AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a seven-game homestand today with the first game of a four-game set vs. Minnesota (through Thurs.)...will also play a three-game set vs. Niminesota (infought Thurs.)...will also play a three-game set vs. Tampa Bay (Fri.-Sun.)... went 4-6 on their recent 10-game road trip at Oakland (2-2), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Tampa Bay (1-2).

Are 80-54 (.597) this season, the second-best record in the AL and the fifth-best record in the Majors.

- Their +186 run differential is the best in the AL and secondbest in the Majors (Los Angeles-NL +294).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees snapped their three-game losing streak with a 2-1 win on Sunday against the Rays at Tropicana Field...RHP Frankie Montas (5.0IP, 1H, 0R, 0BB, 7K, 1WP) earned his first win as a Yankee after allowing just 1H over 5.0 scoreless innings...**CF/RF Aaron Judge** (3-for-5, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 1RBI) set a new career high in HR and RBI with his third career leadoff HR and his Major League-leading 53rd home run of the season...**RF Oswaldo Cabrera** (0-for-3, 1BB, RBI, 1SF) drove in the Yankees' second run of the game with a sac fly in the seventh inning...RHP Lou Trivino (1.0IP, 1H, 2K), RHP Ron Marinaccio (0.1IP, 1H, 1BB) and RHP Jonathan Loáisiga (1.2IP, 1BB, 2K) were all scoreless in relief...RHP Clay Holmes (1.0IP, 3H, 1ER, 1K) earned his 18th save of the season

WINNING WAYS: With an 80-54 record, the Yankees need two wins to clinch their 30th consecutive winning record (since 1993)...their current 29-season streak is the second-longest such stretch in Major League history behind only the franchise's streak of 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.

Their current 29-season streak is tied with the Boston Bruins' 29-season winning streak is tied with the Boston Bruins 29-season winning streak (1968-96) for the third-longest streak of consecutive winning seasons all-time in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their own 39-season stretch and 32 straight winning seasons by the Montreal Canadiens (1952-83)

TWINNING: The Yankees are 95-37 (.720) vs. Minnesota since 2002, the Majors' best record by any team vs. an opponent in its own league in that span...including the postseason, have gone 111-39 (.740) vs. the Twins since 2002.

▶ Are 20-6 in their last 26G vs. Minnesota (since 9/18/17).

- Have won 13 of their last 15 series vs. the Twins since 7/3/14. Have won or split each of their last 19 completed season series Have won or split each of their last 19 completed season series with the Twins (17-0-2 from 2002-21)...have won each of their last 14 completed season series vs. the Twins...according to Elias, their streak of 14 straight winning seasons is tied for the fifth-longest streak vs. a single opponent in franchise history... trails only their 37-season streak vs. the Athletics (1932-68), 21-season streak vs. the Browns (1926-43) and 15-season streak vs. the Browns (1926-43) and 15-season streak vs. the Red Sox (1923-37)...also posted two 14-season streaks vs. the White Sox from 1941-54 and 1926-39.

- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 21 of their last 25 starts (since 8/8), posting a 3.31 ERA (147.0IP, 54ER) in that span...have tossed at least 6.0IP in 17 of those 25 starts.
  Lead the Majors in BB/9.0IP (2.02) and K/BB (4.37), rank second in WHIP (1.07), third in opponents' BA (.225), fourth in ERA (3.49) and sixth in strikeouts (730).

**PEN PAL: RHP Jonathan Loáisiga** tossed 1.2 scoreless innings of relief on Sunday at Tampa Bay...his 30 scoreless relief outings of four-or-more outs since the beginning of 2021 are the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Boston's Garrett Whitlock (31) and Atlanta's Collin McHugh (31)...has not allowed an earned run in 10 of his last 11 appearances (since 8/9), posting a 0.79 ERA (11.1IP, 1ER) in that span.

- Has not allowed an earned run in 15 of his last 17 appearances (since 7/26) posting a 1.17 ERA (15.1IP, 2ER) in that span... has held opponents to a .135 BA (7-for-52) in that stretch. Has not allowed a hit to his last 14BF.
- Has recorded at least four outs and not allowed a hit in each of his last three appearances...is the second Yankees pitcher to accomplish the feat this season (also Ron Marinaccio 3G from 6/16-21)...matches the second-longest such streak by a Yankees pitcher in franchise history, trailing only Mariano Rivera (5G from 4/22-5/3/96)...marks the first time in franchise history that the Yankees had two pitchers record such a streak in a single season.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP JAMESON TAILLON (12-4, 3.97 ERA)

RHP Jameson Taillon will make his 27th start of the season in today's series opener vs. Minnesota...the 30-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...his next win will mark is 50th career win...last pitched on Tuesday at Los Angeles-AL, tossing 2.0 innings (2H, 2ER, 0BB, 2K, 1HR) before leaving the game due to a right forearm contusion (x-rays were negative)...made his fifth Opening Day roster (2017-19 with Pittsburgh and 2021-22 with the Yankees)... in his first season with the Yankees in 2021, went 8-6 with a 4.30 ERA (144.1IP, 130H, 73R/69ER, 44BB, 140K, 24HR) in 29 starts...underwent a right ankle tendon repair on 10/28/21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Justin Greisberg at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital...is in his sixth Major League season...was acquired by the Yankees from the Pittsburgh Pirates in exchange for RHP Roansy Contreras, INF Maikol Escotto, OF Canaan Smith-Njigba and RHP Miguel Yajure on 1/24/21...was originally selected by Pittsburgh in the first round (second overall) of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft.

**LAST START:** Last pitched on Tuesday at Los Angeles-AL, tossing 2.0 innings (2H, 2ER, 0BB, 2K, 1HR) before leaving the game due to a right forearm contusion (x-rays were negative)...surrendered a game-tying two-run HR to Max Stassi in the second inning...marked his fourth consecutive start without issuing a walk, matching the longest stretch of his career (also 4G from 6/29-7/30/16 with Pittsburgh).

- VS. MINNESOTA: Will make his fifth career start against the Twins...is 2-1 with a 5.23 ERA (20.2IP, 12ER) and 21K in four career starts vs. Minnesota.

  Has made one start vs. Minnesota this season, allowing 4ER over 4.0 innings (ND, 9H, 1BB, 3K, 1HR) on 6/7 at Target Field.

  In two career home starts vs. the Twins (4/2/18 at PNC Park with Pittsburgh and 8/19/21 at Yankee Stadium with the Yankees), is 2-0 with a 4.22 ERA (10.2IP, 5ER) and 14K.

HOME SWEET HOME: Will make his 14th home start of the season... is 6-2 with a 3.73 ERA (72.11P, 30ER) and 69K in 13 starts in the Bronx this season... has allowed 2ER--fewer in eight of his 13 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in five of those starts.

+ As a Yankee (since 2021), is 11-4 with a 3.49 ERA (152.1IP, 59ER) and 146K in 28 home starts...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 25-of-28 home starts and 2ER-or-fewer

in 17 of those starts.

CONTROL FREAK: Has walked just 24 of his 578BF this season...among pitchers who have tossed at least 125.0 innings this season, his 24BB are the fifth-fewest in the Majors and third-fewest in the AL.

- Has not issued a walk in each of his last four starts (since 8/14 at Boston), matching the longest stretch of his career (also 4G from 6/29-7/30/16 with Pittsburgh)...had walked 12 batters over his previous four games from 7/22-8/8.

  His 12 starts this season with 0BB are the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Tampa Bay's Corey Kluber (13 starts).

- His 1.54 BB/9.0IP ratio is the third-best mark in the AL and the fourth-best in the Majors.

  Issued 1BB-or-fewer in 14 straight starts from 9/28/21-6/12/22...his 14-start streak was the third-longest streak by a Yankees starting pitcher in franchise history (excluding openers), trailing only David Wells (19GS from 9/6/02-6/27/03) and Jon Lieber (15GS from 5/1-7/23/04)...Chad Green did so in 16 straight opening assignments from 6/11/17-9/29/19.

RISPY BUSINESS: Has held batters to a .171/.226/.324 (19-for-111) slash line with runners in scoring position this season...leads the Majors in opponents' OBP, ranks second in opponents' BA, fourth in opponents' OPS (.550) and ninth in opponents' SLG with RISP.

**THE TEA ON TAILLON:** Pitched in four seasons with Pittsburgh to begin his career (2016-19) before missing the 2020 season...among National Leaguers with at least 450.0IP from 2016-20, ranked ninth with a 1.66 ground ball to fly ball ratio, 10th with a 32.7 outside the zone swing percentage, 11th with a 48.2% ground ball rate and 14th with a 19.5%

contact rate (FanGraphs).
