1 vs. Cincinnati from June 21-22, 1-2 at St. Louis from July 30-August 1, 1-1 at Cincinnati from August 3-4, 2-1 vs. Milwaukee from August 27-29 and a loss to Chicago-NL last night...their remaining IL schedule is as follows: one vs. Chicago-NL tonight and two at Chicago-NL September 21-22.

☞ The Twins need to go 3-0 in their remaining three IL games to secure a winning record against the National League for the second-consecutive season (13-7 in 2020)...the Twins have 10 winning seasons against the NL, 12 losing seasons and three splits.
 ☞ Josh Donaldson is hitting .311 (158-for-508) with 28 doubles, 32 home runs, 101 RBI, 100 runs scored and a .961 OPS in 141 career IL games...his IL OPS ranks third among actives in all of baseball, his slugging percentage (.563) and on-base percentage (.398) both rank fourth and his average ranks seventh (minimum 300 plate appearances).
 ☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .320 (16-for-50) with three doubles, three home runs, six RBI, 10 runs scored, four walks and a .924 OPS in his last 12 games against the National League.

TWINS-CUBS: The Twins and Cubs are playing the second of four scheduled games in 2021...they will play two at Wrigley Field from September 21-22...the Twins are 15-19 all-time against the Cubs, including a record of 3-4 at Target Field...these two teams last met for a three-game series at Wrigley Field from September 18-20, 2020, as the Twins lost the first game but won games two and three...the Twins are looking to even the series at 1-1 and avoid being swept for the first time by the Cubs in Minnesota.

☞ **DID YOU KNOW?** Josh Donaldson was originally drafted by the Cubs as a catcher in the first round (48th overall) of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...he played less than two seasons in Chicago's minor league system before being traded to Oakland on July 8, 2008 along with right-handed pitcher Sean Gallagher and outfielders Matt Murton and Eric Patterson, in exchange for right-handed pitchers Chad Gaudin and Rich Harden.

'PEN PALS: In its last five games, the Twins bullpen has posted a 0.46 ERA (19.2 IP, 1 ER) with 15 hits allowed, three walks, 23 strikeouts, a .211 opponent batting average and a .546 opponent OPS...in 26 games since August 3, the 'pen has combined to post a 3.66 ERA (110.2 IP, 45 ER) with 107 strikeouts and a .219 opponent batting average — the seventh-best opponent average in baseball in that span.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2017, former closer Joe Nathan signed a one-day contract to officially retire as a Minnesota Twin...he is the club's all-time leader in saves (260), ranks eighth on baseball's all-time list with 377 career saves and was inducted into the club's Hall of Fame in 2019...Nathan saved one game in his rookie season as a 24-year-old with San Francisco in 1999 but didn't save his second game until he was 29 in 2004 with the Twins...he ranks fourth all-time in saves among pitchers from age 29-and-older, trailing Mariano Rivera (568), Trevor Hoffman (503) and Dennis Eckersley (387).

TWINS ON A STICK: The 2021 Minnesota State Fair is taking place in St. Paul through Labor Day...the Twins Experience is located on the south end of Cooper Street at Judson Avenue, next to the International Bazaar, and is open from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. daily, rain or shine, throughout the fair's duration...fans can have the opportunity to meet T.C. Bear, play whiffle ball home run derby/batting practice, win giveaway items, shop for their favorite Twins clothing and merchandise and much more.

- ☞ Making his major league debut tonight...marks the eighth player and fourth pitcher to debut for the Twins this season.
- ☞ Currently ranked as the No. 6 prospect in the Twins organization, per MLB.com.
- ☞ Acquired by the Twins from Tampa Bay on July 22, alongside right-handed pitcher Drew Strotman, in exchange for Nelson Cruz.
- ☞ Has gone 4-3, 3.41 ERA (66.0 IP, 25 ER) with 12 walks and 92 strikeouts in 14 games (13 starts) in Triple-A this season...this includes 0-0, 2.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 2 ER), two walks and 17 strikeouts in two starts for the Saints.
- ☞ He is 15-8, 2.67 ERA (226.0 IP, 67 ER) with 53 walks, 326 strikeouts, a 13.0 strikeouts-per-9.0 IP ratio, an 0.87 WHIP and a .173 opponent batting average (143-for-808) in 50 career minor league games (42 starts).

LAST TIME OUT: Ryan's last start came on August 25 for Triple-A St. Paul in Toledo; had no part in the decision as the Saints fell to the Mud Hens, 4-2...allowed one run on four hits, with one walk and eight strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work...fanned at least eight batters for the sixth time in 13 starts this season, as well as the 21st time in 42 career minor league starts.

SAINTS SUMMARY: Ryan made his Twins organization debut on Friday, August 20 vs. Iowa; did not factor into the decision as the Saints won, 7-4...allowed just one hit — a fourth-inning solo homer by Nick Martini — and walked one batter while striking out nine — including the first six batters he faced — in 4.0 innings of work...his performance earned him the Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week award for that timeframe.

MINOR LEAGUE SEASON SUMMARY: Ryan was optioned out of major league camp on March 16 and began the season at the Rays' alternate training site, before being assigned to Triple-A Durham — his first career taste of Triple-A baseball...made his season debut on May 5 at Memphis, earning the win after K-ing nine batters and walking none over 5.0 shutout innings (2 hits)...struggled in his next two outings, yielding 10 runs combined from May 11-16, including a career-high-tying six runs in 2.2 innings of work on May 16 vs. Jacksonville...finished May with a 4.57 ERA (21.2 IP, 11 ER) but rebounded with a strong June, going 1-1, 2.79 ERA (19.1 IP, 6 ER), three walks and 22 strikeouts in four outings (3 starts)...missed time at the end of May/early June to play for Team USA in the WBSC Baseball Americas Olympic Qualifier (more on that in the note below).

☞ Was named the Triple-A East Pitcher of the Week for July 5-11, after allowing just one hit and one walk, with a season-high-tying nine strikeouts, over a career-high-tying 7.0 shutout innings on July 11 at Norfolk.

MEDAL MAN: Ryan played an important role on Team USA's silver medal-winning baseball squad at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics...started twice for the Stars and Stripes, going 1-0, 1.74 ERA (10.1 IP, 2 ER) with one walk and eight strikeouts...was traded to the Twins while in Japan with Team USA...started and won Team USA's Olympic opener vs. Israel, becoming the first Twins farmhand to record an Olympic victory since Brian Duensing earned the win for Team USA over Team Canada on August 16, 2008 at the Beijing Olympics.

- ☞ Ryan came to Target Field and threw out the first pitch — while wearing his silver medal — on Sunday, August 15, prior to the Twins' game against the Tampa Bay Rays, his former organization.
- ☞ Ryan also left Triple-A Durham from May 30-June 11 to participate in the WBSC Baseball Americas Qualifier...started once for Team USA against the Dominican Republic on June 1, taking a no-decision after allowing three runs on four hits, with one walk and 10 strikeouts; two of those 10 K's were against former Toronto Blue Jays slugger José Bautista, who was punched out twice by Ryan...Team USA won that game, 8-6, and went on to win the qualifier and clinch an Olympic berth.
- ☞ In 2014, Ryan also played for the Team USA 15U squad that finished second at the WBSC World Cup in Mexico...was teammates with Twins' No. 2 prospect (and trade deadline acquisition from Toronto) Austin Martin on that team; the pair were also roommates during the tournament.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Ryan becomes the eighth player to make his major league debut for the Twins this season and one of four pitchers...the others are: C Ben Rortved (April 30), IF/OF Nick Gordon (May 6), OF Trevor Larnach (May 8), RHP Bailey Ober (May 18), OF Gilberto Celestino (June 2), RHP Griffin Jax (June 8) and LHP Charlie Barnes (July 17).

- ☞ Ryan becomes the first Twins pitcher to make his major league debut as the starter in an interleague game since Devin Smeltzer debuted on May 28, 2019 against Milwaukee at Target Field (ND, 6.0 IP, 3 H, 0 R/ER, 0 BB, 7 K).
- ☞ Ryan marks the 15th different pitcher to start a game for the Twins this season, the third-highest total in a single season in club history (1961-present)...both the 2017 and 2018 Twins had 16 different pitchers make a start for the club.
- ☞ Ryan also becomes the 56th different player to play for the Twins this season, extending the single-season club record for most players used in a campaign...Ian Gibaut set the record last Sunday when he made his season debut, becoming the 55th player to appear for the Twins and breaking a tie with the 2018 club, which used 54 players...Tomás Telis was on the Twins' roster this season but did not appear in a game.

SPRING REVIEW: Ryan was a non-roster invitee and made three appearances (1 start) for the Rays in 2021 spring training, working 3.0 scoreless innings (0 H, 0 BB, 4 K)...he pitched against the Twins once, tossing a scoreless fourth frame on March 10 at Charlotte Sports Park...he induced a flyout by Williams Astudillo and struck out Kyle Garlick looking to start the inning; Brent Rooker reached on an error but Ryan fanned Rob Refsnyder on a foul tip to end the frame.

CAREER YEAR: Ryan dominated in 2019, his most recent full professional season, going 9-4, 1.96 ERA (123.2 IP, 27 ER), 27 walks and 183 strikeouts in 24 games (22 starts) across three different levels of the Rays organization (Single-A Bowling Green — 6 starts, Single-A Charlotte — 15 games/13 starts, Double-A Montgomery — 3 starts)...the campaign also marked his first full pro year, after being drafted in 2018...he was named the Rays minor league Pitcher of the Year and an MiLB.com organization All-Star for his performance, and finished the year ranked as the No. 10 prospect in the Rays organization.

- ☞ Ryan's 183 cumulative strikeouts in 2019 were second most in the minors (KC prospect Kris Bubic — 185) and were the third most by a Rays farmhand in a single season, trailing only Matt Moore in 2011 (210) and 2010 (208)...his 13.32 strikeouts-per-9.0 IP ratio, 8.01 base runners-per-9.0 IP ratio and 0.84 WHIP led all minor league pitchers (min. 120.0 IP)...also ranked third under those same parameters in ERA (1.96), third in hits-per-9.0 IP (5.60) and fourth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.78).

FRIDAY'S STARTER - RHP RANDY DOBNAK (2021 SEASON: 1-6, 7.83 ERA // CAREER: 9-11, 4.85 ERA)

Right-hander Dobnak is due to start Friday's series opener in St. Petersburg, after tomorrow's off-day...returned from rehab and reinstated from the 60-day Injured List prior to tonight's game...was placed on the 10-day Injured List on June 24 (retroactive to June 21) with a right middle finger strain and was transferred to the 60-day Injured List on July 17...last pitched in the majors on June 19 at Texas, starting and taking a no-decision after allowing two runs on four hits (1 HR), with one walk and one strikeout in 5.0 innings of work; departed with the score tied 2-2 and the Twins took the lead when Max Kepler scored the go-ahead run on a wild pitch in the top of the seventh inning...Dobnak will be facing the Rays for the first time in his career...he's 0-3, 7.53 ERA (14.1 IP, 12 ER) in four career games (3 starts) vs. the American League East division...three of those four outings (2 starts, 1 relief appearance) have occurred this season, on April 13 vs. Boston (relief), June 2 at Baltimore (start) and June 9 vs. New York-AL (start).

2021 HIGHS (MINORS)

TAKE THE BACK ROAD: Ryan grew up in Marin County, California, across the Golden Gate Bridge from San Francisco...his father, Kurtis, is an ultra-marathon runner and extreme athlete whose family has lived in Marin County for five generations...when Joe was younger, Kurtis used to take him on week-long camping trips and hiking and hunting after school...baseball wasn't his central focus, though; his main sport was water polo, which he played year-round, even during baseball season.

- ☞ Ryan told *Sports Illustrated* in May 2021 that all those years of water polo set the foundation for his mechanics on the mound, particularly his release point, and the movement and spin he gets on his fastball: "In water polo you learn how to skip the ball. I spent 10 years trying to skip the ball in water polo, and it's the same concept as throwing a fastball: Get the shoulder in position and then let the hand work and get it out front. Throwing a baseball feels the same way. You get that zip right at the end. The ball just takes off. There's not a lot of stress on the body. There's nothing on the TrackMan to suggest that this pitch is anything crazy. But I guess it looks like I'm throwing harder than it is."
