TWINS AND ROYALS GO 11 AS TWINS FALL: The Twins lost to the Royals last night at Target Field by a score of 6-4 in 11 innings, making them 11-11 in extra frames this season... Griffin ax was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing four runs on tive hits in 6.0 innings
pitched..the bullpen combined to allow two runs on three hits in 5.0 innings pitched as Juan Minaya (2-1) was dealt the loss, allowing an Andrew Benintendi two-run homer in the 11th...the offense scored all four of their runs in the first inning, highlighted by a Byron Buxton leadoff home run (his 2nd leadoff homer this season) and a Josh Donaldson three-run homer...Buxton's homer was measured at a career-best 457 feet, hitting the facing of Minnie and Paul's in centerfield...
for Donaldson, his homer had an exit velocity of 113.6 mph , his hardest of the Statcast Era.
ROSTER MOVE: The Twins have selected the contract of left-handed pitcher Jovani Moran from Triple-A St. Paul...Moran 24, has split the season between Double-A Wichita and St. opponent batting average...the Mayaguez, PR native was selected by the Twins in the seventh round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of the Carlos Beltrán Baseball Academy...to make room on the 28-man roster, the Twins have optioned left-handed pitcher Andrew Albers to Triple-A St. Paul..to make room for Moran on the 40-man roster, the Twins have transferred right-handed pitcher Randy Dobnak to the 60 -day Injured List...Dobnak was placed on the 10 -day Injured List on Thursday with a right middle finger strain.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1974, Harmon Killebrew hit his final home run as a Twin, a walk-off two-run shot in the bottom of the ${ }_{7} 10$ th to , give the Twins a $5-3$ victory over Oakland...in 1999, Eric Milton threw the fourth no-hitter in Twins history, defeating the Angels $7-0$ at the Metrodome...he walked two and struck out 13 batters, the most strikeouts in a no-hitter in Twins/Senators history (passing

F Tonight marks his 19th appearance of the season and 18th start...also his 167th career appearance and 166th start.
Is making his second start of the season and 13th of his career vs. Kansas City tonight...is 6-6 4.05 ERA (73.1 IP, 33 ER ), with 15 walks and 67 strikeouts vs. the Royals.


LAST TIME OUT: Big Mike earned the win in his first career MLB relief appearance last Monday, September 6 at Progressive Field, working 3.0 scoreless innings, with two hits, one walk and three strikeouts in a 5-2 Twins victory over Cleveland...entered the game in the fifth in relief of starter Bailey Ober...worked around two singles in the fifth and a leadoff walk in the sixth before tossing a one-two-three seventh to wrap up his outing...retired seven of the final eight men he faced, including the last six batters in order, giving way to the Twins bullpen which sealed the victory with two more scoreless innings
$\Phi$ Pineda was reinstated from the 10-day Injured List earlier that day....was used in a relief role to help him ease back into major league action without a rehab assignment, as well as manage Bailey Ober's workload.
F Marked his first career MLB relief appearance and first professional relief outing that was not part of a rehab assignment since May 16, 2009 while pitching for Single-A High Desert in Seattle's minor league system.

START PRIOR: Pineda started on August 13 vs. Tampa Bay, shouldering his eighth loss of the season in a 10-4 Twins setback...permitted four runs on six hits ( 2 HR ), with no walks and three strikeouts over just 2.2 innings of work...allowed a run in the opening frame on a Randy Arozarena RBI double, followed by two more tallies in the second inning on a Yandy Díaz solo home run and a wild pitch which allowed Mike Zunino to score...began his third inning by permitting a solo shot to Nelson Cruz; recorded two outs in the frame before departing the game with left side tightness.
T 2.2 innings marked his shortest start of the season and second shortest of his career, behind only a 1.2 -inning, ejection-shortened outing on April 23, 2014 at Boston while pitching for New York-AL...four runs marked his most since allowing a season-high-tying five runs on July 7 vs. Chicago-AL; prior to this outing, Pineda had limited opposing teams to three runs-or-fewer in each of his four outings since the All-Star Break....also marked his first time allowing multiple home runs in a start since May 13 at Chicago-AL.
$\Phi$ Pineda was placed on the 10-day Injured List August 14 with a left oblique strain and has missed the Twins' last 20 games...it marked his third stint on the IL this season - also May 19-26 (abcess - retroactive to May 16) and June 14-July 7 (right elbow inflammation).

ROYAL RUMBLE: Pineda is making his 13th career start vs. Kansas City tonight...is 6-6, 4.05 ERA (73.1 IP, 33 ER), with 15 walks and 67 strikeouts in his previous outings.
$\Phi$ Earned the win vs. the Royals at Target Field on April 30, allowing just one run on three hits (1 HR), with two walks and five strikeouts over 5.0 innings in a 9-1 Twins victory opposite Brady Singer - tonight's Royals starter.
क Is 3-3, 3.03 ERA (38.2 IP, 13 ER), with nine walks and 38 strikeouts in six starts vs. Kansas City at home...four of those six starts have been quality with one of the others being his 5.0 -inning one-run effort vs. the Royals at Target Field this season
$\Phi$ Set a career high with 8.0 innings pitched vs. Kansas City on September 10, 2011 while pitching for Seattle...has since tied that mark twice (5/5/15 at TOR and 6/28/15 at HOU).

SOLID STRETCH: From July 21-August 7, Pineda fashioned a 3.00 ERA ( $21.0 \mathrm{IP}, 7 \mathrm{ER}$ ), with two walks (1 intentional) and 15 strikeouts in four starts following the All-Star Break...it marked a return to form for "Big Mike," after he stumbled to an 0-3 mark with an 8.10 ERA (16.2 IP, 15 ER), three walks, eight strikeouts and a .387/.405/.627 opponent slash line (29-for-75 with 8 doubles, 2 triples, 2 home runs) in four starts from June 1-July 7.
$\Phi$ Despite the 3.00 ERA, Pineda went just 1-2 in those four starts (Minnesota was 2-2)...Pineda's 4.30 run support average is lowest among all Twins pitchers with at least six starts...he has received three-or-fewer runs in 13 of his 17 starts, two-or-fewer in 10 starts and, in seven of his starts, the Twins have been shut out or held to one run while he was in the game.

玉 In two-and-a-half seasons with the Twins, he has used his four-seam fastball more than half the time (53.2\% in 2021, 50.1\% in 2020, 54.1\% in 2019)...after a career-high $59.5 \%$ use rate as a Mariners rookie, he never topped $47.7 \%$ as a Yankee.

## CAREER NOTES

- Missed last 21 games of 2019, the entire ALDS and the first 36 contests of 2020 due to a 60game suspension for violating MLB's Joint Drug and Prevention Treatment Program - Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from Tommy John surgery on right elbow...also missed the entire 2012 campaign with New York-AL recovering from right shoulder surgery, and was out of the majors in 2013 while rehabbing.
- Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of . 198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16 -year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005...signed by Patrick Guerrero, brother of Fred Guerrero, Twins' Director of Latin American Scouting \& U.S. Integration.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
