AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a seven-game homestand today with the first game of a four-game set vs. Minnesota (through Thurs.)...will also play a three-game set vs. Tampa Bay (Fri.-Sun.)...went 4-6 on their recent 10-game road trip at Oakland (2-2), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Tampa Bay (1-2).

- Are 80-54 (.597) this season, the second-best record in the AL and the fifth-best record in the Majors.
- Their +186 run differential is the best in the AL and second-best in the Majors (Los Angeles-NL +294).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees snapped their three-game losing streak with a 2-1 win on Sunday against the Rays at Tropicana Field...**RHP Frankie Montas** (5.0IP, 1H, OR, OBB, 7K, 1WP) earned his first win as a Yankee after allowing just 1H over 5.0 scoreless innings...**CF/RF Aaron Judge** (3-for-5, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 1RBI) set a new career high in HR and RBI with his third career leadoff HR and his Major League-leading 53rd home run of the season...**RF Oswaldo Cabrera** (0-for-3, 1BB, 1RBI, 1SF) drove in the Yankees' second run of the game with a sac fly in the seventh inning...**RHP Lou Trivino** (1.0IP, 1H, 2K), **RHP Ron Marinaccio** (0.1IP, 1H, 1BB) and **RHP Jonathan Loáisiga** (1.2IP, 1BB, 2K) were all scoreless in relief...**RHP Clay Holmes** (1.0IP, 3H, 1ER, 1K) earned his 18th save of the season.

WINNING WAYS: With an 80-54 record, **the Yankees need two wins to clinch their 30th consecutive winning record** (since 1993)...their current 29-season streak is the second-longest such stretch in Major League history behind only the franchise's streak of 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.

- Their current 29-season streak is tied with the Boston Bruins' 29-season winning streak (1968-96) for the third-longest streak of consecutive winning seasons all-time in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their own 39-season stretch and 32 straight winning seasons by the Montreal Canadiens (1952-83).

TWINNING: The Yankees are 95-37 (.720) vs. Minnesota since 2002, the Majors' best record by any team vs. an opponent in its own league in that span...including the postseason, have gone 111-39 (.740) vs. the Twins since 2002.

- Are 20-6 in their last 26G vs. Minnesota (since 9/18/17).
- Have won 13 of their last 15 series vs. the Twins since 7/3/14.
- Have won or split each of their last 19 completed season series with the Twins (17-0-2 from 2002-21)...**have won each of their last 14 completed season series vs. the Twins**...according to *Elias*, their streak of 14 straight winning seasons is tied for the fifth-longest streak vs. a single opponent in franchise history...trails only their 37-season streak vs. the Athletics (1932-68), 21-season streak vs. the Senators/Twins (1944-64), 18-season streak vs. the Browns (1926-43) and 15-season streak vs. the Red Sox (1923-37)...also posted two 14-season streaks vs. the White Sox from 1941-54 and 1926-39.
- **Including the postseason, are 21-2 vs. Minnesota in the Bronx since the start of 2015.**

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of their last 13 starts (since 8/21), posting a 2.66 ERA (74.1IP, 22ER) in that span...have tossed at least 6.0IP in eight of their last 13 starts in that span.

- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 21 of their last 25 starts (since 8/8), posting a 3.31 ERA (147.0IP, 54ER) in that span...have tossed at least 6.0IP in 17 of those 25 starts.
- Lead the Majors in BB/9.0IP (2.02) and K/BB (4.37), rank second in WHIP (1.07), third in opponents' BA (.225), fourth in ERA (3.49) and sixth in strikeouts (730).

PEN PAL: RHP Jonathan Loáisiga tossed 1.2 scoreless innings of relief on Sunday at Tampa Bay...his 30 scoreless relief outings of four-or-more outs since the beginning of 2021 are the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Boston's Garrett Whitlock (31) and Atlanta's Collin McHugh (31)...has not allowed an earned run in 10 of his last 11 appearances (since 8/9), posting a 0.79 ERA (11.1IP, 1ER) in that span.

- Has not allowed an earned run in 15 of his last 17 appearances (since 7/26) posting a 1.17 ERA (15.1IP, 2ER) in that span...has held opponents to a .135 BA (7-for-52) in that stretch.
- Has not allowed a hit to his last 14BF.
- Has recorded at least four outs and not allowed a hit in each of his last three appearances...is the second Yankees pitcher to accomplish the feat this season (also Ron Marinaccio - 3G from 6/16-21)...matches the second-longest such streak by a Yankee pitcher in franchise history, trailing only Mariano Rivera (5G from 4/22-5/3/96)...marks the first time in franchise history that the Yankees had two pitchers record such a streak in a single season.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge hit his Major League-leading and career-high 53rd home run of the season on Sunday at Tampa Bay with his third career leadoff home run (also 6/4/22 vs. Detroit and 6/11/22 vs. Chicago-NL)...**is just the second Yankee and the fifth Major League player to hit at least 53 home runs through his club's first 134 games of a season...** joins Sammy Sosa (57HR in 1999 with CHC), Barry Bonds (56HR in 2001 with SFG), Mark McGwire (54HR in 1998 with STL) and Babe Ruth (54HR in 1921 with NYY)...*through 135 team games*, Sammy Sosa had 57HR in 1999 and 53HR in 1998 and 2001, Barry Bonds had 57HR in 2001, Mark McGwire had 54HR in 1998, Babe Ruth had 54HR in 1921 and Roger Maris had 53HR in 1961 with NYY.

► **Has set a career high with 53HR, surpassing his 2017 total (52HR).**

► **His 53HR are the eighth-most by a Yankee in a single season in franchise history...is one of five Yankees to hit as many HR in a single season**, joining Babe Ruth (four times: 60HR in 1927, 59HR in 1921 and 54HR in 1920 and 1928), Roger Maris (61HR in 1961), Mickey Mantle (54HR in 1961) and Alex Rodriguez (54HR in 2007).

► **With 52HR in 2017, is just the seventh player in Major League history to hit at least 52HR in multiple seasons**, joining Mark McGwire (four seasons: 1996-99), Babe Ruth (four: 1920-21, '27-28), Alex Rodriguez (three: 2001-02, '07), Sammy Sosa (three: 1998-99, 2001), Ken Griffey Jr. (two: 1997-98) and Mickey Mantle (two: 1956, '61)...joins Ruth and Mantle as the only Yankees to accomplish the feat...**is the only player in Major League history to record 52HR in multiple seasons within his first seven Major League seasons.**

► Has homered in consecutive games for the 10th time this season (also 3G from 4/28-5/1 and 7/28-30; 2G from 5/12-13, 6/3-4, 7/21-G2-22, 7/24-26, 8/10-12, 8/22-23 and 8/29-30)...has homered in at least three straight games eight times in his career.

► Has set a new career high with 115RBI (previous: 114RBI in 2017)...are the most by a Yankee in a single season since 2011 when Curtis Granderson recorded 119RBI and Robinson Canó recorded 118RBI.

► **Is just the fifth Major League player (sixth time) and third Yankee to hit at least 53HR and record at least 155B in a single season...**joins Alex Rodriguez (54HR/245B in 2007 with NYY), Ken Griffey Jr. (twice: 56HR/205B in 1998 and 56HR/155B in 1997 with SEA), Sammy Sosa (66HR/185B in 1998 with CHC) and Babe Ruth (59HR/175B in 1921 with NYY).

► Leads the Majors with 53HR this season...no other player has more than 36HR...also leads the Majors in runs scored (107), RBI (115), SLG (.674), OPS (1.074) and XBH (74), ranks second in walks (79, first in AL), third in intentional walks (11, second in AL) and OBP (.401, first in AL) and tied for fifth in multi-hit games (44, third in AL).

► Collected 3H on Sunday at Tampa Bay...has reached base at least three times in 35 games this season, the second-most such games in the Majors, trailing only St. Louis' Paul Goldschmidt (36)...has reached base at least twice in 76 games this season, tied with Chicago-AL's José Abreu and Los Angeles-NL's Freddie Freeman for the most such games in the Majors.

► Has 4HR in his last six games, 5HR in his last nine games and 7HR in his 12 games...had not homered in a season-long nine games from 8/13-21 prior to this 12-game stretch (since 8/22).

► Over his last six games, has batted .450/.560/1.100 (9-for-20) with 6R, 1 double, 4HR, 6RBI, 5BB/2IBB and 1SB in that span.

► **According to FanGraphs, his 8.5 WAR is the highest among all Major League players.**

► **Is batting .359/.504/.772 (33-for-92) with 5 doubles, 11HR, 63RBI, 29BB, 2HP and 45F with RISP this season...** with RISP, ranks first in the Majors in OBP and OPS (1.276), second in SLG (second in AL) and sixth in BA (second in AL).

► Is batting .356/.495/.846 (53-for-149) with 38R, 7 doubles, 22HR, 49RBI, 36BB/5IBB, 5HP and 7SB in his last 43G (since 7/16).

CENTRAL PERK: The Yankees are 22-7 (.759) vs. the AL Central this season...are 33-11 in their last 44 games vs. the division (since 6/23/21) and 46-17 in their last 63G (since 9/12/19).

- Have won 18 of their last 21 series vs. the AL Central (since 9/10/19)...have won or split 21 of their last 24 series (since 6/13/19) and 24 of their last 28 series (going 22-4-2 in series since 4/18/19).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP JAMESON TAILLON (12-4, 3.97 ERA)

RHP Jameson Taillon will make his 27th start of the season in today's series opener vs. Minnesota...the 30-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day... **his next win will mark is 50th career win**...last pitched on Tuesday at Los Angeles-AL, tossing 2.0 innings (2H, 2ER, 0BB, 2K, 1HR) before leaving the game due to a right forearm contusion (x-rays were negative)...made his fifth Opening Day roster (2017-19 with Pittsburgh and 2021-22 with the Yankees)...in his first season with the Yankees in 2021, went 8-6 with a 4.30 ERA (144.1IP, 130H, 73R/69ER, 44BB, 140K, 24HR) in 29 starts...underwent a right ankle tendon repair on 10/28/21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Justin Greisberg at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital...is in his sixth Major League season...was acquired by the Yankees from the Pittsburgh Pirates in exchange for RHP Roansy Contreras, INF Maikol Escotto, OF Canaan Smith-Njigba and RHP Miguel Yajure on 1/24/21...was originally selected by Pittsburgh in the first round (second overall) of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST START: Last pitched on Tuesday at Los Angeles-AL, tossing 2.0 innings (2H, 2ER, 0BB, 2K, 1HR) before leaving the game due to a right forearm contusion (x-rays were negative)...surrendered a game-tying two-run HR to Max Stassi in the second inning...**marked his fourth consecutive start without issuing a walk, matching the longest stretch of his career** (also 4G from 6/29-7/30/16 with Pittsburgh).

VS. MINNESOTA: Will make his fifth career start against the Twins...is 2-1 with a 5.23 ERA (20.2IP, 12ER) and 21K in four career starts vs. Minnesota.

- ✦ Has made one start vs. Minnesota this season, allowing 4ER over 4.0 innings (ND, 9H, 1BB, 3K, 1HR) on 6/7 at Target Field.
- ✦ In two career home starts vs. the Twins (4/2/18 at PNC Park with Pittsburgh and 8/19/21 at Yankee Stadium with the Yankees), is 2-0 with a 4.22 ERA (10.2IP, 5ER) and 14K.
- ✦ Is undefeated in his last 10 starts against the AL Central (since 5/1/21), going 4-0 with a 2.30 ERA (54.2IP, 14ER) and 54K...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in seven of those starts.

2022: Is 12-4 with a 3.97 ERA (140.2IP, 62ER) in 26 starts this season...**has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 21 of his 26 starts this season, 2ER-or-fewer in 15 of those games and 1ER-or-fewer in nine of those starts.**

- ✦ Over his last 16 starts (since 6/7), has posted a 5.16 ERA (82.0IP, 47ER) compared to recording a 2.30 ERA (58.2IP, 15ER) in his first 10 starts of the season...has also surrendered at least 3R in 10 of his last 16 starts after doing so just once in his first 10 starts.
- ✦ Has walked just 24 of his 578BF this season...**among pitchers who have tossed at least 125.0 innings this season, his 24BB are the fifth-fewest in the Majors and third-fewest in the AL.**
- ✦ **His 12 starts this season with OBB are the second-most in the Majors**, trailing only Tampa Bay's Corey Kluber (13 starts).
- ✦ **His 1.54 BB/9.0IP ratio is the third-best mark in the AL and the fourth-best in the Majors.**
- ✦ His 4.88 K/BB ratio is the eighth-highest in the AL and the 11th-highest in the Majors.
- ✦ His 12 wins are tied for the sixth-most in the AL and tied for the 12th-most in the Majors...is his second-highest win total in a single season in his career, trailing only his 14 wins in 2018 with Pittsburgh.

HOME SWEET HOME: Will make his 14th home start of the season...is 6-2 with a 3.73 ERA (72.1IP, 30ER) and 69K in 13 starts in the Bronx this season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in eight of his 13 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in five of those starts.

- ✦ As a Yankee (since 2021), is 11-4 with a 3.49 ERA (152.1IP, 59ER) and 146K in 28 home starts...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 25-of-28 home starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 17 of those starts.

CONTROL FREAK: Has walked just 24 of his 578BF this season...**among pitchers who have tossed at least 125.0 innings this season, his 24BB are the fifth-fewest in the Majors and third-fewest in the AL.**

- ✦ **Has not issued a walk in each of his last four starts (since 8/14 at Boston), matching the longest stretch of his career** (also 4G from 6/29-7/30/16 with Pittsburgh)...had walked 12 batters over his previous four games from 7/22-8/8.
- ✦ **His 12 starts this season with OBB are the second-most in the Majors**, trailing only Tampa Bay's Corey Kluber (13 starts).
- ✦ **His 1.54 BB/9.0IP ratio is the third-best mark in the AL and the fourth-best in the Majors.**
- ✦ Issued 1BB-or-fewer in 14 straight starts from 9/28/21-6/12/22...**his 14-start streak was the third-longest streak by a Yankees starting pitcher in franchise history (excluding openers), trailing only David Wells (19GS from 9/6/02-6/27/03) and Jon Lieber (15GS from 5/1-7/23/04)**...Chad Green did so in 16 straight opening assignments from 6/11/17-9/29/19.

RISPY BUSINESS: Has held batters to a .171/.226/.324 (19-for-111) slash line with runners in scoring position this season...**leads the Majors in opponents' OBP, ranks second in opponents' BA, fourth in opponents' OPS (.550) and ninth in opponents' SLG with RISP.**

THE TEA ON TAILLON: Pitched in four seasons with Pittsburgh to begin his career (2016-19) before missing the 2020 season...among National Leaguers with at least 450.0IP from 2016-20, ranked ninth with a 1.66 ground ball to fly ball ratio, 10th with a 32.7% outside the zone swing percentage, 11th with a 48.2% ground ball rate and 14th with a 19.5% soft contact rate (FanGraphs).

- ✦ Spent the entire 2020 season on the injured list recovering from "Tommy John" surgery and flexor tendon repair surgery performed on 8/13/19...the surgeries were performed by Dr. David Altchek at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York City.
