

# Farm club defeats Jackson, Twins 10-2

Darrell Jackson, 22-year-old left-handed pitcher recently purchased by the Minnesota Twins from their Orlando farm club of the Southern League, received a rude baptism Monday night as the Twins lost to their Toledo farm club 10-2 in an exhibition game before 4,462 fans.

Jackson, only a year out of Arizona State University, gave up five hits and four runs in the first inning. The AAA Mud Hens of the International League added two doubles and two runs in the second inning. Jackson settled somewhat to pitch scoreless third and fourth innings.

"It was a little hard to judge Jackson in his first game," said Twins Vice President Howard Fox. "I think he suffered from first-game jitters. He'll stay with us, at least for the present. We didn't make any other roster changes."

First baseman John Pittman hit a home run for Toledo, one of the 11 hits the Mudhens gathered off Jackson. Greg Thayer and Mac Scarce of the Twins.
