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THE TWINS: Have gone 1-4 through five games on their current six-game homestand, going 1-2 vs. Cleveland over the weekend, followed by consecutive losses to New York-AL the last two nights...today, the Twins will complete the homestand with the three-game series finale against the Yankees...after today's game, they will travel to southern California to begin their final roadtrip of 2026...they will play four in Anaheim from Thursday-Sunday and three in San Francisco from Monday-Wednesday.
⌘ Twins have 11 games remaining, seven road games (LAA - 4 & SF - 3) and four home games (NYY - 1 & TEX - 3).

NEW YORK YUCK: The Twins lost to the Yankees last night at Target Field by a score of 8-1...Bailey Ober (7-6) was the starter and was issued the loss, allowing three runs on nine hits in 5.1 innings pitched, with two walks and three strikeouts...the offense recorded seven hits with zero walks, while going 1-for-6 with runners in scoring position...Luke Keaschall went 3-for-4 with three singles, while Emmanuel Rodriguez recorded his first career multi-hit game, going 2-for-3 with a double and an RBI.

TWINS-YANKEES: The Twins and Yankees are playing for the sixth and final time in 2026...Twins are 2-3 vs. New York in 2026, going 2-1 at Yankee Stadium from July 3-5 and 0-2 this week at home...a win today and the Twins will land in a tie for the season-series.
⌘ These two will meet in 2027 for six games, three at Target Field from June 21-23 and three at Yankee Stadium from August 3-5.
⌘ Luke Keaschall has reached base safely in eight-straight vs. the Yankees, posting a .345 on-base percentage in that span.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins have placed infielder Kaelen Culppepper on the 10-day Injured List with left hamstring strain...Culppepper was removed from last night's game against the Yankees in the top of the seventh inning with the injury...he hit .275 (30-for-109) with five doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, six walks, one stolen base, 15 runs scored and a .737 OPS in 31 games for the Twins, after making his major league debut on August 7.
⌘ To replace Culppepper on the 28-man roster, the Twins have recalled infielder Ben Ross from St. Paul...Ross was optioned to the Saints on Saturday and played in three games, going 2-for-9 with two walks and two runs scored...he made his major league debut for Minnesota on September 1 and went 0-for-4 with one run scored in three games prior to his option.

BLACK AND B-LUKE: Luke Keaschall ranks fifth in baseball in hit-by-pitch, trailing Iván Herrera (29), Sam Antonacci (27), Randy Arozarena (23) and Willson Contreras (22)...he has been hit by 21 pitches this season, tied with Willi Castro for the club record...below are the all-time club leaders (since 1961):

HOUSE KEAS: Over his last 20 home games, Luke Keaschall is hitting .389 (28-for-72) with six doubles, two home runs, six RBI, six HBP, nine walks, a .489 on-base percentage and a 1.044 OPS...since the All-Star break, Keaschall ranks third in the AL in home on-base percentage (.453), sixth in batting average (.349) and seventh in OPS (.941).

TRIPLE SHOTS: Last night, Kody Clemens took the AL-lead with his seventh triple...the last Twin to lead the AL in triples by the end of the season was Eddie Rosario with 15 in 2015...the club record is 20 by Cristian Guzman in 2000.
⌘ Over his last 27 games, Clemens is hitting .296 (29-for-98) with two doubles, two triples, six home runs, 20 RBI, a .364 on-base percentage, a .541 slugging percentage and a .904 OPS.

THE LEFTORIUM: Notable numbers vs. left-handed pitching:
⌘ Since July 31, Royce Lewis is hitting .319 (15-for-47) vs. lefties, with three doubles, two home runs and an .844 OPS.
⌘ Since August 6, Luke Keaschall is hitting .339 (19-for-56) vs. lefties, with five doubles, a .383 on-base percentage and an .812 OPS.

BREAKING BROOMS: Minnesota is looking to avoid being swept today for the seventh time in 2026, the others being April 17-19 vs. Cincinnati (3 games), April 24-26 at Tampa Bay (3 games), May 29-31 at Pittsburgh (3 games), June 22-24 vs. Los Angeles-NL (3 games), August 13-16 vs. Philadelphia (3 games) and August 21-23 at San Diego (3 games).
⌘ Last time the Twins were swept by the Yankees was in three games in the Bronx from June 4-6, 2024...last time they were swept at home by New York was in three games from May 14-16, 2024.
⌘ Last time the Twins were swept at Target Field was June 22-24 vs. the Dodgers - that excludes the three-game series vs. the Phillies, in which the opener was played in Dyersville, IA.
⌘ Twins have entered a finale 10 times this season attempting to avoid the sweep and have gone 4-6 in such instances...their four times avoiding the sweep were April 2 at Kansas City, May 17 vs. Milwaukee, August 6 at Kansas City and August 30 vs. Chicago-AL.

RING MY BELL: Josh Bell hit his 20th home run on Monday night, his sixth season with 20-plus...he now has a team-leading 87 RBI.
⌘ 87 RBI rank ninth-best in the AL...the last Twin to finish the regular season in the top 10 in the AL in RBI was Eddie Rosario, completing the 2020 pandemic season tied for sixth with 42 RBI...the last in a full 162-game season was Rosario (109) and Nelson Cruz (108), finishing sixth and seventh in 2019.
⌘ 87 are the fourth-most of Bell's career (116 in 2019, 90 in 2017 and 88 in 2021).
⌘ Bell is on pace to finish with 93 RBI, which would be the most for a Twin since Jorge Polanco drove in 98 in 2021.

DINAMITA! Emmanuel Rodriguez has hit safely in all four games played this season, going 5-for-15 (.333) with one double, one triple, one home run, four RBI and a 1.067 OPS.
⌘ Rodriguez is the first player in Twins history (since 1961) with a single, double, triple and a homer in his first four career games.
⌘ He's the ninth Twin with three extra-base hits in his first four games; the last was Josmil Pinto in 2013.

FALL GUYS: Major League Baseball yesterday announced the rosters for the 2026 Arizona Fall League (AFL) season...AFL Opening Day will be on Saturday, October 3, with the league's first game showcasing the Salt River Rafter at Glendale Desert Dogs at 12:30 pm Arizona local time...the Twins will represent the Salt River Rafter, along with prospects from the D-backs, Nationals, Rockies and Yankees...the eight Twins minor leaguers will be; right-handed pitcher Brian Zeldin; left-handed pitchers Ross Dunn, Cesar Lares, Cleiber Maldonado and Jake Murray; infielder Kyle DeBarge; and outfielders Jacob McCombs and Yasser Mercedes...additionally, FCL Twins rehab pitching coach Carter Kessinger will serve as the club's pitching coach.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1970, Bert Blyleven, a 19-year-old rookie, tied an American League record by striking out the first six batters and totaled 10 in 6.2 innings...in 1993, Dave Winfield became the 19th player to collect 3,000 hits as he singled to left off Dennis Eckersley at the Metrodome...in 1996, Paul Molitor recorded his 3,000th hit, tripling at Kauffman Stadium.
