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THE TWINS: Have gone 1-3 through four games on their six-game roadtrip, getting swept in three games at San Diego, followed by a win in Sacramento last night...tonight, Minnesota continues the trip with the second of three in Sacramento against the Athletics...they will complete the series and trip tomorrow night then fly home to enjoy an off-day, before hosting the White Sox and Tigers from August 28-September 2.

SACRAMENTO KINGS : The Twins beat the A's last night at Sutter Health Park by a score of 9-6, snapping their three-game losing streak...Zebby Matthews (8-8) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on six hits in a career-high-tying 7.0 innings pitched, with one walk and seven strikeouts...the offense recorded 16 hits, their third-most of the season (20 on 6/20 at ARI & 17 on 6/16 at TEX)...Kaelen Culpepper set a career-high with four hits, while Byron Buxton reached base four times, going 3-for-4 with a walk and a career-high-tying four runs scored...everyone in the lineup recorded at least one hit while striking out just five times on the night.

10K LAKES TO THE RIVER CITY: The Twins and A's are playing for the fifth of six times this season...one more win in these next two games and the Twins will secure the season-series over the A's for the first time since going 6-1 in 2024 (3-4 in 2025).

☞ Twins are 12-6 in their last 18 against the A's, 18-7 in their last 25 and 22-8 in their last 30, dating back to May of 2022.

☞ Ryan Jeffers has reached safely in 11-straight against the A's, hitting .326 (14-for-43) with one double, two home runs, seven RBI, seven walks, a .431 on-base percentage and a .920 OPS in that span.

☞ In five career games in Sacramento, Byron Buxton is hitting .333 (7-for-21) with two doubles, seven RBI and an .804 OPS.

E-LUKE-TRIC SPARK: Luke Keaschall has recorded multi-hit games in 10 of his last 21 games and in seven of his last 10...in those 21, he is hitting .354 (28-for-79) with a 1.024 OPS...since being inserted into the leadoff spot on August 17, he has gone 12-for-32 (.375), hitting safely in all seven games...below are Keaschall's offensive comparisons through June and since July 1:

THE BUCK STARTS HERE?: Byron Buxton tied his season-high by reaching base four times last night, going 3-for-4 with a double, a walk and career-high-tying four runs scored...he has reached base five times in his last nine plate appearances.

☞ Buck is seeking his first home run since June 22 vs. Los Angeles-NL, a leadoff shot off Will Klein...his 24-game homer drought marks his longest of the season...it has been 102 plate appearances since his last homer...this is Buck's longest homerless drought since going 26 games from July 22, 2023-April 21, 2024...longest in a single season since going homerless in all 28 games played in 2018.

☞ Despite the homer drought, since April 13, he ranks tied for sixth in the AL in homers (25)

LEFT TURNS: Twins are facing a left-handed starter for the ninth time in their last 24 games...tonight marks the 43rd lefty starter the Twins will be facing this season, going 20-22 in previous games.

☞ Ryan Jeffers is hitting .309 (25-for-81) with a .920 OPS vs. lefties this season...his batting average is seventh-highest in the AL (min. 100 PA) and his OPS ranks 11th...since July 5, 2025, Jeffers is hitting .353 (47-for-133) with a .476 on-base percentage and a .972 OPS vs. left-handed pitching...since that date, he ranks first in the AL (min. 150 PA) in batting average and on-base percentage, and fourth in OPS.

☞ Since July 31, Royce Lewis is hitting .357 (10-for-28) vs. lefties, with two doubles and two home runs.

☞ Since August 6, Luke Keaschall is hitting .444 (12-for-27) vs. lefties, with five doubles, a .500 on-base percentage and a 1.130 OPS.

SERIES CONVERSATIONS: With a win in the next two games, the Twins will earn their 21st series victory...they have gone 20-20-2 in series play, 13-7-1 at home and 7-13-1 on the road. ☞ Twins began the season going 8-13-1 in their first 22 series through June 11, but have gone 12-7-1 in their last 20 series overall, dating back to June 12-14 vs. St. Louis. ☞ Twins are seeking their first road series win since taking two of three at Yankee Stadium from July 3-5; they have gone 0-5-1 away from Minnesota since.

HOTEL CA-LEE-FORNIA: Over his last 14 games, Brooks Lee is hitting .315 (17-for-54) with three doubles, four home runs, nine RBI, one walk, a .339 on-base percentage, a .593 slugging percentage and a .932 OPS...additionally, he has just eight strikeouts in 56 plate appearances in that span.

☞ This season, he has already set single-season career-highs in runs (58), doubles (20), triples (3), home runs (20), walks (33) and stolen bases (7)...he needs one more hit (115) to pass his career-high (115 in 2025).

RED HOT PEPPERS: Over his last nine games, Kaelen Culpepper is hitting .424 (14-for-33) with one double, one home run, two RBI, one walk, a .441 on-base percentage and a .987 OPS...in that span he also has just five strikeouts in 34 plate appearances.

☞ Since his first game on August 7, he ranks third among all MLB rookies in batting average and fifth in on-base percentage.

FAMOUS DAVE: The Twins, in partnership with the Minnesota Twins Community Fund Board of Directors, today named longtime club executive Dave St. Peter winner of the 2025 Terry Ryan Award...St. Peter, a driving force in growing baseball and softball throughout the Upper Midwest for more than three decades, will be celebrated during a pregame ceremony ahead of the Twins' 1:10 pm game vs. the White Sox this Sunday at Target Field...key accomplishments in St. Peter's tenure include:

- ☞ The Fields for Kids grant program, which has built and renovated more than 900 baseball and softball fields across Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa and western Wisconsin... providing access to safe, quality playing surfaces.
- ☞ Expanding the Twins' free Youth Baseball and Softball Clinics to more than 60 annually throughout the region, teaching fundamentals while fostering mentorship between aspiring athletes and the community.
- ☞ Supporting leagues in need with Equipment and Uniform Assistance, ensuring that financial challenges don't keep kids off the field.
