THE TWINS: Today the Twins will play the fourth of 35 scheduled spring training games and the third *official* Grapefruit League spring game...they "unofficially" opened their exhibition season with a win over the University of Minnesota on Friday night, winning by a score of 13-2...they are 1-1 through their first two games of Grapefruit League action, defeating Pittsburgh Saturday afternoon and falling to Boston yesterday...17 more games will be played at Lee Health Sports Complex and 15 games will be played on the road...tomorrow afternoon the Twins will host the Philadelphia Phillies for a 1:05 p.m. home game.

TWINS RALLY BUT ARE OUTLASTED BY BOSOX: The Twins fell to the Boston Red Sox yesterday afternoon at JetBlue Park by an 8-6 final score...Bailey Ober got the start for Minnesota and did not factor into the decision after allowing four unearned runs on two hits, with two walks and three strikeouts in 1.1 innings of work...Boston took an early 6-0 lead but Minnesota scored six runs in the top of the seventh inning to tie the game...Trevor Larnach went 2-for-3, the lone Twins hitter with multiple hits...minor league depth player Caleb Boushley was issued the loss in relief after yielding a pair of runs in the bottom of the seventh inning.

2023 RECAP: The Twins finished the 2023 season with a record of 87-75 and won the AL Central by 9.0 games up on the Detroit Tigers...they went on to sweep the Blue Jays at Target Field in two games during the AL Wild Card Series, winning Game 1 by a score of 3-1 and Game 2 by a score of 2-0...they advanced to the AL Division Series and played the Astros, losing three games to one, winning just Game 2 at Minute Maid Park...Minnesota spent 176 days in first place of the division...Target Field drew 1,974,124 in attendance in its 14th season.

TWINS AND YANKS: Today marks the first of two scheduled spring meetings between the Twins and Yankees...Twins will host New York-AL at Lee Health Sports Complex on Saturday, March 9...Minnesota went 2-0 against the Yankees in 2023 spring play, winning 1-0 at home on March 13 and taking a 6-4 victory in Tampa on March 24...the two teams are slated to face each other for a pair of series in the 2024 regular season, with three games at Target Field from May 14-16 and three at Yankee Stadium from June 4-6.

☞ Last time the Twins played at George M. Steinbrenner Field on March 24, 2023, Emmanuel Rodriguez went 2-for-4 with two runs scored and a three-run homer, and Edouard Julien went 2-for-4 with a solo shot...both players are in this afternoon's starting lineup.

MR. ALPHABET: Simeon Woods Richardson is making the start for the Twins this afternoon...2024 marks his fourth time as a full participant in major league spring training, third with Minnesota...went 0-1, 9.00 ERA (5.0 IP, 5 ER) with three walks and four strikeouts in three relief appearances last spring...the No. 17 prospect in the Twins organization per MLB.com, Woods Richardson spent most of the 2023 season with Triple-A St. Paul, going 7-6 with a 4.91 ERA (113.2 IP, 62 ER), 61 walks and 96 strikeouts in 24 games (22 starts) for the Saints...also made one spot start for the Twins on April 22 vs. Washington, allowing five runs on seven hits (1 HR), with three walks and five strikeouts.

THE FRENCH GOD OF WALKS: Edouard Julien is in his second career spring training, all with Minnesota...he is a career .360 (9-for-25) hitter with three home runs, two walks, seven runs scored, a .407 on-base percentage and a 1.127 OPS in 10 major league spring training games...in 2023, was optioned to Triple-A St. Paul on March 14 but was called up on April 12 and made his major league debut that day vs. Chicago-AL...he recorded first major league hit on April 13, 2023 at New York-AL; made his second plate appearance that same inning and homered, becoming ninth player in baseball history (1st Twin) whose first two MLB hits came in same inning, fourth that included a home run...overall hit .263 (89-for-338) with 16 doubles, one triple, 16 home runs, 37 RBI, 64 walks, three stolen bases, 60 runs scored and an .839 OPS in 109 games for the Twins, including .294 (5-for-17) with two doubles, one home run, two RBI, five walks, two runs scored and a 1.043 OPS in six Postseason games...ranked second among all MLB rookies in on-base percentage (.381, minimum of 350 plate appearances) and walks-per-strikeout (0.50), fourth in batting WAR (1.7), fifth in wOBA (.369) and runs created-per 27 (6.14), third in OPS+ (132.8), eighth in overall WAR (3.0), ninth in slugging percentage (.459), and 12th in batting average (.263).

PROSPECT PARTY: Several of the Twins' top prospects per MLB.com are either in the starting lineup today or on the bench, including: Brooks Lee (No. 2), Emmanuel Rodriguez (No. 3), Danny De Andrade (No. 11), Simeon Woods Richardson (No. 17), Kala'i Rosario (No. 19), Austin Martin (No. 20) and Yunior Severino (No. 28).

TWINS BASEBALL, SIGHTS AND SOUNDS: Bally Sports North will telecast eight Twins Grapefruit League games, all of which will also be streamed live on the Bally Sports app...there will be 20 audio broadcasts produced by the Treasure Island Baseball Network; 14 will be carried in the Twin Cities on News Talk 830 WCCO (and simulcast on 102.9 The Wolf), while all 20 will be streamed, live and free of charge, via the Audacy app, smart speakers and website within a geofence that expands across the Upper Midwest.

☞ The Bally Sports North (BSN) eight-game broadcast schedule will consist of three contests called by new television play-by-play voice Cory Provus, who begins his 13th season in a Twins broadcast booth, alongside Twins Hall of Famer Justin Morneau and Twins Special Assistant LaRoy Hawkins; two simulcasts featuring a combination of BSN cameras, graphics and replays, accompanied by analysis and play-by-play from the new primary voice of the Treasure Island Baseball Network, Kris Atteberry, and Twins Hall of Famer Dan Gladden; and three simulcasts of the opponents' broadcast feed (Thursday, March 12 at Detroit; Wednesday, March 13 at Tampa Bay; and Monday, March 25 at Atlanta).

☞ The Treasure Island Baseball Network's 20 games will feature a combination of Atteberry, who enters his 18th season with the Twins and first as the primary play-by-play talent, and Gladden, who enters his 26th year in the Twins radio booth.

ROCCO BAL: This season marks Rocco Baldelli's sixth as the Twins' manager...he will enter the regular season with a career managerial record of 375-333 and three division titles (2019, '20 and '23)...Baldelli is one of five managers in team history (since 1961) with 350 victories, joining Tom Kelly (1,140), Ron Gardenhire (1,068), Sam Mele (522) and Gene Mauch (378).
