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THE TWINS: Have gone 3-2 through five games on their six-game, seven-day roadtrip, going 2-1 in Houston, followed by a split of the first two games at Yankee Stadium...today, Minnesota will complete the roadtrip with the three-game series finale in the Bronx...after today's game, Minnesota will travel home to enjoy an off-day tomorrow, then begin a six-game homestand, with three against the Guardians (Tuesday-Thursday) and three against the Angels (next weekend).

☞ Twins have gone 8-6 in rubber games...they have won each of their last four rubber games: June 14 vs. St. Louis, June 21 at Arizona, June 28 vs. Colorado and Wednesday at Houston.

SATURDAY IN THE PARK, THINK IT WAS THE FOURTH OF JULY: The Twins beat the Yankees yesterday afternoon at Yankee Stadium by a score of 11-4...Zebby Matthews was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing four runs on three hits in 4.2 innings pitched... Matthews exited in the fifth inning with a right foot laceration...the offense recorded 11 hits, six being home runs, their most since September 4, 2023 at Cleveland (also 6)...two homers came from Josh Bell, hitting them from both sides of the plate, the seventh Twin to do so (Brooks Lee - 2025, Jorge Polanco - 2017, Kennys Vargas - 2016, Ryan Doumit - 2012, Chili Davis - 1992 and Roy Smalley - 1986)...marked the fourth-straight season for Bell to homer from both sides of the plate.

☞ According to *Elias*, his four homers from both sides ranks tied for sixth among actives (Lindor - 7, Ramirez - 7, Santander - 7, Raleigh - 5, Marte - 5, Reynolds - 4).

TWINS-YANKEES: The Twins and Yankees are playing for the third of six games in 2026...Twins will host New York for three games from September 14-16.

☞ With yesterday's victory, the Twins are seeking consecutive wins in Yankee Stadium for the first time since taking three-straight here from September 8, 2022-April 14, 2023.

☞ In his last seven games against the Yankees, Byron Buxton posted a .947 OPS and reached base safely in all seven...in that span, he has recorded four doubles, one home run and five walks, with a .560 slugging percentage.

THE CITY THAT LOVES YOU BACK BUCK: Byron Buxton last night was named a starting outfielder for the AL All-Stars, his third career selection (2022 & '25)...he was voted in by fans as a starter and will be making his second career start after starting in place of Mike Trout in 2022 at Dodger Stadium...below are Buxton's rankings among AL outfielders in a few offensive categories on the season, among qualifiers:

ADDITIONALLY...Buxton is tied for second among that same group in RBI (45), trailing Bellinger (50).

DECLA-RY-TION OF INDEPENDENCE: Joe Ryan last night was named an AL All-Star for the second time and second consecutively — voted in by his peers...Ryan has gone 5-5, 3.61 ERA (97.1 IP, 39 ER) with 22 walks, 113 strikeouts and a .224 opponent batting average this season...among AL pitchers (min. 95 IP), he ranks sixth in strikeouts, eighth in average and 11th in ERA.

☞ Ryan pitched 1.0 perfect inning in last year's game in Atlanta, striking out two batters.

WINNER TAKES IT: A win today and the Twins will earn their 14th series victory of the season...they have gone 13-14-1 in series play, 7-5-1 at home and 6-9-0 on the road.

☞ Twins have won five of their last six series, taking series from St. Louis (6/12-14), Texas (6/15-18), Arizona (6/19-21), Colorado (6/26-28) and Houston (6/29-7/1)...their only series loss in that span was a sweep by Los Angeles-NL (6/22-24).

☞ Twins are seeking their fourth-straight road series win, which would mark the first time since June 21-July 10, 2024, when they took four-straight at Oakland, at Arizona, at Seattle and at Chicago-AL.

☞ Twins looking for their first series win over the Yankees since taking two of three at Target Field from April 24-25, 2023...their last series win at Yankee Stadium was May 30-June 1, 2014 (2 of 3) — one of just two series wins Minnesota has had in this ballpark, the other was July 12-14, 2013 (2 of 3)...they are 2-12-2 all-time in series play in this park.

BUS RIDES AND CHEST BUMPS: The Twins have gone 8-3 in their last 11 road games...in those 11, they have hit .284 (114-for-401) and averaged 7.3 runs-per-game...they have outscored opponents 80-48.

☞ They have scored in the first inning in eight of those 11 games, totaling 20 runs in those innings...over that span of games, the 20 first-inning runs have accounted for 25% of their 80 total runs scored.

LEFT TURNS: Minnesota is facing a left-handed starter for the 27th time...they have gone 11-15 against lefty starters this season...their last game vs. a left-handed starter was a 12-3 loss on June 23 vs. Los Angeles-NL and Justin Wroblewski...their last win with a lefty starting was a 4-2 victory on June 15 at Texas, against MacKenzie Gore.

☞ Since April 7, Byron Buxton is hitting .310 (22-for-71) with an .899 OPS vs. lefties.

I GOT A FEVER AND THE ONLY PRESCRIPTION IS MORE JOSH BELL: Since June 1, Josh Bell is hitting .299 (32-for-107) with eight doubles, one triple, eight home runs, 27 RBI, a .353 on-base percentage, a .617 slugging percentage and a .970 OPS in 30 games.

☞ He leads the club with 59 RBI for the season...27 of those RBI have come in his last 26 games...he has at least one RBI in 17 of those 26.

WHEN LIFE GIVES YOU CLEMENS: Kody Clemens hit is 16th home run of the season yesterday and is now three shy of his single-season career-high of 19, set last season...he has now homered in five of his last eight games...he is now one away from 50 for his career.

☞ He has homered in six of his last seven series, homering in Chicago (5/27), Pittsburgh (5/29), Detroit (6/9), Texas (6/16), Houston (7/1) and New York (both games this series)...his only miss was the Arizona series (6/19-21).

☞ Since being acquired in a trade with Philadelphia in late April of 2025, Clemens has 35 home runs in 188 games (680 plate appearances)...second-most home runs on the club in that time, trailing only Buxton (54).

TWINS MILB WEEKLYS: Twins have named Triple-A outfielder Walker Jenkins and infielder Cody Morissette as their co-minor league Players of the Week and High-A Cedar Rapids right-handed pitcher Riley Quick as Pitcher of the Week.

☞ Jenkins, 21, played in five games for the Saints, hitting .316 (6-for-19) with one double, one triple, one home run and two RBI...the Wilmington, NC native is the top ranked Twins prospect and 14th-highest in baseball, per MLB.com.

☞ Morissette, 26, played in five games for the Saints, hitting .375 (6-for-16) with four home runs and seven RBI, including a two-homer game on Wednesday vs. Buffalo...the Manchester, NH native was signed by the Twins organization as a minor league free agent on June 8.

☞ Quick, 22, made one start for the Kernels on Wednesday at Quad Cities, allowing one unearned run on two hits in 4.0 innings pitched, with one walk and seven strikeouts...the Trussville, AL native was selected by the Twins 36th overall in the 2025 MLB Draft out of Alabama.
