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THE TWINS: Have gone 1-2 through three games on their current six-game homestand, losing a series to Cleveland over the weekend, winning just the middle of the three games... tonight, the Twins will continue the homestand with the first of three vs. the Yankees...they will complete the series/homestand on Wednesday afternoon then begin their final roadtrip of 2026...they will play four in Anaheim from Thursday-Sunday and three in San Francisco from next Monday-Wednesday.

☞ The Twins are 7-5 in their last 12 games at home.

☞ Twins have 13 games remaining, seven road games (LAA & SF) and six home games (NYY & TEX).

SUNDAY NOT-SO-FUNDAY: The Twins lost to the Guardians yesterday afternoon at Target Field by a score of 9-2, losing the three-game series 2-1...Joe Ryan (6-10) was the starter and was issued the loss, allowing four runs on seven hits in 4.0 innings pitched, with one walk and just one strikeout...the offense recorded six hits, struck out 11 times and went 0-for-6 with runners in scoring position...Luke Keaschall and Trevor Larnach each had two hits as Larnach doubled (23) and homered (13).

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND SHIFT: The Twins and Yankees are playing for the fourth of six games in 2026...Minnesota last played the Yankees for three games from July 3-5, winning the three-game series – their first in the Bronx since 2014.

☞ Twins enter today with two-straight wins over the Yankees...their last three-game winning streak against New York was August 9, 2022-April 14, 2023 (also 3) - which spanned multiple seasons...their last three-game winning streak in a *single season* was in September of 1991.

☞ Luke Keaschall has hit safely in six-straight games vs. the Yankees, hitting .304 (7-for-23) with an .838 OPS.

☞ Notables last series vs. the Yankees: Josh Bell went 4-for-12 (.333) with one double, two homers, four RBI and two walks...Kody Clemens went 4-for-12 (.333) with one double, two home runs and five RBI...Trevor Larnach went 2-for-6 (.333) with one home run and three walks...Luke Keaschall went 4-for-10 (.400) with one double and one home run...Austin Martin went 2-for-3 with one double and two walks.

☞ Over the last three-game series, Twins batters combined to hit .278 (30-for-108) with nine doubles, seven home runs and a .905 OPS, while scoring 19 runs (6.3 R/G).

RUB SOME ROBITUSSIN ON IT: Luke Keaschall ranks fifth in baseball in hit-by-pitch, trailing Iván Herrera (29), Sam Antonacci (27), Randy Arozarena (23) and Willson Contreras (22)...he has been hit by 21 pitches this season, tied with Willi Castro for the club record...below are the all-time club leaders (since 1961):

HOUSE KEAS: Luke Keaschall has recorded multiple hits in 10 of his last 15 home games...over those 15, he has hit .390 (23-for-59) with six doubles, two home runs, four hit-by-pitch, three walks, a .455 on-base percentage, a .593 slugging percentage and a 1.048 OPS.

KODE RED HOT: Over his last 25 games, Kody Clemens is hitting .315 (28-for-89) with two doubles, one triple, six home runs, 20 RBI, a .562 slugging percentage and a .948 OPS.

☞ Clemens has 26 home runs this season, leading the team, ahead of Byron Buxton (25).

☞ Since June 16, Clemens has 51 RBI, third-most in the AL, trailing Junior Caminero (63) and Pete Alonso (52).

☞ Clemens leads the team in average exit velocity at 92.3 mph...among AL players (min. 2,000 pitches seen) that figure ranks fifth-best, trailing Yordan Alvarez (94.2 mph), Pete Alonso (93.9 mph), Munetaka Murakami (93.8 mph) and Junior Caminero (92.8 mph).

I AM THE ONE WHO 'NACHS: After going 2-for-3 with a double and a home run yesterday, Trevor Larnach is hitting .462 (6-for-13) with one double, two home runs, two RBI, two walks, a .533 on-base percentage, a 1.000 slugging percentage and a 1.533 OPS over his last five games. ☞ Over his last 15 games, he is slashing .326/.396/.628 (1.024 OPS) with four doubles and three home runs.

DON'T HASSLE THE HOFF: Jeff Hoffman enters tonight having thrown 6.0 scoreless innings since August 26...since being acquired by the Twins at the deadline, 12 of his 15 appearances have been scoreless, posting a 2.63 ERA (13.2 IP, 4 ER) with 21 strikeouts and a .184 opponent batting average.

☞ With 66 appearances this season (51 for Toronto & 15 for Minnesota), Hoffman has the third-most appearances of his career (71 for Toronto in 2025 & 68 for Philadelphia in 2024).

☞ His 96 strikeouts on the season are already a single-season career-high (previous high was 89 for Philadelphia in 2024).

ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD: Major League Baseball today announced that right-handed pitcher Pablo López has been named the Minnesota Twins' 2026 nominee for the Roberto Clemente Award presented by Capital One, baseball's most prestigious individual honor for major leaguers...this is López's third-consecutive nomination with the Twins and fourth of his nine-year career, as he was also the Miami Marlins' nominee in 2022...the Roberto Clemente Award presented by Capital One is the annual recognition of a major league player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field...as part of the annual program, each MLB Club nominates one player to be considered for the league-wide Award in tribute to Clemente's achievements and character.

☞ The leaguewide winner of the Roberto Clemente Award will be honored at the 2026 World Series presented by Capital One...four past Twins nominees have been named winner of the Roberto Clemente Award: Rod Carew (1977), Dave Winfield (1994), Kirby Puckett (1996) and Nelson Cruz (2021).

YO ADRIAN! Double-A Wichita right-handed pitcher Adrian Bohorquez has been named Texas League Pitcher of the Week...the 21-year-old made the start on Saturday vs. Frisco, pitching 5.0 shutout innings, with one hit allowed, one walk and four strikeouts...at three stops through the minor leagues this season, he has combined to go 2-1, 3.02 ERA (59.2 IP, 20 ER) with 32 walks, 69 strikeouts and a .182 opponent batting average in 19 games (18 starts)...the La Victoria, Venezuela native is currently ranked as the club's 18th-best prospect by MLB.com.
