THIS IS MY CORN, YOU PEOPLE ARE GUESTS IN MY CORN: The Twins began their nine-game, 10-day homestand with a 2-1 series win over Baltimore this week...tonight, the Twins will continue the homestand with a trip to Dyersville, Iowa to play the Phillies in the MLB at Field of Dreams game...they will enjoy an off-day tomorrow, then complete the series with Philadelphia at Target Field on Saturday and Sunday...they will finish the homestand next week with three against the Braves, from Monday-Wednesday.

TWINS WIN - EASE HIS PAIN: The Twins beat the Orioles yesterday afternoon at Target Field by a score of 7-5...Zebby Matthews was the starter and winner, allowing four runs on six hits (1 HR) in 5.0 innings pitched, with two walks and four strikeouts...Andrew Morris (1.0), Jeff Hoffman (1.0), A.J. Minter (1.0) and Yoendrys Gómez (1.0) combined to pitch 4.0 innings of relief...the offense recorded 14 hits as five Twins had multi-hit games...Josh Bell went 3-for-5 with one RBI and Alan Roden reached four times, going 3-for-3 with a walk, two doubles and one RBI. **⚡** Twins have allowed first inning runs in nine of their last 12 games.

IT'S A PLACE DREAMS COME TRUE: Tonight, the Twins are hosting the Phillies in Dyersville, Iowa for the third MLB at Field of Dreams game — on Netflix...below are the previous results of the major league games played at this location:

ALSO......today marks Minnesota's first neutral site home game since hosting Cleveland at Hiram Bithorn Stadium in San Juan, Puerto Rico in April of 2018 (teams split 1-1).

ONE CONSTANT THROUGH ALL THE YEARS: Byron Buxton has been reinstated from the 10-day Injured List and added as the club's 27th man for tonight's game...the 2026 All-Star was placed on the Injured List on July 29 with right hip impingement and has hit .263 (87-for-331) with 16 doubles, one triple, 25 home runs, 45 RBI, 57 runs scored, seven stolen bases, a .320 on-base percentage, a .544 slugging percentage and an .864 OPS in 82 games this season. **⚡** When Buck was placed on the IL on July 29, he ranked fourth in the AL in home runs and ninth in all of baseball...his 25 home runs are now tied for eighth-most in the AL...his last home run was June 22 vs. Los Angeles-NL, a leadoff shot off Will Klein...his 14-game homer drought matches his longest of the season (also began season with 14)...it has been 59 plate appearances since his last homer.

GO THE DISTANCE: Since June 14, the Twins have gone 28-22, for a .560 winning percentage, fifth-highest in the AL since that date:

IT'S OKAY, HONEY, JUST TALKING TO THE CORNFIELD: The Twins are playing the Phillies for the 31st, 32nd and 33rd times in their history this series...Twins are 16-14 all-time against Philadelphia, going 2-1 at Veterans Stadium (2002), 1-2 at the Metrodome (2004), 7-5 at Target Field in (2012, '13, '16 & '24), and 6-6 at Citizens Bank Park (2010, '19, '23 & '25). **⚡** Minnesota last played Philadelphia for three games at Citizens Bank Park from September 26-28, 2025, as the Twins won just the middle of the three games. **⚡** In nine career games against the Phillies, Ryan Jeffers is hitting .323 (10-for-31) with three doubles, five walks, a .432 on-base percentage and an .852 OPS...Jeffers went 6-for-12 in the series at Philly last September, including two doubles, one walk and two RBI.

⚡ He has 72 RBI on the season, the seventh-most in the AL.
⚡ He is on pace to record 95 RBI, which would be the second-most of his career (116 - 2019)...the last Twin to drive in 90 in a season was Jorge Polanco with 98 in 2021.
⚡ Twins are 32-13 when Bell drives in at least one run and 14-4 when he drives in at least two.
⚡ Bell will celebrate his 34th birthday tomorrow.

WHAT ARE YOU WATCHING? THE BASEBALL MEN: Twins have gone just 13-23 against National League opponents this season...they have gone 4-8-0 in series play vs. the NL...they began the season 5-13, but have since gone 8-10 vs. the NL...counting Philadelphia, they have now faced 12 of 15 NL teams; they will play Atlanta next week, San Diego next weekend and San Francisco (September 21-23).

AS IF HE DIPPED HIMSELF IN MAGICAL WATERS: In 11 games this month, Royce Lewis is hitting .413 (19-for-46) with six doubles, two home runs, nine RBI, a .674 slugging percentage and a 1.111 OPS.
⚡ Lewis' OPS by month: March/April - .666 // May - .318 // June - .841 // July - .722 // August - 1.111
⚡ Among all AL players with a minimum of 40 plate appearances this month, Lewis ranks second in batting average (.413), and third in OPS (1.111) and in slugging percentage (.674).
⚡ Royce has now reached base safely in 22 of his last 23 games, since July 19.

HEY, DAD...WANT TO HAVE A CATCH? -KODY TO ROGER (PROBABLY AT SOME POINT): Kody Clemens has a single-season career-high 20 home runs...since being acquired by the Twins in late April of 2025 (from Philadelphia for cash), he has 39 home runs in 808 plate appearances...prior to joining Minnesota, he had 14 home runs in 402 plate appearances for Detroit (2022) and Philadelphia (2023-25). **⚡** Since June 1, he's homered 14 times, tied for eighth-most in the AL.
⚡ On the season, Clemens ranks in the 92nd percentile in baseball in average exit velocity (92.4 mph).

DON'T WE NEED A CATCHER? NOT IF YOU GET IT NEAR THE PLATE, WE DON'T: Over its last 19 games, the Twins bullpen has posted a 3.09 ERA (64.0 IP, 22 ER) with 36 walks, 71 strikeouts (10.0 K/9.0 IP) and a .230 opponent batting average.
⚡ Since the trade deadline on August 3, Twins relievers have struck out 36 of 124 batters faced (29.0%) in 29.0 innings pitched.

YOU DON'T KNOW THE FIRST THING ABOUT FARMING LARNACH: Over his last 42 games, since June 14, Trevor Larnach is hitting .297 (43-for-145) with nine doubles, seven home runs, 25 RBI, a .354 on-base percentage, a .503 slugging percentage and an .858 OPS.
⚡ Over his last 13 Interleague games, Larnach is hitting .310 (13-for-42) with five doubles, seven RBI, three walks and a .784 OPS.
