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THE TWINS: Have gone 3-4 through seven games on their nine-game, 10-day homestand, going 2-1 vs. Baltimore, 0-3 vs. Philadelphia and 1-0 vs. Atlanta...tonight, the Twins will continue the homestand with the second of three against the Braves...after tomorrow's series finale, the Twins will travel to San Diego to spend an off-day, then begin a six-game roadtrip with three against the Padres over the weekend...after San Diego, they will fly north to play the A's in Sacramento for three games, from next Monday-Wednesday.
⚡ Twins have gone 12-8 in their last 20 games at Target Field.
⚡ Twins have gone just 14-26 against National League opponents this season...they have gone 4-8-0 in series play vs. the NL...they have now faced 13 of 15 NL teams; they face San Diego next weekend and San Francisco (September 21-23).

CHOP SHOP: The Twins beat the Braves last night by a score of 4-2, snapping a three-game losing streak and earning their first win since Wednesday over Baltimore...Bailey Ober was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing two runs on six hits in 4.1 innings pitched...Travis Adams (3-0) earned the win in relief, pitching 2.0 perfect innings with three strikeouts...Yoendrys Gómez earned his 18th save with a scoreless ninth and is now 18-for-18 on the season (19-for-19 in his career)...the offense recorded all four runs in the first inning, highlighted by a Josh Bell RBI-double, a Royce Lewis RBI-single and a Kody Clemens RBI-single.

BIG BEATS HIT STREETS: The Twins and Braves are playing each other in the regular season for the 29th, 30th and 31st times in their history this week...the Twins are 9-20 all-time against the Braves in the regular season, going 7-11 in Minnesota (4-2 at the Metrodome, 3-9 at Target Field) and 2-9 in Georgia (2-3 at Turner Field and 0-6 at Truist Park).
⚡ Last night's win snapped a Twins 11-game losing streak to the Braves and marked their first win over Atlanta since August 5, 2019, when Miguel Sanó hit a pinch-hit, 443-foot, two-run, walk-off home run to centerfield against Chris Martin, giving the Twins a 5-3 victory.
⚡ Luke Keaschall has hit safely in all four career games vs. the Braves, hitting .353 (6-for-17) with three doubles, two RBI, one walk, one stolen base, a .529 slugging percentage and a .918 OPS.
⚡ In five career games against the Braves, Trevor Larnach is hitting .316 (6-for-19) with one double, one home run, four RBI and an .842 OPS.

IF YOU'RE NOT FIRST, YOU'RE LAST: Twins have scored four runs in the first inning in each of their last two games...they have scored 74 runs in the first inning this season, their second-most of any inning (82 in fourth innings)...74 runs is tied with Chicago-AL for fourth-most in baseball, trailing Washington (89), Detroit (82) and St. Louis (76)...they are 36-25 when scoring first in a game.

ANYTHING IS POSSI-BELL: Josh Bell went 2-for-3 last night, including his 250th career double in the first inning...in 14 games this month, he is hitting .352 (19-for-54) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, seven walks, a .426 on-base percentage, a .556 slugging percentage and a .982 OPS.

RISPY BUSINESS: Twins have gone 5-for-35 with runners in scoring position in their last four games...despite the last four, the Twins still rank second in baseball in batting average with RISP (.274), trailing only Tampa Bay (.279).

TWINS GO FOR THE MEATLOAF (2 OUT OF 3 AIN'T BAD): With a win tonight or tomorrow, the Twins will earn their 20th series victory...they have gone 19-19-2 in series play, 12-6-1 at home and 7-13-1 on the road.
⚡ Twins began the season going 8-13-1 in their first 22 series through June 11, but have gone 11-6-1 in their last 18 series overall, dating back to June 12-14 vs. St. Louis.
⚡ Twins are 6-1-0 in their last seven home series.
⚡ Twins are 2-5-3 in series play all-time against the Braves...their last series win over Atlanta came in a two-game sweep from August 16-17, 2016 at Turner Field...since then, Minnesota is 0-4-0 in series play vs. the Braves.

E-LUKE-TRIC CITY: Over his last 14 games, Luke Keaschall is hitting .327 (16-for-49) with a 1.016 OPS...below are Luke Keaschall's offensive comparisons through June and since July 1:

⚡ Among all MLB players with a minimum of 125 plate appearance since July 1, he ranks third in on-base percentage, and sixth in average and OPS.

HAWKINS LAB: The Twins bullpen pitched 4.2 scoreless innings last night with one hit allowed...over the last 23 games, the bullpen has posted a 3.10 ERA (81.1 IP, 28 ER) with 41 walks, 82 strikeouts (9.1 K/9.0 IP) and a .230 opponent batting average.
⚡ Since the August 3 trade deadline, the Twins' pen ERA of 3.11 ranks fourth-best in the AL and eighth-best in baseball.
⚡ Reliever ERA by month: 5.15 in March/April // 4.40 in May // 6.94 in June // 2.86 in July // 3.63 in August

LETTING LEWIS: In 15 games this month, Royce Lewis is hitting .367 (22-for-60) with seven doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI, a .583 slugging percentage and a .990 OPS.
⚡ Lewis' OPS by month: March/April - .666 // May - .318 // June - .841 // July - .722 // August - .990
⚡ Among all AL players with a minimum of 60 plate appearances this month, Lewis ranks fourth in batting average, and fifth in OPS and slugging percentage.

BALLPLAYER: Kody Clemens has four hits in his last eight at-bats, including one home run and two RBI...he has a single-season career-high 21 home runs...since being acquired by the Twins in late April of 2025 (from Philadelphia for cash), he has 40 home runs in 820 plate appearances...prior to joining Minnesota, he had 14 home runs in 402 plate appearances for Detroit (2022) and Philadelphia (2023-25).
⚡ Since June 1, he's homered 15 times, tied for seventh-most in the AL.
⚡ On the season, Clemens ranks in the 91st percentile in baseball in average exit velocity (92.3 mph).
⚡ Over his last nine home games, Clemens is hitting .314 (11-for-35) with one double, two triples, two home runs, eight RBI, a .629 slugging percentage and a .997 OPS.
