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THE TWINS: Have gone 1-4 through five games on their six-game roadtrip, getting swept in three games at San Diego, followed by a split of the first two games in Sacramento...tonight, Minnesota completes the trip with the three-game series finale in Sacramento against the Athletics...after tonight's game, they will fly home to enjoy an off-day tomorrow...they will start a six-game homestand on Friday night with a three-game weekend series against the White Sox, followed by a three-game series vs. the Tigers, from Monday-Wednesday.
⌘ Twins have gone 13-9 in rubber games this season...they are 9-4 in their last 13 rubber game chances...they won their last rubber game chance on August 12 vs. Baltimore.

SACREMENT-NO!: The Twins lost to the A's last night in Sacramento by a score of 4-2...Taj Bradley (9-6) was the starter and was issued the loss, allowing four runs on seven hits in 6.2 innings pitched, with one walk and a career-high-tying 11 strikeouts...Bradley threw the first immaculate inning in Twins history in the fifth inning, fanning Carlos Cortes, Brian Serven and Henry Bolte...the offense recorded just four hits, two being doubles from Brooks Lee and Kaelen Culpepper.

THE REMAINS: The Twins have 29 games remaining, 15 of which are against AL Central opponents - six vs. the White Sox, six vs. the Tigers and three vs. the Guardians...besides the A's tonight, they also play the Angels (.391 win%), Giants (.409 win%) and Rangers (.496 win%)...the remaining opponents have a combined winning percentage of .477, the sixth-lowest strength of schedule in baseball.

TWINS AND A's: The Twins and A's are playing for the sixth and final time this season...a win tonight and the Twins will secure the season-series over the A's for the first time since going 6-1 in 2024 (3-4 in 2025).

⌘ These two will meet in 2027 for six games, three at Target Field from April 27-29 and three at the Athletics from May 17-19.

⌘ Twins are 12-7 in their last 19 against the A's, 18-8 in their last 26 and 22-9 in their last 31, dating back to May of 2022.

⌘ In 18 career games against the A's, Trevor Larnach is hitting .303 (20-for-66) with three doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, four walks and a .782 OPS.

⌘ Brooks Lee has hit safely in all six career games at Sutter Health Park.

PEPPER GAMES: Over his last 10 games, Kaelen Culpepper is hitting .405 (15-for-37) with two doubles, one home run, three RBI, one walk, a .421 on-base percentage and a .962 OPS...since his first game on August 7, he ranks fourth among all MLB rookies in batting average, and sixth in on-base percentage and OPS...Culpepper's 18 hits in his first 15 major league games are tied for sixth-most since 2010 for a Twins rookie:

⌘ Twins began the season going 8-13-1 in their first 22 series through June 11, but have gone 12-7-1 in their last 20 series overall, dating back to June 12-14 vs. St. Louis.

⌘ Twins are seeking their first road series win since taking two of three at Yankee Stadium from July 3-5; they have gone 0-5-1 away from Minnesota since.
