THE TWINS: Completed their six-game roadtrip with a record of 1-5, getting swept in three games at San Diego, followed by a 1-2 series loss in Sacramento to the A's...tonight, Minnesota begins a six-game homestand with the first of three against the White Sox through the weekend...after this series, the Twins will welcome the Tigers for three games from Monday-Wednesday.

WEST COAST, NOT BEST COAST: The Twins lost to the A's on Wednesday afternoon by a score of 7-4 in Sacramento...Connor Prielipp was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on six hits in 5.1 innings pitched, with one walk and five strikeouts...Andrew Morris was issued the loss, allowing three runs in the sixth inning, losing a 4-2 lead...the offense recorded eight hits, two from Trevor Larnach...Larnach (11), Brooks Lee (21) and Kaelen Culpepper (3) all homered.

THE REMAINS: The Twins have 28 games remaining, 15 against AL Central opponents — six vs. the White Sox, six vs. the Tigers and three vs. the Guardians...they also play the Angels (.396 win%), Giants (.410 win%) and Rangers (.493 win%)...the remaining opponents have a combined winning percentage of .480, the sixth-lowest strength of schedule in baseball.
✦ Twins have gone 19-18 against the AL Central this season, including a record of 11-6 at home.
✦ Kody Clemens has posted an .825 OPS vs. the AL Central this season and Royce Lewis has posted an .818 OPS.

SOX APPEAL: The Twins and White Sox are playing the eighth of 13 games this season...Twins are 3-4 vs. the Sox this season...these two last met for three games at Target Field from June 1-3, as the Twins won the first two and missed the sweep.
✦ Minnesota has gone 27-14 in its last 41 against the White Sox, dating back to May 4, 2023...that includes a home record of 14-6.
✦ Luke Keaschall is hitting .358 (19-for-53) with four doubles, eight walks, five stolen bases, a .444 on-base percentage and an .878 OPS in 15 career games against the Sox...he has reached base safely in all 15 games.
✦ Over his last 24 games vs. the Sox, Ryan Jeffers is hitting .363 (29-for-80) with 13 walks, a .453 on-base percentage, a .500 slugging percentage and a .953 OPS.
✦ In 13 career games vs. Chicago-AL, Royce Lewis is hitting .367 (18-for-49) with seven home runs, 21 RBI, an .816 slugging percentage and a 1.291 OPS.

BEWARE, WALKERS INSIDE: The Twins have selected the contract of outfielder Walker Jenkins from Triple-A St. Paul...Jenkins, who has been ranked as the club's top prospect for each of the last three seasons (2024-26), played in 69 games for Triple-A St. Paul this season, hitting .308 (81-for-263) with 17 doubles, three triples, 12 home runs, 28 RBI, 51 runs scored, 42 walks, 17 stolen bases, a .407 on-base percentage, a .532 slugging percentage and a .939 OPS...in 18 games this month, the 21-year-old has posted a slashline of .411/.488/.795 (1.283 OPS) with 30 hits and eight home runs, ranking second among all Triple-A players in batting average (.411), slugging percentage (.795) and OPS (1.283), fourth in total bases (58), tied for fourth in home runs (8), and fifth in on-base percentage (.488)...the 2026 Futures Game participant entered the season ranked as the fifth-best prospect in baseball by *Baseball America*, 14th-best by MLB.com and 19th-best by *Baseball Prospectus*...the 6-foot-3, 210-pound outfielder also entered the season tabbed as the best hitter and best athlete in Minnesota's organization by *Baseball America*...over parts of four seasons in the Twins minor league system, Jenkins has hit .303 (302-for-997) with 62 doubles, 13 triples, 33 home runs, 145 RBI, 179 runs scored and an .894 OPS in 265 games...he was selected by Minnesota with the fifth overall pick in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of South Brunswick High School in Southport, North Carolina.
✦ To make room for Jenkins on the 26-man roster, the Twins have optioned outfielder Alan Roden to St. Paul...in 28 games for the Twins this season, Roden hit .254 (17-for-67) with four doubles, 10 RBI and nine walks.
✦ To make room on the 40-man roster, the Twins have designated right-handed pitcher Woosuk Go for release or assignment...Go appeared in eight games for the Saints, going 2-1 with a 12.54 ERA (9.1 IP, 13 ER), 11 walks and nine strikeouts.

RED HOT KAELEN PEPPERS: Over his last 11 games, Kaelen Culpepper is hitting .400 (16-for-40) with two doubles, two home runs, four RBI, two walks, a .429 on-base percentage, a .600 slugging percentage and a 1.029 OPS...since his first game on August 7, he ranks second among all MLB rookies in batting average, slugging percentage and OPS, and third in on-base percentage...Culpepper's .907 OPS in his first 16 major league games is the seventh-highest since 2010 for a Twins rookie:

KEEP THEIR HEADS RINGIN': In 21 games this month, Bell is hitting .304 (24-for-79) with four doubles, four home runs, 17 RBI, nine walks, a .385 on-base percentage, a .506 slugging percentage and an .891 OPS.
✦ For the season, Bell has 80 RBI, tied for sixth-most in the AL...he is on pace for 96 RBI, which would be the second-most of his career (116 in 2019) and most for a Twin since Jorge Polanco drove in 98 in 2021.

TWINS ON A STICK: The Twins are currently at the 2026 Minnesota State Fair, with interactive games and special appearances all part of the team's daily lineup...The Minnesota Twins Experience is located on the south end of Cooper Street at Judson Avenue, next to the International Bazaar, and is open from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm daily, rain or shine, throughout the State Fair's duration (now through Monday, September 7).
✦ Earlier today first baseman/designated hitter Josh Bell and catcher Ryan Jeffers visited The Experience.
✦ National Baseball Hall of Famer Tony Oliva will be at the Experience on Monday, August 31 from 10:30 to 11:15 am.

FLORIDA MAN: Minor League Baseball yesterday announced 2026 rookie level league awards and All-Star teams...Florida Complex League Twins outfielder Yovanny Duran was named an outfielder on the FCL All-Star team after hitting .317 with four home runs, 29 RBI, 36 stolen bases, a .458 on-base percentage, a .485 slugging percentage and a .943 OPS.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2023 vs. Cleveland, Royce Lewis hit his third career grand slam and second in as many games, becoming the first player in Twins/Senators franchise history (since 1901) to hit grand slams in consecutive days...became the 10th player in baseball history with three grand slams as part of his first 10 career home runs, the others being Dom Dallessandro (1941-42), Russ Derry (1944-45), David Eckstein (2001-02), Brian Johnson (1994-96), Justin Maxwell (2007-12), Brian Roberts (2003-05), Shane Spencer (1998), Jim Tabor (1938-39) and Chris Taylor (2016-17).
