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THE TWINS: After completing their six-game, seven-day roadtrip with a record of 4-2 (2-1 in Houston and 2-1 in the Bronx), the Twins began their six-game homestand with a win over Cleveland last night...tonight, they will play the second of three against the Guardians and complete the series tomorrow afternoon...after this series, the Twins will host the Angels for three games over the weekend, leading up to the All-Star Break.

Twins are seeking their fourth-straight win tonight, which would match a season-high, done four times previously (last: June 14-18).

Minnesota has won four of their last five and six of their last eight.

TWINS PROTECT THE FELLOWSHIP OF THE SWING: The Twins beat the Guardians last night at Target Field by a score of 3-1; now have won five of their last eight series openers...it marked their fifth win this season (5-27) when scoring three runs-or-fewer...Taj Bradley (8-3) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on three hits in 7.0 innings pitched, with no walks and 10 strikeouts...after 11 strikeouts in his last start at Houston, Taj became the first Twins pitcher since Joe Ryan (4/8 & 13, 2023) to record consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the offense recorded 10 hits...Kody Clemens went 2-for-4 with a triple and an RBI...Josh Bell reached three times, going 2-for-3 with a walk.

Taylor Rogers appeared in his 189th career game at Target Field, passing Caleb Thielbar for most appearances in the ballpark's history (since 2010).

WINNESOTA: Since June 14, the Twins have gone 13-7, posting a winning percentage of .650, the best in the AL since that date...below are overall MLB rankings since June 14:

GUARD PLAY: The Twins and Guardians are playing the fifth of 13 meetings today...Twins are 3-1 vs. the Guards this season, going 2-1 at Cleveland from May 8-10 and 1-0 in this series.

Since the start of 2024, 19 of the 30 games between these two have been decided by two runs-or-fewer (Twins 6-13 in those)...and 13 have been decided by one run (Twins 4-9).

Twins offense has recorded 38 hits over four games vs. the Guards this season, averaging 9.5 hits-per-game and posting a batting average of .268...last time they hit over .270 against Guardians pitching over the course of a season was in 2012 (.276).

Over his last five games vs. the Guards, Brooks Lee is hitting .333 (7-for-21) with one double, four RBI and an .810 OPS.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have placed right-handed pitcher Marco Raya on the 15-day Injured List (retroactive to July 5) with right shoulder impingement.

HEY JOHN SCHNEIDER! (COUGH, COUGH) LOOK OVER HERE!: Kody Clemens has 16 home runs, three shy of his single-season career-high of 19, set last season...he has homered in five of his last 10 games...he is one homer away from 50 for his career.

Since June 1, he has homered 10 times, tied with Nick Kurtz for second-most in the AL since that date, trailing Junior Caminerio (13).

He has homered in six of his last seven series, homering in Chicago (5/27), Pittsburgh (5/29), Detroit (6/9), Texas (6/16), Houston (7/1) and New York (7/3 & 7/4)...his only miss was the Arizona series (6/19-21).

Among AL players with at least 300 plate appearances, he ranks eighth in slugging percentage (.500)...also has an .808 OPS, making him one of 20 AL players with an OPS of over .800.

Kody ranks 18th in all of baseball (min. 1,000 pitches) in average exit velocity (92.7 mph)...first on the Twins.

Kody's current career-best five-game RBI streak is tied for the longest active run in MLB.

SUMMER MOUNDNESS: Over their last 18 games, since June 16, Twins starting pitchers have combined to go 7-6, 3.00 ERA (99.0 IP, 33 ER) with 33 walks, 106 strikeouts and eight quality starts...since that date, they rank fourth in the AL in ERA...they have not allowed more than four runs in any of those starts and have allowed two runs-or-fewer in 12 of those.

JOSHIN' AROUND: Since June 1, Josh Bell is hitting .303 (35-for-114) with eight doubles, one triple, eight home runs, 28 RBI, a .368 on-base percentage, a .605 slugging percentage and a .973 OPS in 32 games.

He is tied for fourth in the AL in RBI (60)...he is tied with Pete Alonso, Dillon Dingler and Ben Rice, and trailing Yordan Alvarez (67), Nick Kurtz (66) and Willson Contreras (61).

28 of those RBI have come in his last 28 games...he has at least one RBI in 18 of those 28.

Bell is three RBI from matching his 2025 total of 63, which he reached in 140 games.

Since May 31, as a left-handed hitter, he is slashing .329/.380/.659 (1.039 OPS)...he has homered from the left side of the plate three times in Minnesota's last seven games.

BEST OF: A win tonight and the Twins will earn their 15th series victory of the season...they have gone 14-14-1 in series play, 7-5-1 at home and 7-9-0 on the road.

Twins have won six of their last seven series, taking series from St. Louis (6/12-14), Texas (6/15-18), Arizona (6/19-21), Colorado (6/26-28), Houston (6/29-7/1) and New York-AL (7/3-5)...their only series loss in that span was a sweep by Los Angeles-NL (6/22-24).

Twins are seeking their fourth-straight series win, which would mark their longest since winning five-straight from May 2-18, 2025, which was part of their 13-game winning streak.

Twins are looking to win consecutive series' over Cleveland, which would mark the first time since August/September of 2021.

The Twins are seeking their first series win over the Guardians at Target Field since May 13-15, 2022, when they took two of three here.

PHONE, WALLET, KEAS: Luke Keaschall enters tonight with a five-game hitting streak...his season-long is seven (May 22-31) and his career-high is 11 (April 18-August 10, 2025)...over his last 18 games, Keaschall is hitting .315 (17-for-54) with two doubles, two home runs, 14 runs scored, eight walks, two stolen bases, a .431 on-base percentage and an .894 OPS.

LARNING CURVE: Over his last 17 games, since June 14, Trevor Larnach is hitting .403 (26-for-62) with six doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI, a .456 on-base percentage, a .645 slugging percentage and a 1.101 OPS.

Since the start of June, he is hitting .348 (3-for-89) with eight doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, 10 walks and a .959 OPS in 27 games...his batting average is the highest in baseball among players with at least 100 plate appearances since June 1.

Larnach is leading off tonight for the 15th time in the club's last 18 games...from the number one spot in the lineup, he is hitting .361 (26-for-72) with a .418 on-base percentage, a .569 slugging percentage and a .987 OPS...his batting average from the leadoff spot ranks second-highest in baseball (minimum of 80 PA), trailing only Pete Crow-Armstrong (.373).
