

(Most of) Twins come away from Toledo winners

Toledo, Ohio

The Twins left Toledo after a 6-2 victory over their AAA farm team in an exhibition game Thursday night, but pitcher Al Williams and designated hitter Jesus Vega stayed behind.

The Twins optioned the players back to Toledo and activated designated hitter Jose Morales and infielder Bobby Randall. Morales had been on the 15-day disabled list because of a bad back. Randall had been serving as a coach since spring training.

Williams pitched the first six innings for the Twins last night, allowing the Mudhens two runs and three hits. John Verhoeven pitched the last three innings, allowing two hits, to get the victory as the Twins scored four runs in the ninth. Former Twin Gary Serum, the last of six Toledo pitchers, gave up the four runs and took the loss.

Singles by Danny Goodwin, Hosken Powell, Mike Cabbage, Sal Butera and Dave Edwards and an intentional walk to Glenn Adams provided the runs in the ninth.
