**THE TWINS:** Have gone 1-5 through six games on their seven-game homestand, getting swept by the Brewers over the weekend and 1-2 through three games against the Mariners this week...today, Minnesota will continue the homestand with the fourth-game series finale against Seattle...after today's game the Twins will travel to Detroit for a six-game, seven-day roadtrip with three against the Tigers this weekend, followed by an off day on Monday, then three against the Miami Marlins, from Tuesday-Thursday.

**FIRE ON THE MOUND-TAIN:** The Twins shut out the Mariners last night at Target Field by a score of 2-0, snapping their five-game losing streak...it marked the club's sixth shutout of the season and second at home (the other: 5-0 on 4/27 vs. LAA)...Joe Ryan (8-3) was the starter and winner, pitching 6.0 shutout innings, with three hits allowed, no walks and eight strikeouts...Louis Varland (1.0), Griffin Jax (1.0) and Jhoan Duran (1.0) combined to pitch 3.0 scoreless innings of relief...the offense recorded four hits and struck out just five times...Willi Castro drove in the first run for the Twins with a sixth-inning single...Kody Clemens added an insurance run with a solo home run in the eighth, his ninth homer of the season.

**CAUGHT IN THE MIDDLE:** The Twins are playing their 81st game today — the official half-way point in 2025...below are how the hitting (above) and pitching (below) numbers have compared through 81 games since 2021:

**TWINS-MS:** The Twins and Mariners are playing for the seventh and final time this season...Twins are 2-4, going 1-2 at T-Mobile Park from May 30-June 1 and 1-2 this series.

- ☞ With a win today, the Twins can avoid losing the series and split at 2-2...their last series loss to the Mariners at home was July 24-26, 2023, dropping two of three.
- ☞ Carlos Correa has 121 career hits and 121 games played against the Mariners, both his most vs. any opponent...his 121 hits are sixth-most among actives.
- ☞ Ryan Jeffers is hitting .297 (19-for-64) with five doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI, a .370 on-base percentage, a .516 slugging percentage and an .885 OPS in 21 career games vs. the Ms.
- ☞ Byron Buxton has a .931 OPS (.333 OBP / .598 SLG) in his last 26 games against Seattle...in that span, he has 10 home runs and 28 RBI.
- ☞ Trevor Larnach is hitting .406 (13-for-32) with two doubles, three home runs, nine RBI, a .472 on-base percentage, a .750 slugging percentage and a 1.222 OPS in his last eight games vs. Seattle pitching.
- ☞ Willi Castro is hitting .343 (12-for-35) with a 1.096 OPS in his last 10 games against the Mariners...this season he has reached base nine times in 19 plate appearances vs. Seattle pitching.

**ONE RUN, NO FUN:** The Twins have gone 7-15 in one-run games this season, dropping each of their last nine: one at Kansas City (May 25), two in Seattle (May 31 & June 1), one vs. Toronto (June 7), two at Houston (June 14 & 15), one at Cincinnati (June 17), one vs. Milwaukee (June 22) and last night vs. Seattle...their last one-run win was on May 24 vs. Kansas City, a 5-4 victory at Target Field...they went 22-20 in one-run games in 2024.

☞ Three of the six games between the Twins and Mariners this season have been decided by one run, with the Mariners winning all three.

**YOU BE WILLIN':** In his last 33 games, Willi Castro is hitting .330 (36-for-109) with five doubles, one triple, six home runs, 13 RBI, 14 walks, 22 runs scored, two stolen bases, a .416 on-base percentage, a .560 slugging percentage and a .976 OPS...below are his first 25 games compared to his last 33 games this season:

**BUCK NASTY:** Over his last 40 games, Byron Buxton is hitting .311 (47-for-151) with five doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 35 RBI, 29 runs scored, 20 walks, a .389 on-base percentage, a .609 slugging percentage and a .998 OPS.

- ☞ He has reached base safely in 15 of his last 16 games.
- ☞ He is slashing .286/.374/.607 (.981 OPS) in 31 home games this season...in his last nine games at Target Field, he is slashing .387/.472/.742 (1.214 OPS) with three home runs.
- ☞ His 2025 MLB percentile rankings: 94th in batting run value (18), 94th in hard hit percentage (53.8), 91st in barrel percentage (15.2), 91st in bat speed (75.2), 80th in average exit velocity (91.5) and 82nd in xSLG (.508).

**THE BOOK ON BROOKS:** Brooks Lee has hit safely in 22 of his last 23 games with an at-bat...in those last 23 games, he is hitting .348 (32-for-92) with three doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI and an .847 OPS.

☞ Over those 23 games, he is slashing .319/.351/.449 (.801 OPS) as a left-handed batter...as a right-handed batter he is .288/.302/.346 (.648 OPS).

**THE BIG SHOW-RREA:** Carlos Correa is hitting .444 (12-for-27) with one double, one home run, three RBI, two walks, a .483 on-base percentage, a .593 slugging percentage and a 1.075 OPS in his last seven games...over that span, he has posted an average exit velocity of 96.0 mph, ninth-best in baseball (min. 1,000 pitches seen)...his hard hit percentage is 59.1%, 14th-best in baseball.

☞ His career .305 June batting average and .923 June OPS are both the highest of any month in his career.

**CLEMENS TIME:** Since being acquired via trade with Philadelphia on April 26, Kody Clemens has hit nine home runs, with 19 RBI, a .518 slugging percentage and an .825 OPS in 131 plate appearances for Minnesota...in that span, he ranks second on the club in homers (Buxton - 11) and slugging percentage (Buxton - .587) and third in OPS (Buxton - .979 & Castro - .883).

- ☞ Making his 12th appearance (11th start) of the season and 42nd career appearance (40th start)... second career start against Seattle
- ☞ Took the loss in Minnesota's 0-9, shutout defeat in his last start on June 21 vs. Milwaukee...threw 6.0 quality innings, allowing four runs (3 earned) off four hits, with three walks and three strikeouts.
- ☞ In one start against Seattle on May 6, 2024, Woods Richardson threw 6.0 scoreless innings, allowing just one hit, one walk and a career-high eight strikeouts.
- ☞ Seeking first major league win since April 26 vs. Los Angeles-AL (6 starts).

**SIMEON SAYS:** Last pitched on June 21 vs. Milwaukee in his first career start against the Brewers, opposite José Quintana...was dealt the loss in Minnesota's 0-9, shutout defeat...allowed four runs (3 earned) off four hits with three walks and three strikeouts in 6.0 quality innings...allowed a sacrifice fly to Brice Turang in the first, a sac fly to Jack Chourio in the second, followed by an RBI single to Christian Yelich...then retired 13 of his last 14 batters faced in the second through sixth innings.

- ☞ He is now 6-5 when facing opponents for the first time, and 2-2 when facing opponents for the first time at home.
- ☞ Marked his first 6.0-plus inning game of the season, and first since his 7.0-inning quality start on August 10, 2024 vs. Cleveland.
- ☞ Allowed five hard hit balls and had a hard-hit percentage of 25.0, tied for his lowest on the season (also 25.0%, 6/15).

**TWO STARTS AGO:** Pitched on June 15 at Houston, opposite Brandon Walter, did not factor into the decision of Minnesota's 2-1 walk-off defeat...threw 5.0 scoreless innings, and allowed just one hit with one walk and four strikeouts...marked his fourth career scoreless start...retired his first 13-straight batters, throwing a perfect 4.0 innings before allowing his sole hit, a single to Jake Meyers in the fifth...also allowed just one hit for the second time in his career (also, May 6, 2024 vs. Seattle).

- ☞ Marked his second lowest number of pitches thrown in his career, behind September 25, 2024, his shortest career outing, when he threw 35 pitches in 1.0 inning plus two batters in the second (12 total batters), including a double to current teammate Jonah Bride.
- ☞ SWR is the first Twins starter to allow just one hit in a game so far this season...also marked the Twins' seventh scoreless start of the season, and first since Pablo López had 6.0 scoreless innings on May 17.

**THE FISH OUT OF WATER:** Is facing the Mariners for the second time in his career...sole start came on May 6, 2024 where he did not factor into Minnesota's 3-1 victory...threw 6.0 scoreless innings, allowing just one hit, one walk and a career-high eight strikeouts.

- ☞ SWR is 2-1 in seven career starts against American League West opponents...has posted a 4.02 ERA (40.1 IP, 18 ER), with five home runs, 15 walks and 38 strikeouts...AL West batters are hitting .184 (27-for-147) against him...his BAA against the AL West is his lowest against any division.

**OUR NECK OF THE WOODS:** In his career, Woods Richardson has gone 3-4 with a 4.61 ERA (93.2 IP, 48 ER), 8.36 K/9, 3.36 BB/9 and 1.06 HR/9 in 19 games (18 starts) at home compared to 4-6 with a 4.46 ERA (103.0 IP, 51 ER), 7.34 K/9, 3.41 BB/9 and 1.31 HR/9 in 22 road games (21 starts).

- ☞ SWR is 2-2 in five starts at home this season, posting a 4.56 ERA (25.2 IP, 13 ER) with three home runs, seven walks and 20 strikeouts; compared to 0-2, 5.53 ERA (27.2 IP, 17 ER), 14 walks and 26 strikeouts in six appearances (5 starts) on the road.

**PLATOON SPLITS:** Through 11 major league games in 2025, left-handed hitters have slashed .337/.393/.505 in 95 at-bats vs. Woods Richardson, while righties have slashed .219/.297/.368 in 114 at-bats...lefties have posted an average exit velocity of 87.4 mph and a hard-hit percentage of 37.5 compared to righties' 92.2 mph and 48.8 percent.

- ☞ His whiff rate is at an all-time high of 22.7 percent (lefties, 21.0 percent; righties, 23.9 percent)... compared to the last three years in which he has averaged 18.8 percent.

**THE ARSENAL:** Woods Richardson uses a five-pitch mix, per Baseball Savant...throws a 4-seamer over 45% of the time...primarily uses his slider against right-handed batters, while favoring his changeup against left-handed batters...here is a look at his pitch breakdown:

- ☞ He currently ranks in baseball's seventh percentile in max exit velocity (115.3), ninth percentile in barrel percentage (12.0) and ninth percentile in GB% (32.5).
- ☞ Between his last start on June 21 and today, SWR decreased his 4-seam fastball hard-hit rate from 60.3 percent to 52.0 percent, a decrease of 8.3, and lowering himself from the second highest hard-hit percentage among pitchers who have thrown at least 300 4-seam fastballs to the 26th highest, dropping 24 spots.
- ☞ Among pitchers who have thrown at least 100 curveballs, Simeon is tied with Sugano Tomoyuki for the lowest whiff rate (12.5) and is one of two players to have a 0.0 strikeout rate and put away percentage (also, Jack Leiter).

**MAKE MY DAY:** In 21 career day games (20 starts), Woods Richardson has posted a 3.87 ERA and a .240 opponent batting average, .302 slugging percentage, 14 home runs, 36 walks and 99 strikeouts; compared to a 5.28 ERA, .269 opponent batting average, .422 slugging percentage with 12 home runs, 38 walks and 72 strikeouts in 20 night games (19 starts).

- ☞ So far this season, SWR is 2-1 in six daytime starts, posting a 3.90 ERA (30.0 IP, 13 ER) with five home runs, 11 walks and 27 strikeouts; compared to 0-3 with a 6.56 ERA (23.1 IP, 17 ER), three home runs, 10 walks and 19 strikeouts in five nighttime appearances (4 starts).
