THE NEXT EPISODE: The Twins have gone 1-2 through three games on their five-game, seven-day southern California roadtrip, getting swept at Dodger Stadium earlier this week, followed by a win in Anaheim last night...tonight, the Twins will play the second of three at Angel Stadium...following tomorrow afternoon's game, the Twins will travel home and begin a seven-game, eight-day homestand with three against the Royals (August 15-17) and four against the Rangers (August 19-22)...it will mark the start of a stretch of 13 home games in 17 days to finish August, which includes three road games and one off day.

MAHLE AND URSHELA PROVIDE FRIDAY SOUNDTRACK: The Twins shut out the Angels in Anaheim last night by a score of 4-0...Tyler Mahle made his second start as a Twin, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, two walks and six strikeouts...it marked the first time for a Twins starter to pitch at least 6.0 shutout innings since Josh Winder did it on June 28 at Cleveland...the offense recorded nine hits, highlighted by Gio Urshela, who went 3-for-4 and fell a triple short of the cycle...Gilberto Celestino started the scoring with a two-run homer in the second inning, his first homer of the season and third of his career. The win snapped a three-game losing streak as Minnesota remains one of three teams in baseball yet to post a losing streak of four-plus games in 2022, joining New York-NL and Atlanta.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN ME AND YOU?: Tonight marks the second of six scheduled meetings with the Angels this season...Target Field will host the Angels at Target Field for three games from September 23-25.

Twins are 21-14 in their last 35 meetings with the Angels, dating back to September of 2015. Since 2018, 15 of 21 games between these two teams have been decided by three runs-or-less. Max Kepler is hitting .295 (31-for-105) with five doubles, six home runs, 12 RBI, 16 walks, a .403 on-base percentage and a .918 OPS in 32 career games against the Angels...in his last six games at Angel Stadium, he is hitting .435 (10-for-23) with five walks, a .536 on-base percentage, a .696 slugging percentage and a 1.231 OPS. Luis Arraez is hitting .360 (9-for-25) with two walks and a .913 OPS in seven career games vs. the Angels...all in Anaheim. Gary Sanchez has homered four times in 12 career games at Angel Stadium (.927 OPS).

TOP DOGG: Luis Arraez is hitting .556 (10-for-18) with five doubles, one walk and three RBI in his last four games...at 124 hits, he needs two to match his single season career-high of 126, done last season...he enters today as the MLB leader in batting average at .332, one point ahead of St. Louis' Paul Goldschmidt (.331)...below are his AL ranks in a few offensive categories:

KEEP THEIR HEADS RINGIN': Carlos Correa is hitting .294 (96-for-327) with 22 doubles, 16 home runs, 65 RBI, a .363 on-base percentage, a .508 slugging percentage and an .871 OPS in 87 career games against the Angels...the 65 RBI are his most vs. any opponent and the 16 home runs are his second-most (Texas - 20)...additionally, his 65 RBI are sixth-most among actives.

STILL BUNDY: Dylan Bundy pitched two seasons for the Angels from 2020-21, going 8-12, 4.89 ERA (156.1 IP, 85 ER) in 34 games (30 starts), including an Opening Day start in 2021...he finished the 2020 season with a record of 6-3, 3.29 ERA (65.2 IP, 24 ER), 17 walks, 72 strikeouts, a .208 opponent average and a 1.04 WHIP in 11 starts, finishing ninth in the AL Cy Young Award voting, his first time garnering Cy Young votes in his career...he was acquired by the Angels via trade with Baltimore on December 4, 2019, in exchange for right-handed pitchers Kyle Brnovich, Zach Peek, Kyle Bradish and Isaac Mattson...he is making his 20th career start at Angel Stadium (23rd appearance).

LAY LOW ON THE SCOREBOARD: Last night marked the 10th shutout for the Twins this season, tied for fifth-most in the AL and tied for eighth-most in baseball...they had nine shutouts in 2021...10 marks their most since they had 11 in 2017...their most in a season is 18, done in 1967 and 1973...their most since 1990 is 13 in one season, done in 1990, 1992 and 2010.

NUTHIN' BUT A GIO THANG: After going 3-for-4 last night, Gio Urshela now has nine three-hit games, second on the club (Arraez - 13) and tied for 12th-most in the AL...in his last 21 games, since July 2, he is hitting .314 (22-for-70) with five doubles, one triple, four home runs, 13 RBI, a .586 slugging percentage and a .910 OPS.

YOUNG, WILD AND FREE: In 60 games, since May 20, Jose Miranda is hitting .332 (66-for-199) with a .923 OPS...among all AL players since that date (minimum 100 PA), he ranks fifth in batting average, sixth in OPS and slugging (.548), and 11th in RBI (44). Among all AL rookies with a minimum of 200 at-bats this season, he ranks second in batting average (.282) and slugging percentage (.472), third in OPS (.799) and fourth in on-base percentage (.327).

BUXPLOSIVE: Byron Buxton has homered at least once in nine consecutive road series: Toronto, Seattle, Arizona, Cleveland, Chicago-AL, Texas, Milwaukee, San Diego and Los Angeles-NL...he has homered in five of his last eight road games. He has 97 career home runs, needing three to become the 19th Twin to reach 100 career homers (since 1961)...last Twin to reach 100 was Max Kepler on September 20, 2020 at Chicago-NL.

STRAIGHT OUTTA CONCORDIA: St. Paul native Louie Varland made his Triple-A debut last night for the Saints in a start against Columbus at CHS Field in St. Paul...the right-hander carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning and finished the night with one hit allowed, two walks and eight strikeouts in 5.1 innings pitched, earning the win...he was selected by the Twins in the 15th round of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft out of Concordia University - approximately four miles from the Saints' ballpark.

THIS THAT AND THIS, THAT THIS AND THAT:

Twins will host National PLAY Campaign on Tuesday, August 16, which promotes the importance of children living a healthy lifestyle and disability inclusion...in 2014, the PLAY Campaign became the first program in professional sports to include children with disabilities...PBATS partnered with the National Down Syndrome Society in 2017 to enhance this effort...members of the Twins' athletic training staff and players from the Minnesota Twin Youth Baseball Leagues will participate in the event...it will take place at Target Field from 10am-12pm. The Twins have homered in 15 of their last 16 away from Target Field since July 4, hitting 30 road homers since that date, tied with New York-AL for the most in baseball. Angels manager, Phil Nevin, played 16 games for the AL Central Champion Twins in 2006...Nevin was acquired by the Twins via trade with Chicago-NL (for IF Adam Harben) at the trade waiver deadline on August 31 and hit .190 (8-for-42) with one double, one home run, four RBI, 10 walks and a .340 on-base percentage down the stretch.

- Making his 20th start of the season...also his 153rd career start and 181st appearance.
Spent 2020-21 with Los Angeles-AL, including serving as the Angels' Opening Day starter in 2021...facing his former team for the sixth time (fifth start) in his career and first since 2019.
Signed with the Twins as a free agent on December 1, 2021...was previously with Los Angeles-AL (2020-21) and Baltimore (2012-19).

LAST TIME OUT: Bundy did not factor into the decision in his last start on August 6 against the Toronto Blue Jays at Target Field...allowed two runs on five hits (1 home run), with one walk and six strikeouts in 4.0 innings of work...

Bundy departed with the score tied 2-2; the Twins scored one run in the fifth, two runs in the sixth and two more in the eighth to win, 7-3.

TWO STARTS AGO: Bundy took the loss on July 31 at San Diego, as the Twins fell 3-2...allowed three runs on four hits (1 home run), with no walks and three strikeouts in 5.0 innings (plus two batters) of work...

The outing marked Bundy's fifth start this season in which he did not walk a batter and fourth such start on the road.

STAYING IN THE ZONE: Bundy threw 56 of his 78 pitches for strikes on July 31, good for a 71.8 strike percentage...has posted a strike percentage of over 70 percent in a single start in 10 of his 19 starts this season...

WALKING IN STYLE: Has walked just 20 batters in 93.1 innings, including five starts with no walks allowed...this equates to a career-low 5.0 walk percentage and a 1.93 walks-per-9.0 innings...

RETURN OF THE FORMER HALO: Bundy is slated to face the Angels for the sixth time in his career tonight, making his fifth start; has gone 1-2, 7.15 ERA (22.2 IP, 18 ER) with five walks and 19 strikeouts in his prior outings...

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Bundy is making his 13th road start and appearance tonight...has pitched significantly better at home this season than on the road; is 3-1, 2.83 ERA (35.0 IP, 11 ER) with seven walks, 24 strikeouts and a .220 (29-for-132) opponent batting average in seven home starts compared to 3-4, 6.33 ERA (58.1 IP, 41 ER) with 13 walks, 50 strikeouts and a .301 (72-for-239) opponent batting average in 13 road starts so far this season.

KEEP UP THE TEMPO: Has an average pitch tempo of 15.9 seconds between pitches with the bases empty, per Baseball Savant...is the third-fastest worker on the Twins this season (min. 100 pitches) with the bases empty, trailing Cole Sands (14.1 seconds) and Bailey Ober (15.7 seconds)...

PITCH BREAKDOWN: Bundy has used a five-pitch mix in his first 19 starts of this season, including a four-seam fastball, slider, changeup, sinker and curveball, according to Baseball Savant...35 of his 74 strikeouts this season (47 percent) have come on his slider, his second-most-used pitch...

- In 2021, spent second season with Los Angeles-AL and was the club's Opening Day starter on April 1 vs Chicago-AL, allowing three runs on six hits in 6.0 innings pitched with one walk and six strikeouts.
In 2020, spent first season with Los Angeles-NL, finished ninth in American League Cy Young voting, receiving a third place vote and two fifth place votes.
Recipient of 2020 Nick Adenhardt Award, which is voted on by Angels players to recognize the top pitching performer for the season.
Tossed third career complete game August 6, 2020 at Seattle, allowing one earned run on four hits with no walks and 10 strikeouts; marked first complete game for an Angels pitcher since Andrew Heaney, June 5, 2018 vs. Kansas City.
Ranked among 2020 AL leaders with six wins (T-4th), a 1.04 WHIP (5th), a .208 (51-for-245) opponent batting average against (6th), a 3.29 ERA (9th) and 72 strikeouts (T-9th).
Threw first career complete game on August 29, 2020 vs. Seattle, throwing a one-hit shutout with 12 strikeouts, only hit allowed was bunt single by Kyle Seager in fourth inning and was first Orioles individual one-hitter since Jason Hammel June 16, 2012 at Atlanta.
Became 17th Orioles pitcher to record 10 wins in rookie season and first since Wei-Yin Chen (12 wins in 2012).
Named Orioles top prospect according to Baseball America and Baseball Prospectus following the 2014 season.
