THE MALL BALL RATS: The Twins completed their five-game roadtrip in Cleveland with a record of 2-3, suffering two consecutive walk-offs on Wednesday night and Thursday afternoon... tonight, the Twins will begin a short three-game homestand with a weekend series against the Orioles... Twins are 23-17 at home and 20-19 on the road.

☞ Twins have the fourth-most home wins in the AL and seventh-most in baseball.

STRANGER THINGS: The Twins lost to the Guardians yesterday afternoon at Progressive Field by a score of 5-3, suffering their second-consecutive walk-off defeat and third on the season... Chris Archer was the starter but did not factor in the decision, allowing one run on one hit in 4.0 innings pitched with a career-high tying six walks... Twins pitchers combined for a season-high 10 walks... the offense recorded seven hits, as Jose Miranda drove in all three Twins runs with a third-inning double... the starting staff finished the series going 2-0, 1.29 ERA (28.0 IP, 4 ER) while the bullpen went 0-3, 4.96 ERA (16.1 IP, 9 ER) with three blown saves.

OPEN THE (BULLPEN) GATE: The Twins announced today that they have named **Pete Maki** pitching coach... Maki replaces Wes Johnson, who accepted the role of pitching coach at Louisiana State University... Maki, 39, began the 2022 season as the club's bullpen coach, his third campaign in that role... the Lufkin, Texas native originally joined the Twins organization prior to the 2018 season as minor league pitching coordinator and has been part of the club's major league staff since 2020, when he served as interim bullpen coach... prior to joining Minnesota, he worked as an assistant coach at the University of New Haven (2006-07), as assistant pitching coach at Columbia University (2008-15) and as the pitching coach at Duke University (2015-17)... additionally, **Colby Suggs** has been named bullpen coach... Suggs, 30, has been with the Twins since 2019 and held several roles, including coordinator of run prevention from 2021-2022 and advance scout from 2019-20... prior to joining the Twins, he held the position of bullpen coach at the University of Arkansas in 2018 and coached at private facilities from 2016-17... the Sulphur Springs, Texas native was the 73rd overall pick by Miami in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft and pitched four minor league seasons in the Marlins organization from 2013-16, after pitching for the University of Arkansas from 2011-13.

RUNNING UP THAT HILL: Twins starters have combined to go 6-2, 2.13 ERA (72.0 IP, 17 ER) with 14 walks, 49 strikeouts, a .212 opponent batting average and seven quality starts in their last 13 games... below are the starters, the last time through the rotation:

TWINS AND THE DEM-O'S-GORGON: The Twins and Orioles are playing each other for the fifth of seven scheduled meetings this season... these two teams played a four-game series from May 2-5 at Camden Yards as the Twins won the first two but lost games three and four... since the start of 2018, the Twins are 18-5 vs. the Orioles.

☞ The Twins are 34-16 vs. Baltimore since the start of 2014... that marks the most wins against Baltimore among non-American League Central teams in that span.

☞ Gary Sanchez has 20 home runs in 65 career games vs. the O's, his most vs. any opponent.

☞ Gio Urshela is hitting .349 (45-for-129) with nine doubles, six home runs, 26 RBI, a .394 on-base percentage and a .953 OPS in 40 career games against the O's.

☞ Max Kepler has hit safely in 18 of 22 career games against the Orioles, hitting .383 (31-for-81) with seven doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 22 RBI, 10 walks, a .446 OBP and a 1.273 OPS... he has seven homers and 11 RBI in his last 14 games against Baltimore.

THE BUCK-SIDE DOWN: Byron Buxton hit his 20th home run of the season Tuesday night, setting a single-season career-high, passing his previous high of 19, done last season... he enters today fifth in the AL in home runs, trailing Aaron Judge (29), Yordan Alvarez (23), Mike Trout (23) and Anthony Rizzo (21)... 14 of his 20 homers have come at Target Field... he has 45 career home runs at Target Field, seventh-most in the park's history, needing two to tie Nelson Cruz (47) for sixth.

☞ In Buxton's last 162 games, he is hitting .266 (155-for-582) with 36 doubles, two triples, 52 home runs, 95 RBI, 113 runs scored, a .603 slugging percentage and a .923 OPS... Twins are 92-70 in those games... he is on pace for 41 home runs this season.

THE HELLFIRE-BALLER CLUB: Joao Duran ranks second in the AL in relief strikeouts with 46, trailing only Michael King (56) and one spot ahead of teammate Griffin Jax (44)... Duran has thrown 177 pitches of 100-plus mph this season, the most in baseball (next is Emmanuel Clase - 130)... he has an average pitch velocity of 95.8 mph this season, fourth-highest in baseball among pitchers with at least 400 pitches thrown, trailing Clase (97.4), Brusdar Graterol (96.8) and Gregory Soto (96.3).

☞ Duran's 4-seam fastball has averaged 100.6 mph, his curveball has averaged 87.5 mph, and his splitter has averaged 96.2 mph, all the highest in baseball.

ELEVEN: Jorge Polanco went 0-for-5 yesterday afternoon, snapping his on-base streak at 12 games... in his last 13 games, dating back to June 1, he is hitting .306 (15-for-49) with two doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks, a .393 on-base percentage and a .923 OPS... in July of 2021, Polo hit .327 (34-for-104) with a .914 OPS in 26 games... in fact, from June 1, 2021 through the end of the season, he hit 28 home runs with a .551 slugging percentage and an .881 OPS in 104 games.

THE POL-LU-WOG: Luis Arraez enters the day second in baseball in batting average (.340) and on-base percentage (.420), trailing Paul Goldschmidt in both (.342/.424)... he recorded his 28th multi-hit game yesterday afternoon, which leads baseball... he is hitting .369 (72-for-195) against right-handed pitching, compared to .236 (13-for-55) against lefties... additionally, he is hitting .404 (21-for-52) in the first inning this season.

SUPER-STARCOURT MALL: Carlos Correa has a hard hit rate of 49.4%, which is in the top 9% of the league and also a career-high, up from 42.7% in 2021, a 6.7% increase... additionally, he has a 91.8 mph average exit velocity this season, also the highest of his career.

☞ Correa is hitting .352 (56-for-159) with 10 doubles, eight home runs, 25 RBI, a .409 on-base percentage, a .566 slugging percentage and a .975 OPS in his last 40 games, dating back to April 28.

DUFF-ER BROTHERS: Tyler Duffey struck out four batters over 1.2 innings pitched in Cleveland yesterday afternoon, including striking out the side in the sixth inning, fanning Amed Rosario, José Ramirez and Josh Naylor... he enters tonight with a 10.0-scoreless innings streak, which is tied for 14th-longest active streak in the AL, tied for eighth among relievers.

MAX: Max Kepler enters today with a team-leading 35 walks and has a 12.8 walk percentage this season, ranking in the top 8% of the league... he ranks sixth in the AL and ninth in baseball in expected on-base percentage (xOBP) at .396, while teammate Luis Arraez ranks 9th/12th at .386... additionally, Kepler has seven outs above average, tied with Brett Phillips for most among rightfielders.

Facing Baltimore for the second time both this season and in his career...did not factor into the decision in the Twins' 7-2 win on May 3 at Oriole Park at Camden Yards (4.2 IP, 6 H, 2 R/ER, 1 BB, 3 K). Acquired by the Twins from Tampa Bay on July 22, 2021, along with right-handed pitcher Drew Strotman, in exchange for designated hitter Nelson Cruz.

LAST TIME OUT: Ryan earned the win in his last start in June 26 vs. Colorado, a 6-3 Twins victory...yielded three runs on a career-high eight hits, with one walk and one strikeout in 5.0 innings pitched...marked his first career start with just one strikeout.

Tossed 102 pitches, the third time this season and in his professional career in which he threw over 100 (also 101 on June 21 vs. Cleveland and 103 on May 15 vs. Cleveland)...became the first Twins rooking pitcher to throw 100-plus pitches in consecutive games since Adalberto Mejia did so in three-straight starts from June 23-July 3, 2017 (104, 101, 102).

TWO STARTS AGO: Did not factor into the decision in the first game of the Twins' last homestand on June 21 vs. Cleveland, a 6-5 Twins loss in 11 innings...allowed three runs on a then-career-high seven hits, with one walk and seven strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work...yielded one run on three hits in the first inning, his most hits allowed in the first inning in his career.

Marked his sixth career quality start and team-leading fifth this season...also marked the first of his six quality starts that the Twins have lost. Also recorded his second career pickoff (also second this season), nabbing Steven Kwan at first base in the third inning...enters today tied for third in the majors in pitcher pickoffs.

LEADING THE WAY: Enters today among rookie pitchers in a few categories (min. 40.0 IP).

BIRDWATCHING IN THE EAST: Is facing Baltimore for the second time this season and in his career...did not factor into the decision of a 7-2 Twins win on May 3 at Oriole Park at Camden Yards...worked 4.2 innings, allowing two runs on six hits, with one walk, two hit batters and three strikeouts.

Tonight marks his third career start and appearance against the American League East division, facing Baltimore and Boston this season...is 1-0, 2.53 ERA (10.2 IP, 3 ER) with one walk and 10 strikeouts in his two prior starts against the division.

TAKING THE NIGHT SHIFT: Is starting under the lights for the seventh time this season...has a 2-2 record, 3.94 ERA (32.0 IP, 14 ER) with 11 walks and 31 strikeouts in his six prior night starts...this compares to 4-1, 2.33 ERA (27.0 IP, 7 ER) with six walks and 22 strikeouts in five day starts.

GETTING BACK ON TARGET: Making his seventh start at Target Field this season...has gone 3-2, 3.66 ERA (32.0 IP, 13 ER) with 12 walks and 29 strikeouts at home...this compares to 3-1, 2.67 ERA (27.0 IP, 8 ER) with five walks and 24 strikeouts in five starts on the road.

Has performed better on the road throughout his career, going 5-1, 2.31 ERA (39.0 IP, 10 ER) with six walks and 39 strikeouts in seven starts...is a career 3-3, 4.44 ERA (46.2 IP, 23 ER) with 16 walks and 44 strikeouts in nine starts at Target Field.

THE ARSENAL: Ryan has displayed a four-pitch mix so far in his career, relying primarily on his fastball - he threw it 65.8% of the time in 2021 and has thrown it 58.2% of the time through his first 11 starts of 2022...here's a look at the rookie's repertoire this season, per Baseball Savant.

MAKING THE LORAX PROUD: In partnership with Players for the Planet, Ryan is having 50 trees planted for each strikeout he records during the 2022 season; he's fanned 53 batters so far, which will lead to 2,650 new trees planted.

THE JOE RYAN EXPERIENCE: Below are some facts that summarize Ryan's career to date.

- Ryan has 83 career strikeouts through his first 16 games, tied with Tyler Duffey for most in Twins/Senators history through a pitcher's first 16 career games...the record for most strikeouts in the first 17 career games is 89, held by Duffey. His .205 opponent batting average through his first 16 career games is third lowest in Twins/Senators history (min. 70.0 IP), behind George Dumont (.172 from 1915-16) and Dave Boswell (.201 from 1964-65). Owns a 3.77 strikeout-to-walk ratio (83 K, 22 BB) through his first 16 career outings, fourth best in Twins/Senators history (min. 70.0 IP), behind teammate Bailey Ober (4.53 in 2021), Doc Ayers (4.50 from 1913-14) and Kevin Slowey (4.46 from 2007-08). Ryan posted a 0.74 WHIP through his first nine career starts, the lowest WHIP by any MLB pitcher through his first nine career starts since Hall of Famer Christy Mathewson from 1900-01 (0.70) (Stats Perform). Ryan worked at least 5.0 innings and allowed four-or-fewer base runners in each of his first four career games (from September 1-22, 2021), the only pitcher in baseball history (1901-present) to do so. He became one of two pitchers in MLB history (1901-present) to toss at least 5.0 innings and allow three-or-fewer hits in each of his first four career games (September 1-22, 2021), alongside San Francisco's Matt Cain, who did so in 2005.

- 2022 marks his fifth professional season, including 2020. Made his major league debut for the Twins on September 1, 2021 vs. Chicago-NL (L, 5.0 IP, 3 H, 3 R/3 ER, 1 HR, 1 BB, 5 K). Helped Team USA win the silver medal in baseball at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics...went 1-0, 1.74 ERA (10.1 IP, 2 ER), one walk and eight strikeouts in two starts. Acquired by the Twins on July 22, 2021 from the Tampa Bay Rays, alongside right-handed pitcher Drew Strotman, in exchange for designated hitter Nelson Cruz...learned about the trade while in Japan with Team USA. In 2020, was part of the Rays 60-man player pool and spent the summer at the alternate training site in Port Charlotte, Florida...ranked by Baseball America as the No. 12 prospect in the Rays system following the season. In 2019, was named Rays minor league Pitcher of the Year after going 9-4, 1.96 ERA (123.2 IP, 27 ER) in his first full professional season...divided the year between Single-A Bowling Green (6 starts), Single-A Charlotte (15 games, 13 starts) and Double-A Montgomery (3 starts). Garnered several other awards in 2019, including: MiLB.com organization All-Star honors, Baseball America High Class A All-Star, two-time Florida State League Pitcher of the Week (June 17-23 and August 5-11) and Rays minor league Pitcher of the Month for July and August. Made professional debut in 2018 for Short-A Hudson Valley...went 2-1, 3.72 ERA (36.1 IP, 15 ER) in 12 games (7 starts) for the Renegades, with 14 walks and 51 strikeouts...earned the win in his professional debut on June 22 vs. Vermont, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings (2 H, 3 K). Selected by the Rays in the seventh round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of Division II California State University, Stanislaus. Went 8-1, 1.65 ERA (98.1 IP, 18 ER) in 14 starts as a senior at Stanislaus and led all divisions of college baseball with 127 strikeouts...earned three selections to All-America teams, including first team All-America honors by the Division II Conference Commissioners Association...pitched three seasons at California State University, Northridge before transferring to Stanislaus.
