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NEWS TEAM, ASSEMBLE!!: The Twins completed their nine-game, 10-day homestand with a record of 5-4, going 2-1 vs. Baltimore, 0-3 vs. Philadelphia and 3-0 vs. Atlanta...tonight, they will begin a six-game roadtrip with the first of three against the Padres over the weekend... after Sunday afternoon's finale, they will fly north to play the A's in Sacramento for three games, from Monday-Wednesday.

I'M NOT EVEN MAD, THAT'S AMAZING: The Twins beat the Braves on Wednesday afternoon at Target Field by a score of 6-4, completing their fourth sweep of the season...Taj Bradley was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing one run on two hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Yoendrys Gómez earned his 20th save in his 20th chance this season, pitching a 1-2-3 ninth inning...the offense recorded 10 hits, walked four times and struck out just four times...Kaelen Culpepper recorded his first career three-hit game...Kody Clemens went 2-for-4 and drove in three of the club's six runs on the day.

DOESN'T IT MEAN SAINT DIEGO? NO... WELL, AGREE TO DISAGREE: The Twins are playing the Padres for the 33rd, 34th and 35th times in their history this weekend...Minnesota is 21-11 all-time against San Diego...the Twins are 11-5 all-time in Minnesota (10-3 at Target Field, 1-2 at Metrodome) and 10-6 all-time in San Diego (8-5 at Petco Park, 2-1 at Qualcomm Stadium).
These two last met for three games at Target Field from August 29-31, 2025 as the Twins won the book-end games.
Minnesota's last trip to San Diego came August 19-21, 2024 as they lost the first two games but won the finale.
Minnesota's .656 winning percentage vs. San Diego is their highest against any opponent.
Twins are 18-8 against the Padres in their last 26 games, dating back to June of 2008.
Trevor Larnach has nine hits in 16 career at-bats (.563) against the Padres, including one walk and four RBI...in his last three games vs. the Padres, he has four hits, three hits and two hits respectively.
In 42 career games vs. the Padres, Josh Bell is hitting .322 (49-for-152) with eight doubles, seven home runs, 20 RBI and a .904 OPS...he was traded from Washington to San Diego at the 2022 trade deadline along with Juan Soto and played 53 games for the Padres down the stretch.

THAT'S HOW I(L) ROLL!: Twins have gone just 16-26 against National League opponents this season...they have gone 5-9-0 in series play vs. the NL...they have faced 13 of 15 NL teams; after San Diego, they play San Francisco from September 21-23...Twins are seeking their first four-game winning streak against the NL since May 9-17, 2025 (5-straight).

YOUR HAIR LUKES STUPID...WHAT DID YOU SAY?! Over his last 17 games, Luke Keaschall is hitting .361 (22-for-61) with a 1.035 OPS...since being inserted into the leadoff spot on Monday, he has gone 6-for-14...below are Keaschall's offensive comparisons through June and since July 1:

Among all MLB players with a minimum of 150 plate appearances since July 1, he ranks third in on-base percentage, fourth in OPS and fifth in average.

SKY ROCKETS IN FLIGHT, AFTERNOON DELIGHT: Since June 1, the Twins have hit 50 home runs on the road, tied with Washington for fifth-most in baseball, trailing Detroit (54), Miami (54), New York-NL (54) and San Diego (53)...Twins road home run leaders since that date: Josh Bell - 9, Kody Clemens - 8, Trevor Larnach - 6, Royce Lewis - 6, Brooks Lee - 5.

I HAVE AN URGENT AND HORRIFYING NEWS STORY AND I NEED ALL OF YOU TO LISTEN! CAN-NON-BELL!!!!!!: Josh Bell went 1-for-3 with a walk on Wednesday, extending his on-base streak to a career-high 22 games...it marks the longest on-base streak for a Twin since Ryan Jeffers' 23-gamer from May 7-August 2...it's the second-longest active on-base streak in baseball, trailing Bryce Harper's current 23-game streak.
In 16 games this month, he is hitting .361 (22-for-61) with three doubles, four home runs, 14 RBI, eight walks, a .435 on-base percentage, a .607 slugging percentage and a 1.041 OPS...among all players in the AL with a minimum of 60 August plate appearances, he ranks fifth in OPS, batting average and on-base percentage, and sixth in slugging percentage.

DON'T ACT LIKE YOU'RE NOT IMPRESSED: Over the last 25 games, the bullpen has posted a 3.15 ERA (88.2 IP, 31 ER) with 42 walks, 92 strikeouts (9.3 K/9.0 IP) and a .229 opponent batting average.
Since the August 3 trade deadline, the Twins' pen ERA of 3.19 ranks third-best in the AL and sixth-best in baseball.

YOU PLAY JAZZ F-LEW-T? I DABBLE: In 17 games this month, Royce Lewis is hitting .338 (23-for-68) with seven doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI, a .529 slugging percentage and a .904 OPS.
Lewis' OPS by month: March/April - .666 // May - .318 // June - .841 // July - .722 // August - .904
Among all AL players with a minimum of 60 plate appearances this month, Lewis ranks eighth in batting average, ninth in OPS and 10th in slugging percentage.

I'M KIND OF A BIG DEAL, PEOPLE KNOW ME: Kody Clemens has seven hits in his last 15 at-bats (last 4 games), including one home run, one double and five RBI...he needs three hits to reach the 100-hit mark for the first time in his career.

DON'T KNOW IF YOU HEARD ME COUNTING, BUT I DID OVER 1,000: Byron Buxton has played in 986 games for his career, needing 14 to reach the 1,000-game mark...18 players in club history (since 1961) have reached 1,000 games, the last was Max Kepler on May 25, 2024.

I'M NOT A BABY, I AM A MAN! I AM AN ANCHORMAN!: Kaelen Culpepper recorded his first career three-hit game on Sunday and extended his hitting streak to seven games...he ranks tied for fifth among AL rookies (minimum of 30 PA) in batting average this month (.314).

HEY EVERYONE! COME AND SEE HOW GOOD I LOOK!: Triple-A St. Paul right-handed pitcher Eric Orze is celebrating his 29th birthday today...additionally, Twins player development assistant Ehire Adrianza is celebrating his 37th birthday.

I'M A MAN WHO DISCOVERED THE WHEEL, AND BUILT THE EIFFEL TOWER OUT OF METAL AND BRAUN: On this day in 2022, the Twins inducted Dan Gladden into the Twins Hall of Fame.
