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THE TWINS: Have gone 2-3 through five games on their six-game roadtrip, losing a series 1-2 in Chicago against the White Sox over the weekend, followed by a split of the first two games in Detroit...today, Minnesota will complete the trip with the three-game series finale against the Tigers at Comerica Park...after today's game, they will fly back to Minneapolis to enjoy an off-day on Thursday...starting on Friday, they will begin a six-game homestand with three against the Guardians over the weekend, followed by three games against the Yankees from Monday-Wednesday.

- Twins have gone 13-11 in rubber games this season...their last rubber game was a loss on Sunday afternoon at Chicago-AL and their last win was on August 12 vs. Baltimore.
- Twins have 17 games remaining, eight road games and nine home games.
- Minnesota's remaining opponents have a combined winning percentage of .467, the fourth-lowest strength of schedule in baseball.

CLEMENS, ALWAYS IN THE MIDDLE OF EVERYTHING: The Twins beat the Tigers last night at Comerica Park by a score of 3-2, their first one-run win since August 6 at Kansas City (4-3)...Dean Kremer (3-5) was the starter and winner, allowing two runs on five hits in 5.0 innings pitched, with one walk and three strikeouts...A.J. Minter (1.1 IP), Andrew Morris (0.2 IP), Jeff Hoffman (1.0 IP) and Yoendrys Gómez (1.0 IP) combined to pitch 4.0 hitless innings of relief...the offense recorded five hits, two from Ryan Jeffers...Kody Clemens hit a two-run go-ahead homer in the sixth inning, tying Byron Buxton for the team lead in homers at 25.

MOTOWN THROWDOWN: The Twins and Tigers are playing for the 13th and final time today...Twins are 8-4 vs. the Tigers this season, going 6-1 at Target Field and 2-3 at Comerica Park.

- These two will meet next for three games at Target Field, from April 16-18, 2027...next time Minnesota will visit Comerica Park will be for three games, from May 31-June 2.
- Twins lead baseball in home runs vs. Detroit since the start of 2019, hitting 167, 40 ahead of Cleveland (127)...78 of those have come at Comerica Park...they have homered 38 times in their last 25 games at Comerica and 16 times in their last eight here.
- Luke Keaschall is hitting .367 (22-for-60) with five doubles, two home runs, 14 RBI, 10 walks, a .486 on-base percentage and a 1.036 OPS in 17 career games vs. Detroit...in six career games at Comerica, Keaschall has posted a .577 on-base percentage (9 hits, 4 walks in 26 plate appearances).
- In 32 career games vs. Detroit, Royce Lewis is hitting .278 (30-for-108) with five doubles, five home runs, 20 RBI, 20 walks, a .388 on-base percentage, a .463 slugging percentage and an .851 OPS...lifetime at Comerica, he has an .814 OPS in 14 games.
- Notables this season vs. Detroit: Josh Bell is 14-for-46 (.304) with one double, two home runs, six RBI and five walks...Royce Lewis is 13-for-45 (.289) with two doubles, two home runs, nine RBI and seven walks...Luke Keaschall is 13-for-37 (.351) with three doubles, one home run, seven RBI and seven walks.
- Kody Clemens has 14 career hits vs. the Tigers, four being doubles and four being home runs...additionally, he has nine RBI in 19 games vs. Detroit.

KEA CONTRIBUTOR: Luke Keaschall has 15 multi-hit games in his last 34 games overall (44%) since July 31...in that span, he is hitting .328 (42-for-128) with a .951 OPS...below are Keaschall's offensive comparisons through June and since July 1:

BLACK AND B-LUKE: Luke Keaschall was hit by a pitch again on Monday in the first inning, his 20th hit-by-pitch this season, one short of the single-season club record of 21, set by Willi Castro in 2024...he ranks fifth in baseball in hit-by-pitches this season...below are the all-time club leaders (since 1961):

ADDITIONALLY... Keaschall ranks fifth in baseball in HBP, trailing Iván Herrera (27), Sam Antonacci (25), Randy Arozarena (22) and Willson Contreras (22).

FOLLOW THE LEE-DER: Over his last 27 games, Brooks Lee is hitting .296 (32-for-108) with six doubles, seven home runs, 19 RBI, two walks, a .313 on-base percentage, a .546 slugging percentage and an .859 OPS...additionally, he has just 15 strikeouts in 108 plate appearances (13.4%) in that span.

- Lee hit his 23rd home run on Sunday night and ranks third on the Twins, trailing Byron Buxton (25) and Kody Clemens (25)...his 23 HR are also tied with Ian Happ for second-most by a switch hitter in all of baseball, trailing Ely De La Cruz (25).
- Lee's 23 homers are tied with Carlos Santana (2024) for fourth-most by a switch hitter in Twins history (since 1961), trailing Jorge Polanco (33 in 2021), Chili Davis (29 in 1991) and Roy Smalley (24 in 1979).
- Lee has 20 homers as a left-handed batter and three as a right-handed batter.

TWINS GO FOR THE MEATLOAF: Twins need a win today to earn their 22nd series victory of 2026...they have gone 21-23-2 in series play, 14-8-1 at home and 7-15-1 on the road.

- Twins are 2-1-0 in series play vs. the Tigers this season.
- Twins began the season going 8-13-1 in their first 22 series through June 11, but have gone 13-10-1 in their last 24 series overall, dating back to June 12-14 vs. St. Louis.
- Minnesota's last road series win was July 3-5 at New York-AL.

WHEN LIFE GIVES YOU CLEMENS: Over his last 21 games, Kody Clemens is hitting .297 (22-for-74) with one double, one triple, five home runs, 17 RBI, a .541 slugging percentage and a .917 OPS.

- Last night, Clemens tied Byron Buxton for team-lead in home runs, hitting his 25th of the season...after Clemens and Buxton is Brooks Lee, with 23 homers.
- Since being acquired by the Twins in late April of 2025, he has 44 home runs in 240 games.
- Since June 16, Clemens has 48 RBI, fourth-most in the AL, trailing Junior Caminero (61), Jac Caglianone (50) and Pete Alonso (49).
- Clemens leads the team in average exit velocity at 92.4 mph...among AL players (min. 2,000 pitches seen) that figure ranks fifth-best, trailing Yordan Alvarez (94.3 mph), Pete Alonso (94.1 mph), Munetaka Murakami (93.9 mph) and Junior Caminero (92.9 mph).

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1976, Rod Carew hit a pinch-hit grand slam in the seventh for the Twins as Minnesota beat Texas, 6-0...it marked Carew's third grand slam of that year...it was the ninth pinch-hit grand slam in Twins history and one of 15 to date...the last to do it was Matt LeCroy on May 19, 2004 at Toronto.
