

Southern stars beat Twins 3-1

The Minnesota Twins, stymied at bat by five pitchers, including two homestate products, bowed 3-1 to the Southern League All-Stars in an exhibition baseball game Tuesday in Jacksonville.

Twins starter Vic Albury, ineffective recently and possibly pitching for his job after giving up 10 runs in five innings in his last outing a week ago, took the loss but allowed only two runs in six innings. Albury gave up five hits and fanned two.

The All-Stars changed pitchers every two innings in an effort to keep the Twins guessing and did not give up an earned run. Rod Carew's third-inning double drove in Steve Brye from first base for Minnesota's lone run after an error.

Paul Siebert of Columbus, a former Edina pitcher and son of University of Minnesota baseball coach Dick Siebert, started for the Southern League team and gave up one hit in two innings. He walked one

and struck out two.

Tom Johnson of St. Paul Murray High School and the Twins' Orlando franchise pitched the seventh and eighth innings for the All-Stars and gave up two hits while striking out one.

The All-Stars, who took the early lead on Jesus De la Rosa's first-inning home run and got their third run on a homer by Fred Velasquez of Savannah off Ray Corbin in the eighth,
