THE TWINS: Have gone 2-3 through five games on their six-game, seven-day roadtrip, going 1-2 on the South Side of Chicago, followed by consecutive losses in Arlington...today, the Twins will play the three-game series finale at Globe Life Field...

THE TWINS are now .500 on the road for the first time since being 8-8 on May 17...they are looking to avoid falling under .500 on the road for the first time since being 4-5 on April 30. Twins are looking to avoid setting a season high with four straight-losses...they have lost three straight four times this season...their last four-game losing streak came August 31-September 4, 2021, when they lost two to the Cubs and two to the Rays.

RANGER DANGER IN GAME TWO FOR TWINS: The Twins lost to the Rangers yesterday afternoon at Globe Life Field by a score of 9-7...Devin Smeltzer was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing a career-high seven earned runs on eight hits in 3.1 innings pitched...Jhoan Duran (0-3) was issued the loss, allowing two runs on three hits in the eighth inning...

THE LONE STAR STATS: The Twins and Rangers are playing each other today for the third of seven scheduled meetings in 2022...the Twins will host the Rangers for four games from August 19-22...since the start of last season, all nine games between these two have been decided by three runs-or-fewer, while four games have been decided by one run...the Twins have 10-6 vs. the Rangers in their last 16 games (since 2019).

Twins have scored 6.1 runs-per-game against Texas since 2019, the best in baseball...they have scored 5.9 runs-per-game against the Rangers dating back to 2015, also leading baseball.

Luis Arraez has reached safely in all 13 career games against the Rangers, hitting .333 (17-for-51) with three doubles, one triple, two home runs, four walks, a .382 on-base percentage and a .931 OPS.

Carlos Correa is hitting .346 (36-for-104) with 14 doubles, eight home runs, 26 RBI, a .382 on-base percentage, a .712 slugging percentage and a 1.093 OPS in his last 25 road games against the Rangers...he has hit safely in eight-straight games against the Rangers overall (home or away); he has hit three home runs and has nine RBI in his last six games against Texas...his 20 career home runs vs. the Rangers are his most against any opponent.

ARRAEZ-ING BACK TO THE TOP: Luis Arraez enters today leading baseball is batting average and passed Paul Goldschmidt yesterday in on-base percentage to reclaim baseball's top spot...below are his MLB rankings in a few offensive categories:

ADDITIONALLY: He also leads baseball in multi-hit games (32), batting average vs. right-handed pitching (.383), batting average against fastballs (.412), and ranks second in RISP average (.404).

POLO ON THE MARK: In his last 16 games, dating back to June 7, Jorge Polanco is hitting .305 (18-for-59) with two doubles, six home runs, 15 RBI, 10 walks, a .400 on-base percentage, a .644 slugging percentage and a 1.044 OPS.

Since July 1 of 2021, he has collected 28 doubles, 36 home runs and 111 RBI, with a .506 slugging percentage and an .837 OPS in 149 games...since that date, he ranks fifth in the AL in RBI, ninth in home runs and 10th in slugging percentage.

C4: Carlos Correa is hitting .321 (59-for-184) with 11 doubles, nine home runs, 28 RBI, a .386 on-base percentage, a .527 slugging percentage and a .914 OPS in his last 47 games, dating back to April 28, tied for ninth-best batting average in the majors in that span (min. 150 AB)...additionally, Correa has reached safely in nine consecutive road games.

MIRANDA RIGHTS: Jose Miranda is hitting .310 (36-for-116) with 10 doubles, six home runs, 24 RBI, a .552 slugging percentage and an .896 OPS in his last 38 games, since May 20...since that date (minimum 100 at-bats), he leads all MLB rookies in batting average, is second in slugging percentage and OPS, and third in on-base percentage.

SERIES FINALE: The Twins are looking to avoid being swept for the third time this season...their previous sweeps were in two games vs. Los Angeles-NL from April 12-13 and three games vs. Houston from May 10-12, both at Target Field...Texas' last sweep of the Twins came in three games from April 13-15, 2012 at Target Field...their last sweep in Texas came in three games from July 8-10, 2003 at Globe Life Park.

TWINS MINOR LEAGUE WEEKLYS: Double-A Wichita outfielder Matt Wallner and Triple-A St. Paul right-handed pitcher Ronny Henriquez are the Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week:

- Wallner, who was recently named to the AL Team for the SiriusXM Futures Game on July 16 at Dodger Stadium, played in five games for the Wind Surge, hitting .333 (6-for-18) with one double, two home runs, four RBI, four walks, a .458 on-base percentage and a 1.181 OPS...the Forest Lake, MN native was selected by the Twins 39th overall in the 2019 draft out of the University of Southern Mississippi. Henriquez, 22, appeared in one game in relief this week for the Saints on Thursday at Louisville, pitching 4.0 shutout innings with four hits allowed, no walks and four strikeouts...he was acquired by the Twins over the offseason in a trade with Texas, along with infielder Isiah Kiner-Falefa, in exchange for Mitch Garver...Henriquez is 1-1, 3.80 ERA (23.2 IP, 10 ER) with eight walks, 27 strikeouts and a .236 opponent batting average in his last five games (3 starts) for the Saints.

ANALYST ANALYSIS: Random facts on Bally Sports North Analysts, Glen Perkins and LaTroy Hawkins:

- Perkins went 6-1, 3.15 ERA (34.1 IP, 12 ER) with just two home runs allowed, eight walks, 26 strikeouts and five saves in 21 career games (3 starts) against the Texas Rangers...Perk's first career win came against the Rangers in a start on May 20, 2008 at the Metrodome, allowing three runs (2 earned) on six hits in 6.1 innings pitched in a Twins 11-4 victory...the last win of his career in Minnesota came against the Rangers on August 11, 2015 at Target Field, as the Twins walked-off Texas with an Eduardo Escobar double, scoring Kurt Suzuki in the bottom of the ninth inning. Hawkins 75th and final win of his career came against the Rangers at Globe Life Park on August 25, 2015, pitching for the Blue Jays...Hawk had a career ERA of 3.03 (59.0 IP, 20 ER) in 41 games against Texas...26 of his final 27 appearances against the Rangers were scoreless from May 21, 2002-August 27, 2015 (0.34 ERA).

- Making his 15th start of the season and 148th of his career...176th career appearance. Facing the Rangers for the 12th time in his career, making his 10th start...is 6-2, 3.12 ERA (57.2 IP, 20 ER) with 15 walks and 55 strikeouts in his prior outings against Texas. Signed with the Twins as a free agent on December 1, 2021...was previously with Los Angeles-AL (2020-21) and Baltimore (2012-19).

LAST TIME OUT: Was the Twins' starting pitcher on July 4 as they took on the White Sox in Chicago to start this current roadtrip...yielded three hits and one run (José Abreu solo HR in 2nd inning), with one walk and six strikeouts in a 5.0-inning no-decision...after the White Sox tied the game at 2-2 in the bottom of the seventh, the Twins scored three runs in the top of the 10th inning and held off a Chicago rally in the bottom of the frame to win, 6-3.

- Marked Bundy's eighth start this season with one-or-fewer runs allowed, second most among Twins starting pitchers (Chris Archer - 9 such starts). Allowed four base runners in the start, tied with his outings on April 23, May 17 and June 18 for his second fewest in a start this season...yielded just three in his start on April 11.

TWO STARTS AGO: Allowed three runs (2 earned) on six hits, with one walk and one strikeout in 5.0 innings pitched in a no-decision at Cleveland on June 29...loaded the bases on three-straight singles to begin the bottom of the first inning; two of those runners would score on a Franmil Reyes RBI ground out and a throwing error by second baseman Luis Arraez...the Guardians also piloted one run in the bottom of the third inning on a Josh Naylor sacrifice fly...the game went to extra innings tied at 3-3 and the Twins scored three runs in the top of the 10th...Cleveland scored four in the bottom half of the frame to walk off on Josh Naylor's two-out, two-run home run to win, 7-6.

BUNDY, TEXAS WRANGLER: Bundy is making his 12th career appearance and 10th start against Texas today; is 6-2, 3.12 ERA (57.2 IP, 20 ER) with 15 walks, 55 strikeouts and a 1.06 WHIP in his prior outings...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings (1 H, 1 BB, 3 K) in his first two outings against the Rangers, both in relief; each of his last nine outings have been starts...six wins are his most against any single opponent in his career, while his 3.12 ERA is his third lowest (min. 4 starts) behind his marks against Seattle (2.44 ERA, 7 GS) and Cleveland (2.96 ERA, 5 GS).

- Faced the Rangers twice in 2021 while pitching for Los Angeles-AL, going a cumulative 1-1, 3.97 ERA (11.1 IP, 5 ER) with four walks and 12 strikeouts...took the loss on April 19 at Angel Stadium (5.0 IP, 7 H, 5 R/ER, 1 HR, 2 BB, 6 K) and earned the win on August 5 at Globe Life Field (6.1 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 6 K). Bundy is 3-1, 1.88 ERA (28.2 IP, 6 ER) with eight walks, 31 strikeouts, a 1.01 WHIP and a .206 (21-for-102) opponent batting average in six career games (4 starts) at Texas...has won each of his last three starts in Arlington, owning a 2.41 ERA (18.2 IP, 5 ER) with five walks and 22 strikeouts in that span. Owns two career starts at Globe Life Field, in 2020 and 2021; is a perfect 2-0, 1.32 ERA (13.2 IP, 2 ER) with three walks, 18 strikeouts, a 0.73 WHIP and a .146 (7-for-48) opponent batting average at this ballpark.

ON THE ROAD: Bundy will be making his 10th start away from Target Field this season...has struggled on the road this season, going 2-3, 5.89 ERA (44.1 IP, 29 ER) with nine walks, 38 strikeouts and a .302 (55-for-182) opponent batting average in nine starts...has pitched better when facing opponents at home this season, going 2-1, 2.10 ERA (25.2 IP, 6 ER) with five walks, 15 strikeouts and a .200 (19-for-95) opponent batting average.

- Is 1-0, 2.00 ERA (18.0 IP, 4 ER) with two walks and 14 strikeouts in his last three road starts, since his 8.0-inning, one-run outing on June 18 at Arizona...had gone 0-1, 9.72 ERA (8.1 IP, 9 ER) with one walk and five strikeouts combined in his two road starts before this stretch (May 30-June 4).

A QUALITY QUARTET: Has pitched well in his last four starts, going 1-1, 1.88 ERA (24.0 IP, 5 ER) with four walks, 16 strikeouts, a 0.88 WHIP and a .202 (17-for-84) opponent batting average since June 18...has allowed exactly one run in three of his four outings in this current stretch (June 18 at Arizona, June 24 at Cleveland and July 4 at Chicago-AL).

KEEP UP THE TEMPO: Has an average pitch tempo of 15.9 seconds between pitches with the bases empty, per Baseball Savant...is the fastest worker on the Twins current active roster (min. 100 pitches) with the bases empty, trailing Cole Sands (14.0 seconds) and Bailey Ober (15.7 seconds) overall...works faster than the league average of 18.1 seconds...his pitch tempo falls to 22.4 seconds when there are runners on base, the sixth fastest on the active roster and seventh fastest worker for the Twins this season.

PITCH BREAKDOWN: According to Baseball Savant, Bundy has used a five-pitch mix in his first 14 starts of this season, including a four-seam fastball, slider, changeup, sinker and curveball...below is a look at his repertoire so far this season.

STARTING OFF RIGHT: Bundy went 3-0, 0.59 ERA (15.1 IP, 1 ER) with one walk and 12 strikeouts in his first three starts this season, from April 11-23.

- Became the eighth pitcher since the current mound distance was set in 1893 to have one-or-fewer runs allowed and one-or-fewer walks allowed in his first three appearances (all starts) of the season (Elias). Became the third pitcher in Twins/Senators history (1901-present) to toss at least 5.0 innings, allow one-or-fewer runs and walk one-or-fewer batters in each of his first three starts of the season, joining Johan Santana in 2003 and Bill Krueger in 1992 (Elias). Posted the third lowest ERA (0.59) in Twins history within a pitcher's first three starts of the season...trailed only Fernando Romero (0.54 ERA, 5/2-5/13/18) and Ervin Santana (0.41 ERA, 4/3-4/14/17).

TUESDAY'S STARTER - RHP JOSH WINDER [2022 SEASON: 4-2, 3.12 ERA // CAREER: 4-2, 3.12 ERA]

Rookie right-hander Josh Winder is scheduled to start Tuesday's series opener against the Milwaukee Brewers at Target Field, after tomorrow's off-day...earned his fourth career win in his last start on July 5 at Chicago-AL, working 5.0 innings and allowing two runs on seven hits, with two walks and three strikeouts as the Twins defeated the White Sox, 8-2...was recalled from Triple-A St. Paul just prior to that start, when Chris Archer was placed on the 15-day Injured List...will be facing Milwaukee for the first time in his career, as well as his second career appearance (1st start) against the National League; made his major league debut in relief on April 12 vs. the Los Angeles Dodgers (1.0 IP, 0 H, 1 R/ER, 2 BB, 1 K).

CAREER NOTES

- In 2021, spent second season with Los Angeles-AL and was the club's Opening Day starter on April 1 vs Chicago-AL, allowing three runs on six hits in 6.0 innings pitched with one walk and six strikeouts. In 2020, spent first season with Los Angeles-NL, finished ninth in American League Cy Young voting, receiving a third place vote and two fifth place votes. Recipient of 2020 Nick Adenhardt Award, which is voted on by Angels players to recognize the top pitching performer for the season. Tossed third career complete game August 6, 2020 at Seattle, allowing one earned run on four hits with no walks and 10 strikeouts; marked first complete game for an Angels pitcher since Andrew Heaney, June 5, 2018 vs. Kansas City. Ranked among 2020 AL leaders with six wins (T-4th), a 1.04 WHIP (5th), a .208 (51-for-245) opponent batting average against (6th), a 3.29 ERA (9th) and 72 strikeouts (T-9th). Threw first career complete game on August 29, 2020 vs. Seattle, throwing a one-hit shutout with 12 strikeouts, only hit allowed was bunt single by Kyle Seager in fourth inning and was first Orioles individual one-hitter since Jason Hammel June 16, 2012 at Atlanta. Became 17th Orioles pitcher to record 10 wins in rookie season and first since Wei-Yin Chen (12 wins in 2012). Named Orioles top prospect according to Baseball America and Baseball Prospectus following the 2014 season. Underwent Tommy John surgery on right elbow June 27 2013, performed by Dr. James Andrews. Named Carolina League 2012 Midseason All-Star and Baseball America Minor League All-Star. Named Orioles Minor League Pitcher of the Month in April, 2012 (30 consecutive scoreless IP) and named Orioles top prospect by Baseball America following the season. Originally selected by Baltimore in the first round (4th overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.
