Cabbage doubled home two runs that time, and hit a sacrifice fly in the fifth for Roy Smalley's run to make it 3-0.

Smalley, another acquisition in the first offseason deal with Texas, returned to the line-up with two hits and got on base all four times he batted with the aid of a couple of errors in the Tiger infield.

"My dislocated finger doesn't bother me much, with a 3-0 hitting," he said. "It doesn't affect my hitting. Obviously."
