THE TWINS: Have gone 2-2 through four games on their six-game, seven-day roadtrip, going 2-1 in Seattle, followed by a loss to the Diamondbacks last night...tonight, they will play the second of three in Arizona...after tomorrow afternoon's series finale, the Twins will travel to Minneapolis to enjoy an off-day on Monday, prior to starting a six-game homestand with three against the Cleveland Guardians from Tuesday-Thursday, then three against the Rockies next weekend...Twins are 20-14 at home and 17-15 on the road.
Twins have gone 33-21 since April 21, the fourth-most wins in baseball since that date, trailing New York-AL (41-11), Houston (34-18) and New York-NL (34-19)

TWINS PHALAT IN PHOENIX: The Twins lost to the Diamondbacks last night at Chase Field by a score of 7-2...Devin Smeltzer (3-1) was the starter and loser, allowing seven runs (6 earned) on nine hits in 4.1 innings pitched...the defense committed two errors, marking just the eighth time this season with multiple errors in a game...the offense recorded 10 hits as Byron Buxton, Gary Sánchez, Luis Arraez and Jose Miranda each had two hits apiece...Buxton drove in a run with his third leadoff homer of the season (8th career) and Miranda drove in the other run with a third-inning single.
Buxton's eight career leadoff home runs are now in sole possession of sixth place on the Twins' all-time list, breaking a tie with Shannon Stewart...next up is Dan Gladden in fifth with 12.
At 446 feet, his leadoff home run last night is the second-longest leadoff homer by a Twins hitter in the Statcast Era (2015-present), behind only his 457-foot shot on September 10, 2021 vs. Kansas City.
At 113.0 mph off the bat, it was Buxton's hardest-hit ball this season and the fourth-hardest-hit home run by a Twins hitter this season.

DUEL IN THE DESERT: The Twins and D-Backs are playing each other for the 23rd time in their history...the Twins have gone 13-9 all-time against Arizona, going 4-2 at the Metrodome (2003-08), 5-1 at Target Field (2014-17) and 4-6 at Chase Field.
The Twins have lost five-straight games in Arizona, which includes a three-game series sweep in May of 2011 and a loss on June 9, 2005...their last win here came on June 8, 2005, a span of 6,219 days...in that game, the Twins won 10-0 as Johan Santana pitched a complete-game shutout with four hits allowed, no walks and nine strikeouts...the Twins lineup that day was: 1) Shannon Stewart - LF, 2) Luis Rodriguez - 2B, 3) Joe Mauer - C, 4) Torii Hunter - CF, 5) Jacque Jones - RF, 6) Justin Morneau - 1B, 7) Michael Cuddyer - 3B, 8) Juan Castro - SS, 9) Johan Santana - P
6,219 days marks the longest the Twins have gone without a win in an opposing major league ballpark, the next closest being at Dodger Stadium (6,215 days/last win on June 11, 2005).

NATIONAL TREASURE: The Twins are 0-3 in Interleague Play this season, getting swept in two games by Dodgers at Target Field from April 12-13, followed by last night's defeat...excluding this current series, the remaining IL schedule is: Colorado at Target Field from June 24-26, Milwaukee at Target Field from July 12-13 and at American Family Field from July 26-27, San Diego at Petco Park from July 29-31, Los Angeles-NL at Dodger Stadium from August 9-10, and San Francisco at Target Field from August 26-28.
Twins are looking to avoid losing four-straight games to NL opponents for the first time since losing six straight from June 29-July 4, 2018, when they were swept by the Cubs and Brewers.
Max Kepler is hitting .462 (12-for-26) with three doubles, two home runs, six RBI, six walks, a .563 on-base percentage and a 1.370 OPS in his last eight IL games.

HEAT ARRAEZ-ES: With two more hits last night, Luis Arraez raised his batting average three more points to .357...he now has 22 multi-hit games, tied for third most in the AL and tied for sixth most in baseball...he enters today leading baseball in batting average (8 points ahead of J.D. Martinez - .349) and on-base percentage at .439 (13 points ahead of Paul Goldschmidt - .426)...below are his monthly comparisons in 2022:

KISS IT GOOD-BYRON: Byron Buxton is hitting .306 (15-for-49) with three doubles, eight home runs, 12 RBI, six walks, a .393 on-base percentage, an .857 slugging percentage and a 1.250 OPS in 13 games this month...he entered June hitting .118 (8-for-68) with a .208 OBP, .221 SLG and .428 OPS in 18 games from May 7-31.
Over his last 162 games, Buxton is hitting .272 (158-for-581) with 41 doubles, 52 home runs, 96 RBI, a .611 slugging percentage and a .932 OPS...he is the fourth player in Twins history (since 1961) to hit 50-plus homers in a 162-game span, joining Nelson Cruz, Roy Sievers and Harmon Killebrew (ESPN Stats & Info).

EXIT SIGNS: The Twins put 11 balls in play last night that were measured at 100-plus mph...they enter today with an average exit velocity of 90.0 mph, the third-highest in baseball, trailing New York-AL (90.5 mph) and Toronto (90.4 mph)...among individuals with a minimum of 750 pitches seen, Carlos Correa and Byron Buxton are tied for 12th in baseball, both at 92.6 mph.

DURAN DURAN: Jhoan Duran ranks seventh among all rookies in baseball in opponent batting average at .196 (min. 25.0 IP)...additionally, he ranks second among all AL relievers in strikeouts (40) and fifth among all bullpen arms in baseball...he has thrown 147 pitches of 100-plus mph this season, the most in baseball (next is Hunter Greene - 111)...he has an average pitch velocity of 95.9 mph this season, third-highest in baseball among pitchers with at least 400 pitches thrown, trailing Los Angeles-NL's Brusdar Graterol (96.6) and Detroit's Gregory Soto (96.4).
Duran was signed by Arizona as an undrafted 16-year-old free agent on December 13, 2014...after parts of four seasons in the D-Backs organization, he was traded to Minnesota along with outfielders Ernie De La Trinidad and Gabriel Maciel on July 27, 2018, in exchange for infielder Eduardo Escobar.

BIRTHDAY SHOUTS: Third base/outfield coach Tommy Watkins is celebrating his 42nd birthday today...he shares a birthday with Pioneer Press beat writer Betsy Helfand, late Hall-of-Famer Lou Brock, country singer Blake Shelton, singer Paul McCartney and former NFL tight end Antonio Gates...the Twins won last season on Tommy and Betsy's birthdays, beating the Rangers 7-5 in 10 innings at Globe Life Field.

PREP LEGENDS NEVER DIE: Target Field hosted the 2022 Minnesota State High School League Championships yesterday...in the Class A championship, Randolph beat Hayfield by a score of 2-1...in the Class AA championship, Fairmont beat Roseau 6-0...in the Class AAA game, Benilde-St. Margaret's beat Mankato West 4-3...in the Class AAAA game, Stillwater Area beat Farmington 8-1.

Tonight will be Bundy's fourth career start and appearance against Arizona...is 2-1, 5.27 ERA (13.2 IP, 8 ER) with six walks and 12 strikeouts against the D-backs.
Is making his seventh road start this season, going 1-3, 8.54 ERA (26.2 IP, 25 ER) with seven walks and 24 strikeouts so far.
Signed with the Twins as a free agent on December 1, 2021...was previously with Los Angeles-AL (2020-21) and Baltimore (2012-19).

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor into the decision in his last start against the New York Yankees on June 9 at Target Field...tossed 4.0 innings, allowing four runs on five hits, with one walk and one strikeout in a 10-7 Twins defeat...has allowed six home runs in his last four starts, after allowing four home runs in his six starts prior...his one strikeout also marked his lowest mark in a start since June 28, 2021 at New York-AL (w/ Los Angeles-AL, 0 K)...also marked his fourth career start with one-or-fewer strikeouts...the Twins have now lost each of Bundy's last seven starts, since April 29 at Tampa Bay, after winning each of his first three from April 11-23.

TWO STARTS AGO: Was handed his third loss of the season on June 4 at Toronto...marked his shortest outing in a start since August 24, 2021 at Baltimore (w/ Los Angeles-AL)...tossed 2.1 innings, allowing six runs (5 earned), with one walk and two strikeouts in a 12-3 Twins defeat...had allowed four home runs in his last three starts combined; allowed four home runs total in his six starts prior.

SNAKEBITTEN: Bundy is making his fourth career appearance (all starts) against Arizona this evening...is 2-1, 5.27 ERA (13.2 IP, 8 ER) with six walks and 12 strikeouts in his career vs. the D-backs...his last start against them came on September 16, 2020 (with Los Angeles-AL), when he took the loss after yielding six runs (5 earned) on six hits, with two walks and two strikeouts in 2.2 innings in a 9-6 Angels defeat...won his first two starts against Arizona, combining to go 2-0, 2.45 ERA (11.0 IP, 3 ER) with four walks and 10 strikeouts from September 16, 2016-July 23, 2019.

BUMPY ROADS: Bundy will be making his seventh start on the road this season...has struggled on the road this season, going 1-3, 8.54 ERA (26.1 IP, 25 ER) with seven walks and 24 strikeouts in those starts...has shown opposite numbers when facing opponents at home this season, going 2-0, 2.29 ERA (19.2 IP, 5 ER) with three walks, 13 strikeouts and a .203 opponent batting average (15-for-74) in four home starts.

In his career, Bundy has shown slightly better numbers at home than on the road, going 25-32, 4.60 ERA (446.0 IP, 228 ER) with 132 walks and 411 strikeouts in 92 home appearances (78 starts)...compares to 24-28, 5.00 ERA (370.2 IP, 206 ER) with 135 walks and 384 strikeouts in 79 road appearances (65 starts).

INTERLEAGUE: Bundy will be making his 18th career appearance (17th start) in Interleague Play tonight...is a career 7-9, 5.30 ERA (86.2 IP, 51 ER) with 34 walks and 84 strikeouts in 17 Interleague appearances (16 starts)...in his first seven career appearances (six starts) vs. Interleague opponents, he went 4-2, 2.39 ERA (37.2 IP, 10 ER), allowing two-or-fewer runs allowed in five of those seven starts...since then, he is 3-7, 7.53 ERA (49.0 IP, 41 ER) in 10 starts.

WALKING IN STYLE: Allowed just one walk combined in his first three starts of the season; has walked at least one batter in five of his last seven starts (9 BB total)...even with his last seven starts, his walks overall equate to a career-low 4.9 walk percentage...also has a career-high first-pitch swing percentage (34.8%) and first-pitch strike percentage (67.1%).

PITCH BREAKDOWN: According to Baseball Savant, Bundy has used a five-pitch mix in his first 10 starts of this season, including a four-seam fastball, sinker, changeup, curveball and slider...below is a look at his repertoire so far this season.

STARTING OFF RIGHT: Bundy went 3-0, 0.59 ERA (15.1 IP, 1 ER) with one walk and 12 strikeouts in his first three starts this season, from April 11-23.

- Became the eighth pitcher since the current mound distance was set in 1893 to have one-or-fewer runs allowed and one-or-fewer walks allowed in his first three appearances (all starts) of the season (Elias).
Became the third pitcher in Twins/Senators history (1901-present) to toss at least 5.0 innings, allow one-or-fewer runs and walk one-or-fewer batters in each of his first three starts of the season, joining Johan Santana in 2003 and Bill Krueger in 1992 (Elias).
Posted the third lowest ERA (0.59) in Twins history within a pitcher's first three starts of the season...trailed only Fernando Romero (0.54 ERA, 5/2-5/13/18) and Ervin Santana (0.41 ERA, 4/3-4/14/17).

WELCOME TO TWINS TERRITORY: Signed a one-year contract with Minnesota on December 1, 2021...this marks his third professional organization, as he spent the previous two seasons with Los Angeles-AL (2020-21) and his first five major league seasons with Baltimore (2012-19).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP CHRIS ARCHER (2022 SEASON: 1-2, 3.35 ERA // CAREER: 62-83, 3.86 ERA)

Right-hander Chris Archer is scheduled to take the mound tomorrow afternoon in the series finale vs. Arizona...did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 3-2 victory on June 13 at Seattle, tossing 4.0 innings, allowing one unearned run on four hits, with two walks and three strikeouts...has allowed one-or-fewer runs in five of his last six starts, while going 1-1, 2.42 ERA (26.0 IP, 7 ER) with 11 walks and 15 strikeouts in that span...will make his fourth career appearance against the D-backs, going 1-1, 7.94 ERA (11.1 IP, 10 ER) with eight walks and 18 strikeouts in his prior outings.

- In 2021, spent second season with Los Angeles-AL and was the club's Opening Day starter on April 1 vs Chicago-AL, allowing three runs on six hits in 6.0 innings pitched with one walk and six strikeouts.
In 2020, spent first season with Los Angeles-NL, finished ninth in American League Cy Young voting, receiving a third place vote and two fifth place votes.
Recipient of 2020 Nick Adenhardt Award, which is voted on by Angels players to recognize the top pitching performer for the season.
Tossed third career complete game August 6, 2020 at Seattle, allowing one earned run on four hits with no walks and 10 strikeouts; marked first complete game for an Angels pitcher since Andrew Heaney, June 5, 2018 vs. Kansas City.
Ranked among 2020 AL leaders with six wins (T-4th), a 1.04 WHIP (5th), a .208 (51-for-245) opponent batting average against (6th), a 3.29 ERA (9th) and 72 strikeouts (T-9th).
Threw first career complete game on August 29, 2020 vs. Seattle, throwing a one-hit shutout with 12 strikeouts, only hit allowed was bunt single by Kyle Seager in fourth inning and was first Orioles individual one-hitter since Jason Hammel June 16, 2012 at Atlanta.
