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THE TWINS: Have gone 3-1 through four games on their six-game, seven-day homestand, winning a series 2-1 against the Athletics over the weekend, followed by a win over the Royals last night...tonight, they will continue the homestand with the second of three against the Royals...after tomorrow afternoon's series finale, Minnesota will travel to Seattle to begin a nine-game, 10-day roadtrip with three against the Mariners (July 31-August 2), three at Kansas City (August 4-6) and three at Milwaukee (August 7-9).
⚔️ A win tonight and the Twins will move over .500 for the first time since late night of April 21 at New York-NL, when they beat the Mets and improved to 12-11...their high-water mark for 2026 is four games over (11-7 after their game on April 14 vs. Boston).

GIDP, GIDP, GIDP, GIDP, GIDP, WALK-OFF: The Twins walked off the Royals last night at Target Field, winning by a score of 3-2 as Royce Lewis drove in Victor Caratini and Brooks Lee from first and second with a two-out ninth-inning triple...Taj Bradley was the starter, allowing two runs on three hits in 6.0 innings pitched, with three walks and 10 strikeouts...Jack Anderson recorded his first major league win, pitching a scoreless top of the ninth inning...the offense recorded 10 hits, walked four times, struck out four times and grounded into five double plays — tying a club record.

⚔️ Twins were 0-47 when trailing entering the ninth inning and became the last team in baseball to earn a win under those circumstances...their last such win was August 26, 2025 at Toronto when they were down 3-4 and scored four in the top of the ninth at Rogers.
⚔️ Lewis' hit was the seventh walk-off triple in club history (since 1961) and first since Ryan Doumit on June 1, 2013 vs. Seattle.
⚔️ Twins went 42 home games this season without a walk-off hit, now have three in their last 13 home games (6/26 vs. COL - Lewis single & 7/8 vs. CLE - Roden single).

GAME OF THRONES: The Twins and Royals are playing each other today for the ninth of 13 games in 2026...Twins have gone 3-5 vs. KC this season, 1-2 at Kauffman and 2-3 at Target Field.
⚔️ Since the start of 2023, the Twins have gone 17-8 at home vs. the Royals, compared to 8-14 at Kauffman Stadium.
⚔️ Josh Bell is hitting .315 (35-for-111) with seven doubles, eight home runs, 27 RBI and a .987 OPS in 31 career games vs. Kansas City...three of his 13 home runs this season have been against the Royals (April 1 off Falter, April 2 off Cruz and June 7 off Way).
⚔️ In six games against the Royals this season, Kody Clemens is hitting .455 (10-for-22) with three doubles, three home runs, three RBI and a 1.500 OPS...he has 15 career hits against the Royals, seven of which are home runs.

IT'S THE HEAT AND THE HUMIDITY: Since June 14, the Twins have gone 22-14, for a .611 winning percentage, tied for fourth-highest in baseball since that date:

CODE RED HOT: Kody Clemens has 18 home runs, one shy of his single-season career high of 19, set last year...he has also set single-season career-highs in runs (50), hits (83), triples (5) and stolen bases (7).

⚔️ Since June 1, he's homered 12 times, tied with Kazuma Okamoto for fourth-most in the AL, trailing Junior Caminero (16), Yordan Alvarez (15) and Ben Rice (14).
⚔️ Among AL players with at least 350 plate appearances this season, he ranks ninth in slugging percentage (.490).

KREI ME A RIVER: Ryan Kreidler has five hits in his last 11 at-bats (.455) with three doubles and one triple over three games.
⚔️ Tonight marks the 10th time in the club's last 11 games in which Kreidler has started at short...and 15th in the last 20.
⚔️ Kreidler has set career-highs in games (63), runs (24), hits (40), doubles (7), triples (3), home runs (5), RBI (25) and walks (12).

TWINS TRY TO MEATLOAF THE ROYALS: A win tonight or tomorrow and the Twins will earn their 18th series victory of the season...they have gone 17-15-2 in series play, 10-5-1 at home and 7-10-1 on the road.

⚔️ Twins began the season going 8-13-1 in their first 22 series through June 11, but have gone 9-2-1 their last 12 series overall, dating back to June 12-14 vs. St. Louis.
⚔️ Twins are seeking their fifth-straight series win at home, which would be their longest stretch since April 14-May 11, 2025, when they won five-straight.
⚔️ Twins are seeking their first series win over the Royals since August 8-10, 2025 at home.

BELLS AND WHISTLES: Josh Bell has hit safely in all six games on this trip...below are Bell's number comparisons from Opening Day through May 31 and since June 1:

⚔️ He has 63 RBI on the season, tied for 11th-most in the AL.
⚔️ Bell is one RBI from passing his 2025 total of 63, which he reached in 140 games.
⚔️ He is on pace to record 94 RBI, which would be the second-most of his career (116 - 2019).
⚔️ Since September 7, 2025, Bell has recorded 81 RBI, sixth-most in baseball since that date.

LARNING TO FLY: Over his last 30 games, since June 14, Trevor Larnach is hitting .362 (38-for-105) with nine doubles, five home runs, 21 RBI, a .417 on-base percentage, a .590 slugging percentage and a 1.008 OPS.

⚔️ Larnach is hitting .291 (81-for-278) on the season, sixth-highest average in the AL among players with at least 315 plate appearances...he trails Yordan Alvarez (.325), Yandy Diaz (.301), Ernie Clement (.296), Josh Jung (.294) and Chandler Simpson (.293).

37 CARAT MAGIC: In 35 games since June 1, Victor Caratini is hitting .299 (35-for-117) with seven doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, a .366 on-base percentage, a .487 slugging percentage and an .854 OPS.
