- Contract was selected from Triple-A St. Paul earlier today...making his second start and appearance for the Twins, after a spot start on August 1 vs. Detroit (ND, 5.0 IP, 4 H, 2 R/ER, 2 BB, 8 K).
Signed a minor league contract with Minnesota on June 6 and has gone 4-2, 3.75 ERA (62.1 IP, 26 ER) with 20 walks and 43 strikeouts in 10 starts for Triple-A St. Paul.
Began the season with the Washington Nationals after signing on March 16...went 3-3, 8.33 ERA (31.1 IP, 29 ER) with eight walks and 16 strikeouts before being designated for release or assignment on May 29 and becoming a free agent on May 31.
The Twins are his fifth organization (Toronto 2010-19, Houston 2019-20, San Francisco 2021, Washington 2022).

WELCOME BACK TO THE BIG LEAGUES: Sanchez's contract was selected from Triple-A St. Paul today and he is making his second start/appearance with the Twins this season (for more info on his prior start, see the note below)...signed a minor league contract with Minnesota on June 6 after beginning the year with the Washington Nationals...is back pitching for an American League team for the first time since 2019 with Toronto and Houston.

LAST TIME OUT, IN THE MAJORS: Sanchez made a spot start for the Twins on August 1 vs. Detroit at Target Field...did not factor into the decision of an eventual 5-3, extra-inning victory after yielding two runs on four hits, with two walks and eight strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work...marked his most strikeouts at the major league level since recording 10 on July 28, 2019 vs. Tampa Bay (with Toronto).

- With his eight K's that night, became the fifth player in Twins/Senators history with at least eight strikeouts in his first career outing with the franchise, joining Eric Erickson (12 K on June 28, 1919), Rene Montague (9 K on September 6, 1938), Boof Bonser (8 K on May 21, 2006) and Ervin Santana (8 K on July 5, 2015).
The Twins won, 5-3, on Gio Urshela's walk-off, two-run home run in the bottom of the 10th inning.

2022 ST. PAUL SUMMARY: Signed a minor league contract with the Twins on June 6 and was assigned to Triple-A St. Paul...made his Saints debut in a start on June 8 vs. Rochester - his old team; did not factor into the decision of a 12-2 St. Paul win at CHS Field, allowing two runs on three hits (2 home runs), with one walk and four strikeouts in 3.0 innings of work.

- Has gone 3-2, 3.80 ERA (47.1 IP, 20 ER) with 15 walks, 33 strikeouts and a 1.23 WHIP in 10 starts for the Saints this season.
Posted a 1-0 record and 5.87 ERA (15.1 IP, 10 ER) with 10 walks and 13 strikeouts in four starts for the Saints in June.
Improved significantly in July, going 2-1 with a 3.18 ERA (22.2 IP, 8 ER), one walk, 13 strikeouts, a 0.93 WHIP and a .238 (20-for-84) opponent batting average in four starts in July.
Started twice for St. Paul after his August 1 outing for Minnesota, going 0-1, 1.93 ERA (9.1 IP, 2 ER) with four walks, seven strikeouts and a 1.07 WHIP in those two appearances, on August 9 and 14 vs. Columbus.

HOUSTON, FORMER HOME: Sanchez is facing the Astros for the eighth time in his career tonight, making his fifth start; is 3-2, 6.20 ERA (24.2 IP, 17 ER) with 10 walks and 16 strikeouts in his prior outings...this includes 2-2, 7.32 ERA (19.2 IP, 16 ER) with 10 walks and 13 strikeouts in his four starts.

- Last faced Houston in a relief appearance on July 30, 2021 at Oracle Park with San Francisco (2.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R/ER, 1 K)...his last start against the Astros occurred on June 14, 2019 at Minute Maid Park with Toronto (L, 3.0 IP, 6 H, 8 R/ER, 2 HR, 3 BB, 4 K).
Sanchez made four starts for Houston in the 2019 regular season, after being acquired from Toronto on July 31 with right-handed pitcher Joe Biagini and outfielder Cal Stevenson, in exchange for outfielder Derek Fisher...went 2-0, 4.82 ERA (18.2 IP, 10 ER) with nine walks and 16 strikeouts in those four outings.

WHAT'S IN A NAME: Gary Sanchez caught Aaron Sanchez in his last start for the Twins on August 1 and is slated to catch him again...the duo of Sanchezes comprise the second same-last-name battery in Twins history (1961-present), alongside right-handed pitcher Travis Miller and catcher Damian Miller, who paired up on five different occasions in August-September of 1997.

ARSENAL: Sanchez displayed a four-pitch mix in his eight major league outings this season, relying primarily on his sinker, the pitch he's used most throughout his career...he's thrown it 43.4 percent of the time in 2022 and has used it as much as 77.2 percent of the time in 2014.

2022 NATIONALS SUMMARY: Sanchez signed a minor league contract with the Washington Nationals on March 16 and was a non-roster invitee to spring training...pitched in one Grapefruit League game, working a scoreless inning on March 19 vs. New York-NL (1 H, 1 BB, 1 K)...began the season with Triple-A Rochester and went 1-0, 3.60 ERA (15.0 IP, 6 ER) with two walks, two strikeouts and a 1.47 WHIP in three starts for the Red Wings before having his contract selected by Washington on April 23.

- Made his Nats debut on April 23 vs. San Francisco...took the 5-2 loss after allowing four runs on six hits, with one walk and one strikeout in 4.1 innings.
Earned the 14-4 win in his next outing on April 29 in San Francisco, yielding three runs on six hits (1 home run), with no walks and four strikeouts.
Overall made eight starts for Washington between April 23 and May 28...tossed at least 5.0 innings in three of his five starts and allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in each of those three (April 29 at San Francisco, May 11 vs. New York-NL and May 22 at Milwaukee).
His final outing with the Nationals came on May 28 vs. Colorado (L, 3.2 IP, 8 H, 7 R/ER, 1 HR, 0 BB, 3 K)...was designated for release or assignment on May 28 and declared free agency on May 31.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP DYLAN BUNDY (2022 SEASON: 7-5, 4.60 ERA // CAREER: 53-62, 4.70 ERA)

Right-hander Dylan Bundy is slated to start the middle contest of this three-game series in Houston tomorrow night...earned his seventh win of the season in his last start on August 19 vs. Texas, a 2-1 Twins victory...allowed just one run on two hits with one walk and two strikeouts in 5.1 innings of work...has a 2.79 ERA (19.1 IP, 6 ER) with three walks and 12 strikeouts in his last four starts, since July 31...is due to face the Astros for the 10th time in his career (9th start); has gone 0-3, 4.10 ERA (48.1 IP, 22 ER) with 14 walks and 55 strikeouts in his prior outings.

CAREER NOTES

- Twins are his fifth organization (Toronto 2010-19, Houston 2019-20, San Francisco 2021, Washington 2022).
Missed the 2020 season recovering from a shoulder injury to repair a torn capsule in his throwing shoulder that he suffered in September of 2019.
Began 2019 with Toronto posting a 3-14 record in 23 games...had a career-high ERA and was part of a July 31 trade to Houston...started four times for the Astros, going 2-0 with a 4.82 ERA...did not appear in any Postseason games with the Astros.
Posted a 4-6 record in 2018, his final full season with the Blue Jays...Toronto won seven of the last nine starts Sanchez made...pitched 6.0 innings-or-more in 10 of his 20 major league starts.
Pitched in a career-low eight games while registering then-career highs in ERA (4.25), opponent batting average (.288) and WHIP (1.72) in 2017 with Toronto...made two rehab starts in the minors, one with High-A Dunedin (3.2 IP) and one with Triple-A Buffalo (4.1 IP); dealt with blister, split nail and finger laceration issues...returned to the rotation on July 7 vs. HOU.
Was an All-Star for Toronto in 2016; selected by American League All-Star Manager, Ned Yost, to replace Craig Kimbrel on the 2016 AL All-Star roster.
Tossed at least 6.0 innings and allowed exactly one earned run in each of his first three starts in 2016...won seven consecutive decisions from April 29-June 29.
Had a career-high 10-game winning streak from April 29-July 25, 2016, which was the longest active streak in the majors at the time...finished the 2016 season leading the American League in ERA (3.00), opponent OPS (.625) and slugging percentage (.335), and was fourth in opponent batting average (.224).
Allowed just a .219 opponent batting average with runners in scoring position in 2019, ninth lowest in the American League.
Selected by Toronto in the first round (34th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Barstow High School in Barstow, California...is the first MLB player from his hometown; after his debut and successful first season, Barstow City Council declared October 20, 2014, to be "Aaron Sanchez Day".
