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THE TWINS: Completed their six-game homestand with a record of 3-3, going 1-2 vs. Chicago-AL and 2-1 vs. Detroit...tonight, Minnesota will begin their penultimate roadtrip of 2026 with the first of three against the White Sox at Rate Field...after this series, they will travel to Detroit to play the Tigers for three games at Comerica Park, from Monday-Wednesday.
✦ The Twins have 22 games remaining, nine against AL Central opponents — three vs. the White Sox, three vs. the Tigers and three vs. the Guardians...they also play the Angels (.379 win%), Giants (.411 win%) and Rangers (.496 win%)...their remaining opponents have a combined winning percentage of .473, the fifth-lowest strength of schedule in baseball.

LATE NIGHT, TOUGH LOSS: The Twins lost to the Tigers on Wednesday night by a score of 11-6 in 12 innings at Target Field, coming back from two separate deficits...Detroit scored five runs in the top of the 12th inning as Tommy Nance was dealt the loss, allowing five runs (4 earned), highlighted by a Spencer Torkelson two-run homer...Dean Kremer was the starter, allowing four runs on six hits in 4.0 innings pitched, with two walks and five strikeouts...a season-high seven relievers were used...the offense recorded nine hits, went 4-for-21 with runners in scoring position and left 13 men on base...Brooks Lee had three of the Twins hits...the game was played in four hours and nine minutes, the longest game of the season for Minnesota.

CHICAGO STYLE: The Twins and White Sox are playing the 11th of 13 games this season...Twins are 4-6 vs. the Sox in 2026, going 3-3 at Target Field and 1-3 at Rate Field.
✦ Twins need to win each game this series to win the season-series vs. the White Sox.
✦ Minnesota has gone 28-16 in its last 44 against the White Sox, dating back to May 4, 2023...that includes a road record of 13-8 at Rate Field.
✦ Luke Keaschall is hitting .375 (24-for-64) with five doubles, nine walks, five stolen bases, a .461 on-base percentage and a .961 OPS in 18 career games against the Sox...he has reached base safely in all 18 games...he has hit safely in all six career games at Rate Field...he went 5-for-11 last series vs. the Sox.
✦ In his last 14 games vs. the White Sox, Trevor Larnach is hitting .313 (15-for-48) with five doubles, three RBI, five walks, six runs scored and a .794 OPS.
✦ In 16 career games vs. Chicago-AL, Royce Lewis is hitting .333 (20-for-60) with seven home runs, 21 RBI, a .700 slugging percentage and a 1.129 OPS...in seven career games at Rate Field, he is hitting .385 (10-for-26) with four home runs, 12 RBI, six walks, a .500 on-base percentage, an .846 slugging percentage and a 1.346 OPS...he has homered four times in seven games here, including two grand slams.
✦ Since the start of 2023, Ryan Jeffers is hitting .337 (34-for-101) with a .929 OPS in 31 games vs. the White Sox...he has reached safely in 12-straight in this ballpark.

HOTELS AND (NOT SO MANY) HANDSHAKES: Twins return to the road where they are 29-39, going 1-7 in their last eight and 3-11 in their last 14...they enter the weekend seeking their first road series win since July 3-5 at New York-AL (0-7-0 since).
✦ Since June 14, among AL players with a minimum of 100 road plate appearances, three Twins rank in the top five in OPS: 1) Pete Alonso - .954, 2) Trevor Larnach - .951, 3) Junior Caminero - .933, 4) Josh Bell - .923, 5) Luke Keaschall - .914

HEY EVERYONE! COME AND SEE HOW GOOD I LUKE! Luke Keaschall has 14 multi-hit games in his last 29 games overall (48%)...in that span, he is hitting .345 (38-for-110) with a 1.002 OPS...below are Keaschall's offensive comparisons through June and since July 1:

KEA CONTRIBUTIONS: Since being inserted into the leadoff spot on August 17, Keaschall has led off in all 15 Twins games and has hit .349 (22-for-63) with a .954 OPS, reaching safely in 14 of the 15...since August 17, he leads all leadoff hitters in batting average and hits.

CLEMENS TIME: Kody Clemens hit his 24th home run on Tuesday night...over his last 16 games, he is hitting .298 (17-for-57) with one double, one triple, four home runs, 14 RBI, a .561 slugging percentage and a .931 OPS.
✦ Clemens is now one home run away from tying Byron Buxton (25) for the club lead in homers.
✦ Since June 16, Clemens has 45 RBI, fourth-most in the AL since that date, trailing Junior Caminero (56), Jac Caglianone (49) and Pete Alonso (46).

CATCH 22: Over his last 22 games, Brooks Lee is hitting .303 (27-for-89) with four doubles, six home runs, 17 RBI, one walk, a .315 on-base percentage, a .551 slugging percentage and an .866 OPS...additionally, he has just 13 strikeouts in 92 plate appearances (14.1%) in that span.

JEFF YEAH: Ryan Jeffers recorded his 100th career double on Wednesday night vs. Detroit...over his last four games, he is hitting .375 (6-for-16) with two doubles, one triple, three home runs, eight RBI, two walks, a .444 on-base percentage, a 1.188 slugging percentage and a 1.632 OPS.

FOR THE COMMUNITY: The Twins yesterday announced the 2026 Harmon Killebrew Award winners for outstanding minor league community service...the Twins have annually recognized a player from each of the organization's full-season affiliates for their service within the respective affiliate's community; players are nominated by their respective general managers.
✦ **Triple-A St. Paul, Noah Cardenas** - his fourth honor and second consecutive...he personally organized an outing to Feed My Starving Children, entertained patients at Children's Minnesota Hospital's Star Studio, was a volunteer youth baseball instructor at Saints Baseball Camp and joined local children's book authors at the Saints' Reading Tree program.
✦ **Double-A Wichita, Andrew Cossetti** - spent the entire season committing himself to making a positive impact on and off the field...Cossetti also made connections with Wind Surge fans and McConnell Air Force Base near Wichita, being generous with his time with both groups.
✦ **High-A Cedar Rapids, Cole Peschl** - Throughout the season, he participated in several service projects including coaching at the Kernels Youth Baseball Camp at Veterans Memorial Stadium and volunteered at a local talented and gifted Classroom, where he read with the class and answered questions about what it was like to be a professional athlete...Peschl also visited local hospital to sign autographs and interact with patients and families.
✦ **Low-A Fort Myers, JP Smith** - he impressed Mighty Mussels staff by being a leader in the clubhouse while being generous with his time in his interactions with fans and the greater Southwest Florida community prior to his promotion to High-A.

ON THIS DAY... In 2010, Jim Thome hit his 583rd and 584th career home runs to pass Mark McGwire and take over ninth place on baseball's all-time list in a Twins 12-4 win over Texas...Thome currently ranks eighth on baseball's all-time list with 612 home runs...he hit 37 career homers as a Twin (2010-11) and 134 with the White Sox (2006-09)...in 2020, the Twins played a doubleheader at Target Field against Detroit, playing the road team in Game 2, winning 3-2...it marked the first ever scheduled away game for the Twins in Minnesota.

FOLLOW THE LONG BALL: Zebby has not allowed a home run in consecutive starts for the first time this season and only the second time in his career (also: May 18-24, 2025)...below is a breakdown of Zebby's stats this year in games he gives up at least one home run compared to when he does not allow a homer:

MONTH TO REMEMBER: Zebby collected a new single-month career high in wins with five in August (previous high: three in June 2026)...below is a breakdown of each of Matthews' months this season since his May 14 season debut:

**Became the first Twin since Joe Ryan (April 2023) to record five wins in a single month.*

◆ **ROAD NOTE:** Zebby's 6.38 ERA on the road this season ranks last among American League starting pitchers and third-worst in Major League Baseball (min. 55.0 IP).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP TAJ BRADLEY (2026: 10-6, 3.85 ERA // CAREER: 29-33, 4.57 ERA)

Right-hander Taj Bradley is scheduled to toe the rubber for the 28th time this season tomorrow evening in game two of a three-game set against the White Sox at Rate Field...in his most recent outing on August 31 vs. Detroit at Target Field, earned his 10th win of the season in a quality start, allowing one run on four hits (1 HR), with three walks and nine strikeouts in 7.0 innings in the Twins 11-1 series-opening win over the Tigers...entering tonight, Taj leads the Twins staff in wins (10), innings pitched (154.1), strikeouts (178), games started (27) and quality starts (12) this season...tomorrow will mark the fifth start of Bradley's career against the South Siders; is 0-2 with a 10.47 ERA (16.1 IP, 19 ER), 10 walks, 13 strikeouts, a .384 (28-for-73) BAA and a 2.33 WHIP...his career 10.47 ERA against Chicago is his highest against any opponent (min. four career starts)...this season, made one start on June 3, taking the loss after pitching 4.2 innings and allowing four runs on seven hits, with a career-high-tying five walks and five strikeouts in the Twins 8-0 defeat at Target Field.

MLB CAREER HIGHS

Loss-Streak: 5, 8/19/24-5/18/25

- On May 14, 2026, tied his major league career-high by pitching 7.0 scoreless innings and earning the win against the Miami Marlins in his first MLB start of the season; the 7.0 scoreless innings was the longest scoreless start in his major league career.
- In 2026, tossed a professional career-high 8.0 innings for Triple-A St. Paul on May 8 at Las Vegas; earned the victory with a final line of 8.0 innings pitched with three runs allowed on 10 hits, with two walks and five strikeouts while throwing 95 pitches.
- Finished 2025 with MLB career-highs in starts (16), innings pitched (79.1), strikeouts (88), ERA (5.56) and WHIP (1.49).
- Ranked by *Baseball America* as fourth-best prospect in Twins system entering 2025...also ranked as having Best Fastball and Best Control...later ranked by same publication as 73rd-best prospect in baseball entering 2025.
- Won the Jim Rantz Award as Twins minor league Pitcher of the Year for 2024.
- Led all minor league pitchers in 2024 (minimum of 90.0 innings pitched) in strikeout-to-walk ratio (16.29), walks-per-9.0 innings (0.65) and WHIP (0.87) and ranked second in fielding independent pitching (2.31).
- Made major league debut on August 13, 2024 vs. Kansas City, allowing two runs on five hits in 5.0 innings pitched, with no walks and five strikeouts, while earning the victory...first career strikeout was of Bobby Witt Jr. in first inning...he and David Festa (first win - 6/27 at ARI) became the third pair of rookie starters in Twins history to win their debuts in the same season...the other two were Darrell Jackson and Roger Erickson in 1978, and Kyle Gibson and Andrew Albers in 2013.
- Named the No. 81 prospect in baseball in MLB.com's 2024 midseason Top 100.
- Named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week three times in 2024: April 14, April 28 and May 12.
- Made Triple-A debut at Toledo on July 21, 2024 and earned the win in St. Paul's 10-3 victory, allowing two runs on four hits in 5.0 innings, with no walks and six strikeouts.
- Allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in nine-straight starts (4 with Cedar Rapids, 5 with Wichita) to begin the 2024 season...went 4-1 with a 1.38 ERA (52.1 IP, 8 ER) in that span.
- Made Double-A debut vs. Arkansas on May 9, 2024 and didn't factor into the decision of Wichita's 6-2 win...allowed two unearned runs on three hits in 6.2 innings, with no walks and nine strikeouts.
- Entered 2024 as the Twins' No. 15 prospect per *Baseball America* and No. 24 per MLB.com.
- Made High-A debut on June 4, 2023 and made 14 appearances (13 starts) for Cedar Rapids, going 4-2 with a 4.59 ERA (66.2 IP, 34 ER), 10 walks and 59 strikeouts.
- Was selected by Minnesota in the eighth round (234th overall) of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Western Carolina University.
