THE TWINS: After completing their seven-game roadtrip with a record of 3-4 (1-2 at Wrigley Field and 2-2 at Progressive Field), the Twins began their six-game, seven-day homestand with a loss to the A's last night...tonight, they will play the second of three against the Athletics and wrap the series tomorrow afternoon...they will enjoy an off-day on Monday, then host the Royals for three games from Tuesday-Thursday.

NOT SO ATHLETIC: The Twins lost to the A's last night at Target Field by a score of 2-0...Twins suffered their third shutout of the season and second at home (8-0 loss on 6/3 vs. CWS)...Zebby Matthews (4-8) was the starter and was issued the loss, allowing two runs on three hits in 6.0 innings pitched, with three walks and one strikeout...the offense recorded just two hits, a ground-rule double by Austin Martin in the fifth inning and a eighth-inning single from Ryan Jeffers...two hits matched a season-low, previously done on May 9 at Cleveland.

STRAIGHT A's: The Twins and A's are playing for the second of six times this season...after this series, these two teams will meet in Sacramento for three games from August 24-26.
✦ Twins are 9-6 in their last 15 against the As, 15-7 in their last 22 and 19-8 in their last 27, dating back to May of 2022.
✦ Twins have now lost five-straight to the A's, their longest losing streak to them since August 24-September 22, 2018 (also 5)...last time they lost at least six was July 18, 2015-July 4, 2016 (also 6).
✦ In 16 career games against the A's, Trevor Larnach is hitting .311 (19-for-61) with three doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, four walks and an .813 OPS.
✦ Ryan Jeffers has reached safely in nine-straight against the A's, posting a .400 on-base with five walks, 10 hits and a .900 OPS in that span.
✦ In eight career games against the A's, Brooks Lee is hitting .290 (9-for-31) with two doubles, one home run, six RBI and an .805 OPS.

FULL PLATES: Twins enter today leading the AL in runs scored at 498, in front of Chicago (488), Houston (482), New York (481) and Baltimore (478).
✦ Twins are playing in their 106th game today...through 105 games last season, they had scored 440 runs...they did not reach 500 runs scored until August 13.

MAJORITY RULES: Twins need wins tonight and tomorrow to earn their 17th series victory of the season...they have gone 16-15-2 in series play, 9-5-1 at home and 7-10-1 on the road.
✦ Twins have won eight of their last 11 series overall, dating back to June 12-14 vs. St. Louis.
✦ Twins are seeking their fourth-straight series win at home, since that aforementioned series.
✦ Twins last series win against the A's was June 2-5, 2025, winning two of three at Sacramento...their last at Target Field was June 13-16, 2024, sweeping in four.
✦ Twins entered this series having gone 7-2-1 in series play since mid-June.

HAWKINS LAB: Twins 'pen has allowed just two runs on eight hits in 13.0 innings in their last three outings...below are the bullpen's June and July comparisons:

TREVOLUTION: Over his last 28 games, since June 14, Trevor Larnach is hitting .374 (37-for-99) with nine doubles, five home runs, 21 RBI, a .426 on-base percentage, a .616 slugging percentage and a 1.042 OPS.
✦ Larnach is hitting .294 (80-for-272) on the season, third-highest average in the AL among players with at least 300 plate appearances...he trails Yordan Alvarez (.327) and Yandy Diaz (.304).

WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT: The Twins drew seven walks in last night's game (Luke Keaschall, Royce Lewis and Austin Martin all with 2 apiece; 1 from Josh Bell)...since July 1, the Twins have drawn 65 walks, the eighth-most walks in baseball and second-most in the American League during that span, trailing only Baltimore (75).
✦ Twins rank third in the AL and seventh in baseball in pitches seen on the season (15,413).

TRADING PLACES: The second annual "Reverse Autograph" event took place this afternoon at Target Field, honoring each child as an MVP...every kid starred on a custom Topps® baseball card with a photo and personal "stats" — favorite activities and super strengths — and Twins players, including event champion Brooks Lee and his teammates, collected and signed those cards...the kids and their families will also be recognized on the field prior to tonight's game...this powerful experience delivers moments of connection and inspiration — where the kids are the true major league heroes and Twins players are their biggest fans.

⚔ Mike Paredes is due to make his sixth career start (10th appearance) this evening against the Athletics.

✦ In his last appearance on July 21 at Cleveland, Mike was saddled with his third loss of the season in a piggyback role, allowing two runs on six hits in 3.0 innings of relief, with one walk and zero strikeouts in a 5-2 Twins loss at Progressive Field.

Ⓢ Mike is 0-2 as a starter, owning a 4.50 ERA (22.0 IP, 11 ER) with seven walks, 11 strikeouts, a 1.36 WHIP and a .267 (23-for-86) BAA.

LAST TIME OUT: Paredes made his ninth appearance of the season/his career on July 21 at Cleveland, piggybacking Twins left-hander Kendry Rojas...took his third loss of the season, allowing two runs on six hits in 3.0 innings pitched, with one walk and zero strikeouts in a 5-2 Twins loss at Progressive Field...both runs surrendered by Paredes came on sacrifice flies from Austin Hedges and Petey Halpin.

☛ Surrendered singles to Brayan Rocchio and Chase DeLauter to begin his outing before inducing an inning-ending double play of Rhys Hoskins in the third inning.

Ⓢ Did not record a strikeout, marking the first time he did not record a strikeout in an outing since April 26, 2025 vs. Springfield with Double-A Wichita; had recorded a strikeout in 53 consecutive appearances since that date.

LAST START: Paredes made his fifth start (seventh appearance) of the season/his career on July 3 at New York-AL opposite right-hander Gerrit Cole...took the loss, the second of his big league career, allowing three runs on four hits – including a solo home run by Trent Grisham and a two-run blast by Ben Rice – in 4.0 innings pitched, with two walks and two strikeouts in a 5-2 Twins loss at Yankee Stadium.

☞ Paired with his start on June 27 vs. Colorado (2 HR), marked the first time he has allowed back-to-back multi-home run games in his professional career.

OUT WEST: Mike is slated to make his first career start against the Athletics and second start against a member of the American League West...in his lone start against the AL West on June 15 at Texas. Mike did not factor into the decision, allowing two runs on four hits – including a two-run home run by Joc Pederson – in what was then a MLB career-high 4.2 innings pitched, with no walks and two strikeouts in a 4-2 Twins victory at Globe Life Field.

PROUD TO BE AN AMERICAN (LEAGUE): Paredes has made five career appearances (three starts) against American League opponents...in those outings, he is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA (18.1 IP, 11 ER), six walks, nine strikeouts, a 1.25 WHIP and a .243 (17-for-70) BAA.

HOME/ROAD SPLITS: Paredes has made two appearances (one start) at home this season, and is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 6 ER), one walk and three strikeouts, compared to 0-2 with a 4.26 ERA (25.1 IP, 12 ER), 12 walks and 16 strikeouts in seven appearances (four starts) on the road.

Seven of Paredes' first nine career major league appearances have come away from Target Field, becoming the first Twins pitcher to make seven of his first nine career appearances on the road since John Curtiss also made seven road appearances in his first nine career outings in 1917; Paredes is alongside Curtiss and Mike Dyer (also made 7 of his first 9 career appearances on the road in 1989) as the only pitchers in Twins club history (1961-) to do this.

LEFT-RIGHT SPLITS: In his career, lefties are slashing .268/.358/.476 (22-for-82) with three doubles, one triple, four home runs, nine walks and six strikeouts against Paredes; in comparison, righties are slashing .269/.316/.462 (14-for-52) with two doubles, two home runs, four walks and 13 strikeouts.

THE ARSENAL: Paredes has displayed a four-pitch arsenal through his first seven big league appearances...here are his numbers, per Baseball Savant:

✦ CUT IT UP: Paredes has held opposing hitters to a .136 (3-for-22) BAA with his cutter, which ranks seventh among all pitchers in Major League Baseball (min. 20 plate appearances).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP JOE RYAN (2026: 6-6, 3.38 ERA // CAREER: 52-42, 3.73 ERA)

All-Star right-hander Joe Ryan is scheduled to toe the rubber for the 22nd time this season in tomorrow afternoon's three-game series finale against the Athletics...in his last start on July 20 at Cleveland, Ryan took his sixth loss of the season, allowing eight runs on 10 hits (6 HR), with zero walks and three strikeouts in 4.0 innings pitched; the six homers allowed were a franchise (1901-) record for homers allowed and tied the most homers allowed in a game by a pitcher in American/National League history (1901-)...tomorrow, Ryan will face the Athletics for the fifth time in his career; is 2-1 with a 5.91 ERA (21.1 IP, 14 ER), eight walks, 22 strikeouts, a .256 (21-for-82) BAA and a 1.36 WHIP through four career starts...tomorrow's start will be Joe's ninth day game of the season; is 4-0 with a 1.27 ERA (42.2 IP, 6 ER), 11 walks and 49 strikeouts during the day compared to 2-6 with a 4.65 ERA (71.2 IP, 37 ER), 14 walks and 82 strikeouts in 13 starts at night.
