THE TWINS: After completing their nine-game, 10-day homestand with a record of 5-4 (2-1 vs. Baltimore, 0-3 vs. Philadelphia and 3-0 vs. Atlanta), the Twins began their six-game roadtrip by getting swept in San Diego in three games over the weekend...tonight, Minnesota continues the trip with the first of three at Sacramento against the Athletics...they will play three night games and finish the series on Wednesday night.

MILK WAS A BAD CHOICE: The Twins lost to the Padres yesterday afternoon at Petco Park by a score of 8-1, suffering their sixth sweep of the season...Bailey Ober was the starter, allowing one run on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the pitching staff walked eight batters, one short of a season-high (9 on 5/9 at CLE)...the offense recorded six hits, two from Alan Roden... Brooks Lee provided the only score for Minnesota, hitting a solo home run in the fifth inning, his 20th of the season.

10K LAKES TO THE RIVER CITY: The Twins and A's are playing for the fourth of six times this season...these two teams met for three games at Target Field, from July 24-26 as the Twins lost game one, but won games two and three.

✦ Twins are 11-6 in their last 17 against the A's, 17-7 in their last 24 and 21-8 in their last 29, dating back to May of 2022.

✦ Ryan Jeffers has reached safely in 10-straight against the A's, hitting .333 (13-for-39) with one double, two home runs, seven RBI, five walks, a .422 on-base percentage and a .935 OPS in that span.

✦ Royce Lewis has posted a .904 OPS in 20 career games vs. the A's, including 20 hits, seven doubles, four home runs and eight walks.

✦ In 17 career games against the A's, Trevor Larnach is hitting .308 (20-for-65) with three doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, four walks and a .794 OPS...he has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 vs. the A's.

WHO'S DOWN WITH SACTOWN: The Twins first and only trip to Sacramento was a four-game series from June 2-5, 2025, winning the first three games, but dropping the series finale...in the first three games, the Twins outscored the A's 26-8, but lost the finale 3-14.

✦ Notable individuals in that series: Ryan Jeffers went 4-for-12 (.333) with one double, one home run, two RBI and two walks...Trevor Larnach went 5-for-17 (.294) with one home run, two RBI and one walk...Brooks Lee went 5-for-17 (.294) with one double and four RBI.

KEEP THEIR HEADS RINGIN': Josh Bell went 0-for-4 yesterday, snapping his on-base streak at a career-high 24 games...it marked his first game without reaching base since July 23 at Cleveland.

✦ In 19 games this month, Bell is hitting .306 (22-for-72) with three doubles, four home runs, 14 RBI, nine walks, a .390 on-base percentage, a .514 slugging percentage and a .904 OPS.

✦ For the season, Bell has 77 RBI, tied for seventh-most in the AL...he is on pace for 95 RBI, which would be the second-most of his career (116 in 2019) and most for a Twin since Jorge Polanco drove in 98 in 2021.

PHONE, WALLET, KEAS: Over his last 20 games, Luke Keaschall is hitting .356 (26-for-73) with a 1.024 OPS...since being inserted into the leadoff spot on August 17, he has gone 10-for-26 (.384)...below are Keaschall's offensive comparisons through June and since July 1:

SOUTHPAW STUFF: Twins are facing a left-handed starter for the eighth time in their last 23 games...tonight marks the 42nd lefty starter the Twins will be facing this season, going 19-22 in previous games...their last game vs. a lefty starter was August 17 vs. Atlanta, beating Martin Pérez.

✦ Ryan Jeffers is hitting .308 (24-for-78) with a .923 OPS vs. lefties this season...his batting average is tied for eighth-highest in the AL (min. 90 PA) and his OPS ranks 11th...since July 5, 2025, Jeffers is hitting .354 (46-for-130) with a .475 on-base percentage and a .975 OPS vs. left-handed pitching...since that date, he ranks first in the AL (min. 150 PA) in batting average and on-base percentage, and fourth in OPS.

✦ Since July 31, Royce Lewis is hitting .385 (10-for-26) vs. lefties, with two doubles and two home runs.

✦ Since August 6, Josh Bell is hitting .429 (9-for-21) vs. lefties with a 1.190 OPS.

✦ Since August 6, Luke Keaschall is hitting .478 (11-for-23) vs. lefties, with four doubles, a .538 on-base percentage and a 1.191 OPS.

HOTEL CA-LEE-FORNIA: San Luis Obispo, California native Brooks Lee hit his 20th home run yesterday, making him the sixth different switch hitter in Twins history to reach the 20-homer mark...he joins Jorge Polanco (22 - 2019 & 33 - '21), Chili Davis (29 - 1991), Roy Smalley (24 - 1979 & 20 - '86), Carlos Santana (23 - 2024) and Eduardo Escobar (21 - 2017)...additionally, with 20 doubles, he is one of two Twins with 20-plus doubles and 20-plus home runs, joining Kody Clemens (21 HR, 21 2B).

✦ Over his last 13 games, Lee is hitting .327 (16-for-49) with three doubles, four home runs, nine RBI, one walk, a .353 on-base percentage, a .633 slugging percentage and a .986 OPS...additionally, he has just eight strikeouts in 51 plate appearances in that span.

✦ This season, he has already set single-season career-highs in runs (57), doubles (20), triples (3), home runs (20), walks (33) and stolen bases (7)...he needs one more hit (114) to match his career-high (115 in 2025).

THIS AND THAT:

✦ Over their last six games, Twins starting pitchers have posted a 3.73 ERA (31.1 IP, 13 ER) with a .235 opponent batting average.

✦ On this day in 1981, in his first major league game, Kent Hrbek hit a 12th-inning home run, giving the Twins a 3-2 victory over the Yankees...Hrbek finished his career with 293 home runs, second most in Twins history trailing only Harmon Killebrew (475).

✦ Triple-A St. Paul outfielder Walker Jenkins homered twice yesterday afternoon at Columbus, his third-multi-homer game in his last 13 games...prior to this current stretch of games, he had never had multiple homers in his professional career...in 16 games this month, Jenkins is hitting .415 (27-for-65) with seven home runs, 12 RBI, an .800 slugging percentage and a 1.293 OPS.

FOLLOW THE LONG BALL: Zebby has allowed a home run in 13 of his 17 starts thus far this season... below is a breakdown of Zebby's stats this year in games he gives up at least one home run compared to when he does not allow a homer:

**Despite allowing one home run in each of his last three starts, is 3-0 with a 4.60 ERA (15.2 IP, 8 ER), five walks and 12 strikeouts; was 1-7 with a 6.83 ERA (54.0 IP, 41 ER), 18 walks and 57 strikeouts in his first 10 games this season in which he allowed a homer.*

◆ **LAST AND FIRST:** Zebby's 7.13 ERA on the road ranks last among Twins pitchers (min. 20.0 IP) and second-worst in MLB (min. 40.0 IP), behind only Toronto's Jameson Tallion (7.19 ERA)... has a 3.14 ERA at home (min. 20.0 IP) which ranks first among Twins pitchers.

⌘ Zebby has a combined .192 (28-for-146) BAA his breaking pitches (slider and curveball), with 49 strikeouts this season; his breaking run value of three ranks in the 75th percentile among all MLB pitchers...his .179 (7-for-39) BAA his curveball ranks third on the Twins (min. 25 PA).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP TAJ BRADLEY (2026: 9-5, 3.90 ERA // CAREER: 28-32, 4.60 ERA)

Right-hander Taj Bradley is scheduled to toe the rubber for the 26th time this season in the second game of a three-game set in Sacramento against the A's tomorrow night...in his most recent start on August 19 vs. Atlanta, Taj did not factor into the decision, tossing 5.0 innings and allowing one run on two hits, with three walks and seven strikeouts in the Twins 6-4 victory...snapped a three-game winless streak for the Twins in games that Bradley started dating back to August 2 at Seattle; team is 15-10 overall this year when Taj starts...tomorrow is slated to be Taj's third career start against the Athletics; is 0-1 with a 4.35 ERA (10.1 IP, 5 ER), six walks, 13 strikeouts, a .243 (9-for-37) BAA and a 1.45 WHIP in two prior starts...each of his starts against the Athletics have come on the road (June 15, 2023 and August 19, 2024 while a member of the Tampa Bay Rays).

MLB CAREER HIGHS

Win Streak: 3, 8/7/26 present

CAREER NOTES

- On May 14, 2026, tied his major league career high by pitching 7.0 scoreless innings and earning the win against the Miami Marlins in his first MLB start of the season; the 7.0 scoreless innings was the longest scoreless start in his major league career.
- In 2026, tossed a professional career-high 8.0 innings for Triple-A St. Paul on May 8 at Las Vegas, pitched the victory with a final line of 8.0 innings pitched with three runs allowed on 10 hits, with two walks and five strikeouts while throwing 95 pitches.
- Finished 2025 with MLB career-highs in starts (16), innings pitched (79.1), strikeouts (88), ERA (5.56) and WHIP (1.49).
- Ranked by *Baseball America* as fourth-best prospect in Twins system entering 2025...also ranked as having Best Fastball and Best Control...later ranked by same publication as 73rd-best prospect in baseball entering 2025.
- Won the Jim Rantz Award as Twins minor league Pitcher of the Year for 2024.
- Led all minor league pitchers in 2024 (minimum of 90.0 innings pitched) in strikeout-to-walk ratio (16.29), walks-per-9.0 innings (0.65) and WHIP (0.87) and ranked second in fielding independent pitching (2.31).
- Made major league debut on August 13, 2024 vs. Kansas City, allowing two runs on five hits in 5.0 innings pitched, with no walks and five strikeouts, while earning the victory...first career strikeout was by Bobby Witt Jr. in first inning...he and David Festa (first win - 6/27 at ARI) became the third pair of rookie starters in Twins history to win their debuts in the same season...the other two were Darrell Jackson and Roger Erickson in 1978, and Kyle Gibson and Andrew Albers in 2013.
- Named the No. 81 prospect in baseball in MLB.com's 2024 midseason Top 100.
- Named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week three times in 2024: April 14, April 28 and May 12.
- Made Triple-A debut at Toledo on July 21, 2024 and earned the win in St. Paul's 10-3 victory, allowing two runs on four hits in 5.0 innings, with no walks and six strikeouts.
- Allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in nine-straight starts (4 with Cedar Rapids, 5 with Wichita) to begin the 2024 season...went 4-1 with a 1.38 ERA (52.1 IP, 8 ER) in that span.
- Made Double-A debut vs. Arkansas on May 9, 2024 and didn't factor into the decision of Wichita's 6-2 win...allowed two unearned runs on three hits in 6.2 innings, with no walks and nine strikeouts.
- Entered 2024 as the Twins' No. 15 prospect per *Baseball America* and No. 24 per MLB.com.
- Made High-A debut on June 4, 2023 and made 14 appearances (13 starts) for Cedar Rapids, going 4-2 with a 4.59 ERA (66.2 IP, 34 ER), 10 walks and 59 strikeouts.
- Was selected by Minnesota in the eighth round (234th overall) of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Western Carolina University.
