- Making his eighth major league start and appearance of the season...also 27th career appearance (15th start).
Facing Cleveland for the second time this season and seventh time (5th start) in his career...did not factor into the decision on May 14 in his first major league start/appearance of the season (5.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R/ER, 2 BB, 2 K)...is career 1-2, 5.33 ERA (25.1 IP, 15 ER) vs. the Guardians.
Was acquired by the Twins from Los Angeles-NL on July 31, 2018 along with outfielder Luke Raley and infielder Logan Forsythe in exchange for infielder Brian Dozier.

LAST TIME OUT: Was dealt his first loss of the season on June 17 at Arizona after he allowed a career-high seven runs (6 earned) on nine hits, with two walks and three strikeouts in 4.1 innings...gave up two home runs to Jordan Luplow (2-run shot in the first and solo home run in the third)...Byron Buxton opened the game with a solo homer but the Twins fell, 7-2.

Has yielded seven home runs in his last three starts after opening his 2022 campaign with no homers in four starts.

TWO STARTS AGO: Earned his third win of the season as the Twins defeated the Tampa Bay Rays, 9-4, on June 10 at Target Field...tossed 6.0 innings (plus 3 batters in the 7th), allowing three runs (all solo home runs, including an inside-the-park HR by Randy Arozarena) on four hits, with three walks and three strikeouts.

Marked his third quality start of the season, matching Sonny Gray for second most on the Twins (Joe Ryan leads with 5).

Joined Gray as the only other Twins starter this season to allow three-or-fewer runs in his first six starts of the year.

Three-decision winning streak matched his career high for the second time, first in the same season (also won 3-straight from September 26, 2019 - August 17, 2020).

SUCCESS AS A STARTER: Over the course of his major league career, Smeltzer has gone 5-3, 3.80 ERA (73.1 IP, 31 ER) with a .239 (65-for-272) opponent batting average and .708 opponent OPS in 14 starts (twins are 8-6)...to compare, he's 2-0, 4.41 ERA (34.2 IP, 17 ER) with a .281 (38-for-135) opponent batting average and an .834 opponent OPS in 12 big league relief outings.

GUARDIANS COME TO TOWN: Facing the Guardians for the seventh time (5th start) in his career...marks his second start against Cleveland this season after facing them in his first 2022 outing on May 14 at Target Field (ND, 5.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R/ER, 2 BB, 2 K; Twins lost, 3-2 in 10 innings)...is 1-2, 5.33 ERA (25.1 IP, 15 ER) with 11 walks and 16 strikeouts in his six prior appearances.

HOME SWEET HOME: Smeltzer is making his fourth start and appearance of the season at Target Field and is 1-0, 2.00 ERA (18.0 IP, 4 ER) with six walks and 11 strikeouts in his three prior home outings...this compares to 2-1, 4.87 ERA (20.1 IP, 11 ER) with five walks and eight strikeouts in four starts away from Target Field.

Has consistently found success at home throughout his career, going 4-1, 2.51 ERA (61.0 IP, 17 ER) with 17 walks, 50 strikeouts, a 0.98 WHIP and a .199 (43-for-216) opponent batting average in 15 appearances (6 starts)...this compares to 3-2, 5.94 ERA (47.0 IP, 31 ER) with 12 walks and 25 strikeouts in 11 career road appearances (8 starts).

ARSENAL: Here's a look at Smeltzer's repertoire through his first seven starts of the 2022 season, per Baseball Savant...he throws a five-pitch mix, primarily relying on his four-seam fastball and changeup.

Prior to his May 26 outing against Kansas City, Smeltzer's wife, Brienne - a former college softball player - advised him to throw more changeups down and away when attacking hitters...he's followed her advice over his last five starts, using his changeup more often (it's now his second-most-used pitch).

Has started to throw his fastball and slider from a lower-slot arm angle this season to pair with his other offerings and better attack left-handed hitters.

Began varying the speeds of his pitches this season with the realization that throwing his fastball between 86-92 mph is better than maxing out at 89-92...aims to throw his changeup with a four-mile variance between the low and upper end.

STRIKES AND OUTS: Has been effective so far when facing hitters with two strikes, holding opponents to a .182 (12-for-66) batting average in two-strike situations this season, as well as a .193 (37-for-192) mark in his career.

THE COMEBACK IS ALWAYS STRONGER: Has worked his way back from nearly a year-long injury journey to pitch this season...lost feeling in the last three fingers of his pitching hand during 2021 spring training...placed on the 10-day Injured list on May 12, 2021 after one appearance for the Twins (April 24 vs. Pittsburgh, ND, 4.2 IP, 1 H, 1 UER, 1 BB, 3 K)...left his penultimate rehab start in June 2021 after collapsing during a pregame bullpen session, which later proved to be caused by a herniated disc in his neck...transferred to the 60-day Injured List on July 17, 2021...slowly built back up and began pitching in October 2021 before a healthy off-season...went 2-0, 0.00 ERA (11.0 IP, 0 ER) with two walks and nine strikeouts during spring training in 2022.

LOOKING BACK AT 2021: Was in Twins spring training for the second-consecutive season and was optioned to the alternate training site on March 29...recalled from the Taxi Squad on April 17...appeared in one game for the Twins on April 24 vs. Pittsburgh, allowing one unearned run on one hit in 4.2 innings of relief...marked his only appearance with the Twins or Saints on the season as he was optioned back to the alternate training site on April 25...recalled from Triple-A St. Paul on May 6 just prior to the minor league season but did not appear for the Twins...placed on the 10-day Injured List on May 12 with left elbow inflammation and missed the remainder of the season...transferred to the 60-day Injured List on July 17.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP DYLAN BUNDY (2022 SEASON: 4-3, 5.17 ERA // CAREER: 50-60, 4.75 ERA)

Right-hander Dylan Bundy is scheduled to start tomorrow night's series opener against the Colorado Rockies...earned the win on June 18 at Arizona (8.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R/ER, 0 BB, 7 K)...marked his first 6.0+ inning start of the season and tied his season high for strikeouts...will be facing Colorado for the second time in his career, after taking the 3-1 loss on July 27, 2016 at Camden Yards (with Baltimore) in his one prior start (5.2 IP, 2 H, 3 R/ER, 1 BB, 8 K)...marks his 19th appearance (18th start) in an Interleague game...is 8-9, 4.94 ERA (94.2 IP, 52 ER) previously in Interleague contests.

CAREER NOTES

- Acquired by the Twins from Los Angeles-NL, along with outfielder Luke Raley and infielder Logan Forsythe, in exchange for infielder Brian Dozier at the 2018 trade deadline.
Made Twins Opening Day roster in 2020, the first of his career...went 0-0, 4.15 ERA (4.1 IP, 2 ER) in one start and 2-0, 7.71 ERA (11.2 IP, 10 ER) in six relief appearances...four of six relief appearances were of 2.0 innings-or-more...held right-handed batters to a .269 average and left-handed batters to a .385 (5-for-13) average.
Combined to post a 3.02 ERA (104.1 IP, 32 ER) in 20 games (19 starts) between Double-A Pensacola and Triple-A Rochester, going 4-5 in 2019... Began season with Double-A Pensacola...earned the Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week and Southern League Pitcher of the Week April 14 after making two starts, going 2-0, 0.00 ERA (14.0 IP) with five hits allowed, two walks and 17 strikeouts...Made five starts with the Blue Wahoos, posting a 0.60 ERA (30.0 IP, 2 ER) before being promoted to Triple-A Rochester May 2...Went 0-1, 1.82 ERA (24.2 IP, 5 ER) in four starts for the Red Wings and had contract selected by Minnesota on May 28... Made major league debut May 28 vs. Milwaukee... became fourth Twins starter in history to throw 6.0-or-more shutout innings in his debut, joining Andrew Albers (8.1 on August 6, 2013), Anthony Swarzak (7.0 on May 23, 2009) and Eric Milton (6.0 on April 5, 1998).
Became the ninth New Jersey-born player (7th pitcher) to make his debut for the Twins, and the first since RHP Rob Delaney on Sept. 4, 2010.
Won the National Junior College Athletic Association Player of the Week award for April 4-10, 2016, after throwing a complete game no-hitter in an 8-0 win over Wharton County Junior College, in wherein he struck out 16 batters and walked three.
Was originally selected by the San Diego Padres in the 33rd round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft, but chose to continue his development at Florida Gulf Coast University.
Smeltzer was set to transfer to Texas Tech University for the 2017 season, but signed with Los Angeles-NL after being drafted in the fifth round (No. 161 overall).
